The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 30th day of January, 1937 (P.M. 1351/36), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased Officer, Seaman or Marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 25th day of June, 1925, we were empowered at our discretion to award pensions and allowances to the widows, children and other dependent relatives of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces on the scales and under the conditions contained in the Schedule annexed thereto:

"And whereas by Order in Council dated the 7th November, 1924, we were empowered at our discretion to award pensions and gratuities to widows and allowances to children and certain other dependent relatives of Petty

Officers, Non-Commissioned Officers and men of the Royal Navy and Marines and of the Reserve Forces on the scales and under the conditions contained in the Schedule annexed thereto:

"And whereas we deem it desirable to modify in certain particulars the conditions under which pensions may be granted to the parents of Officers and men of the Naval and Marine Forces:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the amendments to the said Orders in Council set out in the annexed Schedules A and B, and to empower us at our discretion to apply these amended regulations to the parents of Officers, Seamen and Marines whose deaths are directly attributable to the conditions of service after the 30th September, 1921, with effect from the 11th January, 1937.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE A.

"Clause 16 of the Schedule to Order in Council of 25th June, 1925, to be cancelled and the following substituted therefor:—

"1. If an Officer dies in circumstances which would have qualified his widow, or child, had he been married, for a pension or allowance at the attributable rate, his parent or parents may be granted an annual allowance subject to such

conditions as the Admiralty may determine, provided that:—

(a) the Officer did not leave a widow, or a child eligible for an allowance, under these regulations;

(b) the parent or parents are in pecuniary need;

(c) either the parent or parents were largely dependent on the Officer at the time of his death, or the father is deceased or incapable of self-support through age or infirmity.

" 2. The rate of allowance shall be at the discretion of the Admiralty but shall not exceed:—

(a) Officers of the rank or equivalent rank of Lieutenant, R.N. and above.	One and a half times the "Ordinary" rate of Widow's Pensions.
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(b) Other Commissioned ranks.	£70 a year.
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(c) Warrant Officers, R.N., and Officers of equivalent rank.	£60 a year.
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" 3. A grant shall not be transferable, but, if an award has been made to the two parents of an Officer, payment or pension may be continued to the survivor at such rate as the Admiralty may determine.

" 4. An allowance shall cease on the remarriage of the grantee.

" SCHEDULE B.

" Clauses 23 to 26 of the Schedule to Order in Council of 7th November, 1924, to be cancelled and the following substituted therefor:—

" 1. If a Seaman or Marine dies in circumstances which would have qualified his widow or child, had he been married, for a pension or allowance under the regulations prescribed by Order in Council of 7th November, 1924, his parent or parents may be granted an allowance subject to such conditions as the Admiralty may determine, provided that—

(a) the Seaman or Marine did not leave a widow, or a child eligible for an allowance under these regulations;

(b) the parent or parents are in pecuniary need;

(c) the father is deceased or is incapable of self-support through age or infirmity.

" 2. The rate of pension shall be at the discretion of the Admiralty but shall not exceed 10s. a week for one parent or 12s. 6d. a week for both parents.

" 3. A grant shall not be transferable, but if an award has been made to the two parents of a Seaman or Marine payment of pension may be continued to the survivor at such rate as the Admiralty may determine.

" 4. An allowance shall cease on the remarriage of the grantee."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

" And whereas we consider it desirable that an allowance should be payable to the rating detailed to assist the Officer appointed for meteorological duties in Your Majesty's Ships:

" We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the grant of an allowance of 3d. a day to qualified ratings while allocated for Meteorological duties in posts allowed by complement.

" The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

WHEREAS His late Majesty King George the Fifth by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911 (1 & 2 Geo. 5. c. 46) (hereinafter called "the Act") was pleased to make the Copyright (Rome Convention) Order, 1933 (S.R. & O. 1933 (No. 253) p. 530) (hereinafter called "the Principal Order"):

And whereas Latvia has acceded to the International Convention for the Protection of Literary and Artistic Works signed at Rome on the 2nd day of June, 1928 (Treaty Series No. 12 (1932)) subject to the reservation that the provisions of Article 5 of the Berne Convention to which reference is made in the Principal Order and which relates to the right of translation, as amended by the Additional Act in the said Order mentioned, shall be substituted for the provisions of Article 8 of

the Rome Convention to which the Principal Order refers:

And whereas by Section 32 of the Act it is provided that His Majesty in Council may make Orders for altering, revoking or varying any Order in Council made under the Act, but that any Order made under the said Section should not affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the date when the Order comes into operation, and should provide for the protection of such rights and interests:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased to direct and doth hereby direct as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall have effect as if:—

(a) in Article 1 Latvia were included amongst the foreign countries of the Copyright Union named therein;

(b) at the end of the Third Schedule there were inserted the following words and figures:—

Latvia 15th May, 1937 15th May, 1937;

(c) in Article 2, proviso (ii) (b) Latvia were included amongst the foreign countries named therein;

(d) in Article 3 the words and figures "15th May, 1937," were substituted for the words "date of this Order" in the relation of that Article to any work to which the Act is applied by virtue of this Order.

