A PROCLAMATION

FOR APPOINTING WEDNESDAY, MAY 12TH, A BANK HOLIDAY AND A PUBLIC HOLIDAY THROUGHOUT THE UNITED KINGDOM.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas We consider it desirable that Wednesday, the twelfth day of May next, being the occasion of the Solemnity of Our Royal Coronation, should be observed as a holiday throughout the United Kingdom:

We do hereby appoint the said twelfth day of May to be observed as a Public Holiday throughout the United Kingdom and by this Our Royal Proclamation command the said day to be so observed and all Our loving Subjects to order themselves accordingly.

And We do further hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, the Holidays Extension Act, 1875, the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, and the Revenue Offices (Scotland) Holidays Act, 1880, appoint the said twelfth day of May to be observed throughout the United Kingdom as a Bank Holiday and as a Public Holiday under and in accordance with the said Acts.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this second day of February, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and in the first year of Our Reign.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Section 3 of the Officers of Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that Officers of the Reserve shall be entitled to receive such pay and allowances as we, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, may from time to time appoint:

“And whereas by the Naval Forces Act, 1903, it is enacted that the Admiralty shall have power to raise and maintain a Force to be called the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve and that any Volunteer enrolling under this Act, when serving for training afloat or called out for actual service shall be deemed to be serving in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force within the meaning of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 21st day of February, 1935, revised conditions of service and rates of pay were instituted for Church of England Chaplains of Your Majesty's Navy, the rates of pay being subsequently modified in conjunction with those for all other Officers by Orders in Council bearing dates the 9th day of November, 1934, and the 4th day of May, 1935:

"And whereas we consider that Chaplains of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve should, when serving for training or called out for actual service, receive pay at the rates laid down for Church of England Chaplains of Your Majesty's Navy:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction rates of pay for Chaplains of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve as set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto:

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

" *Discharge.*—To be discharged at 45 years of age unless previously promoted.

" *Promotion.*—After two years in the rank to be eligible for promotion to ' Staff Sergeant Major ' without further examination. To be eligible to take the examination for commissioned rank. Seniority as Warrant Officer for promotion to Commissioned rank to be the date of promotion to Sergeant Major. Service as Sergeant Major to reckon as Warrant Officer service for the purpose of assessing retired pay after promotion to Staff Sergeant Major.

" *Pensionable Benefits.*—Sergeant Majors, R.M., discharged as such, to be eligible for a rank addition to pension at the rate of 2½d. a day for each completed year of qualifying service in the rank, a fraction of a year being reduced, for the purposes of calculation of rank additions, to the equivalent value of service in the next lower rank. Otherwise, Sergeant Majors, R.M., to be eligible for pensions, gratuities or other grants under the rules prescribed for non-commissioned officers and men, R.M.

" *Pensions and allowances to widows, children and other dependants.*—At rates and under the general conditions applicable to Warrant Officers, Class I, in the Army.

" *Special Awards, Decorations, etc.*—To be eligible for the Naval good conduct medal, gratuity and additional allowance, and for Naval awards generally as prescribed for non-commissioned officers and men, R.M., and to

be regarded as eligible (by rank) for any special awards, decorations, etc., which may be conferred by the Military authorities or under Army rules on Warrant Officers, Class I, in the Army."

(b) In the earthen graves now existing in the said Churchyard, in which the remains of Lilius Lee Baker and Jeannie Doris Lavender Baker are interred, the burial may be allowed at their decease of the bodies of Mary Rosalind Pye and Natalie Violet Mary Wakelin, subject to the condition that no part of the coffins containing the bodies shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 17th day of March next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 17th day of March.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF SHORTHAND-TYPIST AND CLERK-SHORTHAND-TYPIST (FEMALE) IN DEPARTMENTS OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. No person will be eligible for admission to the examination unless she

either (a) has rendered at least three months' approved service as an Established Typist or Established Clerk-Typist in a British Government Department immediately prior to the first day of the examination.

or (b) commenced to serve as a Temporary Shorthand-Typist or Temporary Clerk-Shorthand-Typist in a British Government Department on or before 1st July, 1936, has continued to serve in a British Government Department up to the first day of the examination, and has rendered, prior to the first day of the examination and within three years of that day, a total of at least one full year's approved service, temporary or established and temporary combined, in a British Government Department in one or more of the following posts, viz. :—Temporary Shorthand-Typist; Temporary Clerk-Shorthand-Typist; Established Typist; Established Clerk-Typist.

