*Work No. 4.*—An aqueduct comprising a line or lines of pipes commencing in the said Parish of Bagendon in the said Work No. 1 and terminating in the said Parish of Baunton in the said Work No. 2.

*Work No. 5.*—An aqueduct comprising a line or lines of pipes commencing in the said Parish of Baunton in the said Work No. 2 and terminating in the Parish of Kemble in the Malmesbury Road at the Gloucester County boundary.

*Work No. 6.*—An aqueduct comprising a line or lines of pipes commencing by a junction with the said Work No. 5 at the junction of London Road and Victoria Road in the Urban District of Cirencester and terminating in Ermin Street in the Parish of South Cerney in the Rural District of Cirencester adjacent to the northerly corner of the enclosure numbered 638 on the  $\frac{1}{2500}$  Ordnance Map of the said Parish (Edition 1921 Gloucestershire Sheet No. Ll. 16).

(4) To authorise the Council to discharge water from their waterworks during the construction repair or cleansing thereof into streams ditches and watercourses;

(5) To empower the Council with the consent of the Minister of Health to acquire by agreement such additional lands as may from time to time be required for the purposes of their water undertaking;

(6) To amend the existing powers of the Council with regard to the supply of water by measure and to provide that the price to be charged for water so supplied shall not exceed three shillings per thousand gallons;

(7) To confer further powers on the Council in regard to their water undertaking and in particular:—

(i) To empower the Council to provide dwelling houses for persons employed by them for the purposes of the undertaking;

(ii) To make special provision with regard to supplies of water

(a) to caravans shacks huts tents or other like structures,

(b) for refrigerating apparatus or any apparatus requiring continuously running water, and

(c) for stables garages or other premises where horses carriages or motor cars are kept;

(iii) To provide that the Council shall not be required to supply with water otherwise than by measure

(a) any building used by an occupier as a dwelling-house whereof a part is used by the same occupier for any trade or manufacturing purpose for which water is required; or

(b) any mental or other hospital (whether public or private) or any nursing home sanatorium school club hotel restaurant public-house or inn; or

(c) any boarding-house or lodging-house capable of accommodating twelve or more persons including the persons usually resident therein; or

(d) any public institution which is habitually occupied by at least twenty persons including the persons usually resident therein;

(iv) To enable the Council to require where a supply of water to a farm house is used for farming purposes that such supply shall be taken by measure;

(v) To empower the Council to require that water used for a swimming bath or bathing pool shall be taken by measure;

(vi) To empower the Council in certain cases to make a minimum charge for supplies of water afforded by them;

(vii) To empower the Council to require the payment of water rates by the owners in the case of certain small houses;

(viii) To vary the existing statutory requirements regarding the giving of guarantees by persons desiring to be furnished with a supply of water by the Council;

(ix) To enable the Council to supply water in certain cases to premises outside the limits of supply;

(x) To enable the Council to exercise certain powers with respect to streets and roads forming the boundary of the limits of supply;

(xi) To extend the powers of the Council to make byelaws for preventing waste of water;

(xii) To provide that fittings let for hire shall not be subject to distress;

(xiii) To empower the Council to require stop-cocks to be fitted in communication pipes laid in connection with new buildings;

(xiv) To empower the Council to require separate communication pipes;

(xv) To make provision as to the connection and repair of communication pipes, as to the maintenance of common pipes and as to the breaking up of streets in connection with the maintenance of any pipes or apparatus;

(xvi) To prescribe penalties for interfering with valves and other apparatus;

(xvii) To make provision as to the period of error in defective meters;

(xviii) To enlarge the powers of the Council in regard to the inspection of premises for the purpose of ascertaining where there is any waste or misuse of water;

(xix) To empower local authorities to give guarantees to the Council for payments in respect of the laying down of pipes or works for the supply of water by the Council;

(xx) To provide for the recovery of water rates from persons removing;

(8) To make further provision in regard to the finances of the Council's water undertaking including

(i) provision that the revenues of the said undertaking shall be paid into and the expenses out of the general rate-fund;

(ii) provision for the keeping of separate accounts; and

(iii) provision as to the application of revenue and the maintenance of a reserve fund;

(9) To provide for the authentication and service of notices and demands and for the recovery of demands and penalties;

(10) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any