2. Nothing in this Order shall affect prejudicially any rights or interests acquired or accrued at the commencement of this Order by virtue of the Principal Order.

3. The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 & 53 Vict. c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as if it were an Act of Parliament.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 15th day of May, 1937.

5. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (Rome Convention) (Latvia) Order, 1937.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS it is, among other things, provided by subsection (1) of section seventeen of the Finance Act, 1930, that if His Majesty in Council is pleased to declare—

(a) that any profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to a person resident in any foreign state through an agency in the United Kingdom or to a person resident in the United Kingdom through an agency in any foreign state are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in that foreign state; and

(b) that arrangements as specified in the declaration have been made with the Government concerned with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation,

then, unless and until the declaration is revoked by His Majesty in Council, the arrangements

specified therein shall, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from United Kingdom income tax, have effect as if enacted in that Act, but only if and so long as the arrangements, so far as they relate to the relief to be granted from the income tax payable in the foreign state, have the effect of law in the foreign state:

And whereas it is enacted by a proviso to the said subsection that no such arrangements as aforesaid shall exempt from United Kingdom income tax any profits or gains which either—

(i) arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(ii) accrue to a person resident in the United Kingdom; or

(iii) accrue to a person not resident in the United Kingdom directly or indirectly through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through any agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts:

And whereas the Agreement set out in the Schedule to this Declaration has been made between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Royal Hellenic Government.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared—

(a) that certain profits or gains arising directly or indirectly to persons resident in Greece through agencies in the United Kingdom or to persons resident in the United Kingdom through agencies in Greece are chargeable both to United Kingdom income tax and to income tax payable under the law in force in Greece; and

(b) that the arrangements contained in the said Agreement have been made with a view to the granting of relief from such double taxation.

And His Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that this Declaration may be cited as "The Relief from Double Income Tax on Agency Profits (Greece) Declaration, 1937".

SCHEDULE.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE GOVERNMENT OF GREECE.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Kingdom of Greece, being desirous of concluding an Agreement for reciprocal exemption from Income Tax in certain cases of profits or gains arising through an agency, have appointed to that end as their plenipotentiaries:—

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland:

His Excellency Sir Sydney Waterlow, K.C.M.G., C.B.E., Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary of His Britannic Majesty.

The Government of the Kingdom of Greece:

His Excellency M. Nicolas Mavroudis, Permanent Under-Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

Who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found to be in due form, have agreed as follows:—

Article 1.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland undertake that the profits or gains to which this article relates shall, so long as the exemption specified in Article 2 hereof remains effective, be exempted from Income Tax (including Surtax) chargeable in the United Kingdom for the year of assessment commencing on the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-six, and for every subsequent year of assessment, and will take the necessary action under Section 17 of the Act of Parliament of the United Kingdom, known as the Finance Act, 1930, with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

The profits or gains to which this article relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in the United Kingdom to a person who is resident in the territory of the Kingdom of Greece and is not resident in the United Kingdom, unless the profits or gains either:—

(1) Arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the United Kingdom; or

(2) Accrue, directly or indirectly, through any branch or management in the United Kingdom or through an agency in the United Kingdom where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

Article 2.

The Government of the Kingdom of Greece undertake that the profits or gains to which this article relates shall, so long as the exemption specified in Article 1 hereof remains effective, be exempted from trading tax and income tax chargeable in Greece as from the sixth day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-six, and thereafter, and will take the necessary steps with a view to giving the force of law to the exemption aforesaid.

The profits or gains to which this article relates are any profits or gains arising, whether directly or indirectly, through an agency in the territory of the Kingdom of Greece to a person who is resident in the United Kingdom and is not resident in the territory of the Kingdom of Greece, unless the profits or gains either:—

(1) Arise from the sale of goods from a stock in the Kingdom of Greece; or

(2) Accrue, directly or indirectly, through any branch or management in the territory of the Kingdom of Greece or through an agency in the territory of the Kingdom of Greece where the agent has and habitually exercises a general authority to negotiate and conclude contracts.