Candidates appointed by the Civil Service Commissioners as Typists in the Trinity House, the Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, and the Metropolitan Police Office, on the result of a general competition for situations as Typist in the Civil Service, will be regarded as Established Typists for the purpose of this Clause although not serving under the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

2. There will be no age limits in the case of candidates who are serving on the first day of the examination as Established Typists or Established Clerk-Typists; but candidates who have only temporary service or service in the Trinity House, Office of the Crown Agents for the Colonies, or the Metropolitan Police Office, or service of two or more of these kinds, must not have attained the age of 40 on the first day of the examination.

3. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) that they are unmarried or widows;
- (b) that they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

4. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of a person serving in a civil situation to which she was admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

5. The subjects of examination are the following :—

- (1) Shorthand.
- (2) English.

Candidates must pass to the satisfaction of the Civil Service Commissioners in Shorthand and in the aggregate of the two subjects.

6. It will rest with the Civil Service Commissioners to determine the Departments to which the successful candidates shall be assigned. In making the assignments the Commissioners will be guided by the requirements of the public service and will consult, as far as possible, the wishes of Departments for the assignment of particular candidates who have served under them. Subject to these conditions, the wishes of candidates will, where possible, be respected.

7. Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

8. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. A fee of 12s. 6d. will be required from every candidate applying for admission to attend an examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that a Competitive Examination will be held under the foregoing Regulations in Belfast, Birmingham, Bristol, Cardiff, Edinburgh, Glasgow, Leeds, Liverpool, London, Manchester, Newcastle-on-Tyne, Plymouth and Portsmouth, commencing on the 19th May, 1937.

(2) To empower the Council to charge for water for domestic purposes in the said parishes at a rate not exceeding fifteen pounds per centum per annum on the rateable value of the dwelling-house or part of a dwelling-house supplied;

(3) To authorise the Council to construct and maintain the following additional waterworks, namely:—

Work No. 1.—A well or wells and pumping station in the Parish of Bagendon in the enclosure numbered 188 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map of the said Parish (Edition 1921 Gloucestershire Sheet No. Ll.2).

Work No. 2.—A service reservoir in the Parish of Baunton in the enclosure numbered 11 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map of the Parish of Stratton (Edition 1921 Gloucestershire Sheet No. Ll.2).

Work No. 3.—A waste water conduit in the Parishes of Baunton and Daglingworth commencing in the said Work No. 2 and terminating in the enclosure numbered 12 on

the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map of the Parish of Daglingworth (Edition 1921 Gloucestershire Sheet No. Ll.2).

Work No. 4.—An aqueduct comprising a line or lines of pipes commencing in the said Parish of Bagendon in the said Work No. 1 and terminating in the said Parish of Baunton in the said Work No. 2.

Work No. 5.—An aqueduct comprising a line or lines of pipes commencing in the said Parish of Baunton in the said Work No. 2 and terminating in the Parish of Kemble in the Malmesbury Road at the Gloucester County boundary.

Work No. 6.—An aqueduct comprising a line or lines of pipes commencing by a junction with the said Work No. 5 at the junction of London Road and Victoria Road in the Urban District of Cirencester and terminating in Ermin Street in the Parish of South Cerney in the Rural District of Cirencester adjacent to the northerly corner of the enclosure numbered 638 on the $\frac{1}{2500}$ Ordnance Map of the said Parish (Edition 1921 Gloucestershire Sheet No. Ll. 16).

