## PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1925.

## PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) AMENDMENT REGULATIONS, 1933.

The Minister of Health gives notice, in pursuance of the above-named Regulations, that he hereby recognises each of the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedules hereto, as evidence that the meat to which it relates has been derived from an animal which was free from disease at the time of slaughter and has been dressed or prepared and packed with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health.

Where the Certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the package containing the meat and if the label has not in any other circumstances, or on any other occasion, been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Certificate is in the form of a stamp the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat.

The label or stamp hereby recognised as an Official Certificate for meat imported from Brazil is in substitution for the labels of which particulars were given in the Second Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of the 12th February, 1929, and in Part IV of the First Schedule to the Notice published in the London Gazette of the 14th July, 1933.