Article 3.

For the purposes of this Agreement the word "person" includes any body of persons, corporate or not corporate, and a body corporate shall be regarded as resident in the United Kingdom if its business is managed and controlled in the United Kingdom, and shall be regarded as resident in the territory of the Kingdom of Greece if its business is managed and controlled in the territory of the Kingdom of Greece.

Article 4.

This Agreement shall come into force on the date of signature and may be denounced at any time upon six months' notice being given by one Contracting Party to the other.

In witness whereof the above named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Agreement and affixed thereto their seals.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 26th day of November, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, Chapter 77, of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, the New Parish of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, the New Parish of Saint John, Welling, and the New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, all in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, and of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, and the New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, both in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark:

"Whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 23rd day of June, 1840, and being under the hand and seal of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend William, then Archbishop of Canterbury, a certain part of the Parish of Bexley, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the Diocese of Canterbury but now in the said Diocese of Rochester, was assigned as a Particular District to the consecrated Church of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, situate in the said Parish of Bexley and such Particular District is known as the Particular District of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey:

" And whereas by the authority of an Instrument bearing date the 18th day of November, 1869, and being under our Common Seal and under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Thomas Legh, then Bishop of Rochester, a certain part of the Parish of Eltham, in the said County of Kent and at that time in the said Diocese of Rochester but now in the said Diocese of Southwark, was assigned as a Particular District to the consecrated Church of the Holy Trinity, situate in the said Parish of

Eltham, and such particular District was called ' The Particular District of the Holy Trinity, Eltham ':

" And whereas separate Districts for spiritual purposes have been constituted by the names of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup; Saint John, Welling, and All Saints, New Eltham, and a Consolidated Chapelry has been assigned to the Church of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, by the Orders in Council, the dates of which are stated in the 3rd Column of the following Table:—

" And whereas the said Particular District of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, the said Particular District of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, the said District of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, the said District of Saint John, Welling, the said District of All Saints, New Eltham, and the said Consolidated Chapelry of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, have under the provisions of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, become New Parishes of the character contemplated by that Act, by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

" And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, the said New Parish of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, the said New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, and the said New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, with the consents of the Right Reverend Martin, Bishop of Rochester, and of the Right Reverend Richard Godfrey, Bishop of Southwark (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, the said New Parish of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, the said New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, and the said New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham,

which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured blue shall be dissevered from such New Parish and from the said Diocese of Southwark and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, and of the said Diocese of Rochester; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and from the said Diocese of Southwark and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, and of the said Diocese of Rochester; (thirdly) all those portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, and of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup, which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and from the said Diocese of Rochester and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, and of the said Diocese of Southwark; and (fourthly) all that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Lamorbey, which is described in the Fourth Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Longlands, Sidcup.

" And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending or proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The First Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Southwark, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint John, Welling, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, which is bounded upon the east partly by the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, and partly by the Parish of East Wickham, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Luke, Well Hall, Eltham, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Well Hall, Eltham, from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, at the centre of the bridge which carries Rochester Way across the Bexley-heath Line of the Eastern Section of the Southern Railway, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Rochester Way for a distance of 29 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, of the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, and of the New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Rochester, all meet.

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, being:—

" All that portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, which is bounded upon the south-west by the New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, in the said County of Kent and in the said Diocese of Southwark, upon the east by the said New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north and upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, of the said New Parish of the Holy Redeemer, Lamorbey, and of the said New Parish of Saint John, Welling, all meet in the middle of Rochester Way, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of Rochester Way for a distance of 3 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Crown Woods Way, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Crown Woods Way for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Bexley Road and Avery Hill Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Avery Hill Road for a distance of $27\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southwood Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Southwood Road for a distance of 34 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Eltham, from the said New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham.

" The Third Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of All Saints, New Eltham, being:—

west by the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Barrow-in-Furness, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north-east and upon the south-east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Matthew, Barrow-in-Furness, from the said New Parish of Newbarns and Hawcoat, at the junction of Abbey Road with Park Drive, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Park Drive (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Newbarns and Hawcoat from the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Barrow-in-Furness) for a distance of 23 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern entrance to the Public Park, and extending thence southward for a distance of 10 yards or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the entrance gateway of such Park and extending thence south-westward in a straight line across such Park for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to a point at the eastern end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the northern portion of Park Avenue, and continuing thence in the same direction and in a straight line for a distance of 4 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the Carnforth and Whitehaven Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Barrow-in-Furness, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Barrow-in-Furness.