(4) To authorise the Council to discharge water from their waterworks during the construction repair or cleansing thereof into streams ditches and watercourses;

(5) To empower the Council with the consent of the Minister of Health to acquire by agreement such additional lands as may from time to time be required for the purposes of their water undertaking;

(6) To amend the existing powers of the Council with regard to the supply of water by measure and to provide that the price to be charged for water so supplied shall not exceed three shillings per thousand gallons;

(7) To confer further powers on the Council in regard to their water undertaking and in particular:—

(i) To empower the Council to provide dwelling houses for persons employed by them for the purposes of the undertaking;

(ii) To make special provision with regard to supplies of water

(a) to caravans shacks huts tents or other like structures,

(b) for refrigerating apparatus or any apparatus requiring continuously running water, and

(c) for stables garages or other premises where horses carriages or motor cars are kept;

(iii) To provide that the Council shall not be required to supply with water otherwise than by measure

(a) any building used by an occupier as a dwelling-house whereof a part is used by the same occupier for any trade or manufacturing purpose for which water is required; or

(b) any mental or other hospital (whether public or private) or any nursing home sanatorium school club hotel restaurant public-house or inn; or

(c) any boarding-house or lodging-house capable of accommodating twelve or more persons including the persons usually resident therein; or

(d) any public institution which is habitually occupied by at least twenty persons including the persons usually resident therein;

(iv) To enable the Council to require where a supply of water to a farm house is used for farming purposes that such supply shall be taken by measure;

(v) To empower the Council to require that water used for a swimming bath or bathing pool shall be taken by measure;

(vi) To empower the Council in certain cases to make a minimum charge for supplies of water afforded by them;

(vii) To empower the Council to require the payment of water rates by the owners in the case of certain small houses;

(viii) To vary the existing statutory requirements regarding the giving of guarantees by persons desiring to be furnished with a supply of water by the Council;

(ix) To enable the Council to supply water in certain cases to premises outside the limits of supply;

(x) To enable the Council to exercise certain powers with respect to streets and roads forming the boundary of the limits of supply;

(xi) To extend the powers of the Council to make byelaws for preventing waste of water;

(xii) To provide that fittings let for hire shall not be subject to distress;

(xiii) To empower the Council to require stop-cocks to be fitted in communication pipes laid in connection with new buildings;

(xiv) To empower the Council to require separate communication pipes;

(xv) To make provision as to the connection and repair of communication pipes, as to the maintenance of common pipes and as to the breaking up of streets in connection with the maintenance of any pipes or apparatus;

(xvi) To prescribe penalties for interfering with valves and other apparatus;

(xvii) To make provision as to the period of error in defective meters;

(xviii) To enlarge the powers of the Council in regard to the inspection of premises for the purpose of ascertaining where there is any waste or misuse of water;

(xix) To empower local authorities to give guarantees to the Council for payments in respect of the laying down of pipes or works for the supply of water by the Council;

(xx) To provide for the recovery of water rates from persons removing;

(8) To make further provision in regard to the finances of the Council's water undertaking including

(i) provision that the revenues of the said undertaking shall be paid into and the expenses out of the general rate-fund;

(ii) provision for the keeping of separate accounts; and

(iii) provision as to the application of revenue and the maintenance of a reserve fund;

(9) To provide for the authentication and service of notices and demands and for the recovery of demands and penalties;

(10) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any

MILK ACTS, 1934 AND 1936.

Certification of Cheese-Milk Price.

Whereas by Sub-section (1) of Section 4 of the Milk Act, 1934 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is provided that for the purposes of the Act the cheese-milk price for any month shall be the excess over one penny three farthings of the average of the prices per pound at which cheese such as is commonly known at the commencement of the Act as "New Zealand Finest White" and "Canadian Finest White" was sold wholesale in Great Britain during the immediately preceding month;

And whereas by Sub-section (2) of the said Section as amended by Section 5 and Part II of the Schedule of the Milk (Extension of Temporary Provisions) Act, 1936, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September, 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before October, 1939, the cheese-milk price for that month;

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of February, 1937, is 5.01 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The range of price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese, as published by the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month, has been examined.

(ii) The average of the mean prices for the two kinds of cheese has been ascertained for each of the said periods, exceptional quotations being disregarded. The average of the periodic averages so ascertained has then been calculated to two places of decimals and expressed in pence per pound.

(iii) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