And whereas notwithstanding the said objections the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 15th day of October, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting (1) the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Manchester, Saint James the Less, and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, and (2) certain alterations of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, and the Parishes of the Benefices of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and Manchester, Saint Jude, all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Guy, Bishop of Manchester, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon (1) the union of the said two Benefices of Manchester, Saint James the Less, and Oldham Road, Saint Peter, and (2) the alteration of the boundaries of the Parish of the said Benefices of Manchester, Saint James the Less, Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and Manchester, Saint Jude, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Manchester and therein recommended the said union and alterations of boundaries and the terms for effecting the same and the said Bishop of Manchester signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said union and alterations of boundaries which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said four Benefices are at present full the Reverend James Sutcliffe Hutchinson being the present Incumbent of

the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, the Reverend Thomas Cresswell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, the Reverend Reginald Griffith Hayden being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and the Reverend William Walmsley being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Jude:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Guy, Bishop of Manchester, Thomas Cresswell, Reginald Griffith Hayden, and William Walmsley (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, and the northern part of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, being the part of such Benefice which is bounded upon the north-west by the Parish of the said Benefice of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, upon the east by the Parish of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Jude, upon the south-east by the middle of Cannel Street and upon the south-west by the middle of Great Ancoats Street, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls and one Parish for all ecclesiastical purposes under the style of 'The United Benefice of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, with Saint James the Less.'

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, shall be vacant the union shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, shall be full then the union shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation after that day of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, and in either case the said Thomas Cresswell, if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Oldham Road, Saint Peter, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That if within the period of six calendar months immediately following the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said James Sutcliffe Hutchinson shall with the consent of the said Bishop of Manchester retire from the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, in order that the said union may take immediate effect, then he shall be entitled to receive out of the annual income of the United Benefice and by way of compensation, an annual sum of £250 which annual sum shall commence as from the day upon which the said union shall take effect and shall be payable by equal quarterly payments in every year, the first quarterly payment becoming due at the end of three calendar months next after the day upon which the said union shall

take effect and the said annual sum shall be payable to the said James Sutcliffe Hutchinson during the remainder of his life subject, however, to the same conditions as to suspension reduction and forfeiture, as a pension assigned to a retiring Incumbent under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, 1871, and 1887; and the provisions of those Acts as to the recovery in case of non-payment, and as to such conditions as aforesaid shall apply to the said annual sum and to the said James Sutcliffe Hutchinson as if the said annual sum were a pension awarded under the said Resignation Acts and the said James Sutcliffe Hutchinson had resigned his Benefice under those Acts.

"5. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint James the Less, Manchester, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint James the Less, Manchester, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"6. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"7. That after the said union has taken effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Oldham Road, Saint Peter.

"8. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint James the Less, Manchester, shall be taken down and (1) the materials thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales shall be appropriated to the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and (2) the site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for a nominal sum as an addition to the site of the Parsonage House now belonging to the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, and hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

(b) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint James the Less, Manchester, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Peter, Oldham Road, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Manchester and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint James the Less, Manchester, or such of them as the Bishop of Manchester shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, or

to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Manchester which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall constitute and form part of the said Expenses Fund.

"9. That upon the union taking effect (a) all that part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less, which lies to the south-west of the middle of Great Ancoats Street shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Ancoats, Saint Andrew, and (b) the remaining part of the Parish of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint James the Less (being the part of such Parish which lies to the east and south-east of the middle of Cannel Street and to the north and north-east of Great Ancoats Street) shall be transferred and annexed for all ecclesiastical purposes to the Parish of the said Benefice of Manchester, Saint Jude.

"Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the appropriation of the Church of Saint James the Less, Manchester, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the appropriation under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the appropriation hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint James the Less, Manchester, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make an alteration in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Manchester has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Westbury, in the County of Buckingham and in the Diocese of Oxford:

"Whereas at the date of the deed of conveyance hereinafter mentioned the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Westbury was vested in Sir Samuel Edward Scott, Baronet, of Redenham House, Andover, in the County of Southampton, in fee simple:

"And whereas by a deed of conveyance bearing date the 31st day of October, 1932, the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage and presentation was conveyed (inter alia) by the said Sir Samuel Edward Scott to Nathaniel Henry Reed, of Church Street, Launceston, in the County of Cornwall, Merchant:

" And whereas no steps have been taken in respect of such transfer of patronage to comply with the provisions of the Benefices Act, 1898, or of the Benefices (Transfer of Rights of Patronage) Measure, 1930, by reason whereof such intended transfer of patronage was not fully effectual:

" And whereas the said Sir Samuel Edward Scott and Nathaniel Henry Reed are now willing that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Westbury, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Oxford for the time being:

" And whereas the Right Reverend Thomas Banks, now Bishop of Oxford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, has executed this Scheme as herein-after mentioned:

" Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Sir Samuel Edward Scott and Nathaniel Henry Reed (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Westbury shall be transferred to the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Thomas Banks, Bishop of Oxford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

" And whereas both of the said Benefices of Atwick and Nunkeeling are now full being held together in plurality by the Reverend Edwin Stanley Blades under the authority of a Dispensation:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of York.

YORKSHIRE CASUAL POOR ASSISTANCE AUTHORITY.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

87.517. (5th February, 1937.)

Whereas by the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority Order, 1935 (hereinafter referred to as the Order of 1935), the Minister of Health made provision until the 1st day of April, 1940, for the combination of the administrative counties of the East, North, and West Ridings of Yorkshire, and the county boroughs of Barnsley, Bradford, Dewsbury, Doncaster, Halifax, Huddersfield, Kingston-upon-Hull, Leeds, Middlesbrough, Rotherham, Sheffield, Wakefield, and York, for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casual poor persons by a Joint Committee named the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority;

And whereas the constituent authorities of the Joint Committee have made application to the Minister of Health for an amendment of the Order of 1935 in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority

(Amendment) Order, 1937, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1937.

(2) The Order of 1935 and this Order shall be construed as one and may be cited together as the Yorkshire Casual Poor Assistance Authority Orders, 1935 and 1936.

2. The Order of 1935 shall be read and have effect as if in lieu of Articles 13 and 14 thereof there were substituted the following Articles, that is to say—

“ 13.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Article, the Joint Committee shall in each accounting period pay to each of the Councils a sum calculated at the rate of £5 per annum—

(a) in respect of each approved bed provided by that Council and available for use in approved accommodation for casuals;

(b) in respect of—

(i) each bed provided by that Council which was available for use in a casual ward immediately before the closing thereof at any time after the first day of April, 1930, and before the first day of April, 1937, following upon a recommendation in that behalf made to the Minister by the Joint Committee;

(ii) each approved bed provided by that Council in approved accommodation for casuals which has, following a recommendation in that behalf made to the Minister by the Joint Committee, ceased to be used:

Provided that no sum shall become payable to a Council under sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph in respect of any bed unless at the date when it ceased to be used as aforesaid it had been provided for less than twenty years, and any sum which becomes payable to a Council under sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph shall cease to be payable on the expiration of a period equal to the residue unexpired at the date when the bed ceased to be used as aforesaid of a period of twenty years after the date when the bed was provided.

(2) When no sum is payable or any sum ceases to be payable to a Council in respect of a bed to which sub-paragraph (b) of the last preceding paragraph applies the Joint Committee may, for such period or further period, as the case may require, as they may determine, pay to the Council in respect of such bed a sum calculated at the rate of £1 per annum.

(3) Notwithstanding anything in the preceding provisions of this Article no sum shall be paid in respect of a bed which has ceased to be used as aforesaid if the accommodation in which it is provided, or any part thereof is sold, let or otherwise disposed of by the Council or so long as the accommodation or any part thereof is used for purposes other than the accommodation of casuals.

(4) The Joint Committee shall not after the 31st March, 1938, approve or continue to approve any bed in accommodation for casuals unless the accommodation is maintained in good repair and kept efficiently equipped by the Council to the reasonable satisfaction of the Joint Committee or if at any time any improvement required by the Joint Committee

to any building or equipment comprised therein is not carried out by the Council to the reasonable satisfaction of the Joint Committee in accordance with plans and estimates previously approved by them for the purpose or unless the Joint Committee otherwise determine if any improvement to the accommodation is carried out by the Council without the prior approval of the Joint Committee.

(5) In the accounting period commencing on the first day of April, 1937, the Joint Committee in addition to complying with the provisions of this order so far as they relate to that accounting period shall also make payments to the Councils in respect of the accounting periods which commenced on the first day of April in each of the years 1935 and 1936 as if Article 13 of this Order had come into operation on the first day of April, 1935, and as if any bed or accommodation first approved on or after the 1st day of April, 1937, which was available for use at an earlier date had been approved at such earlier date.

(6) For the purposes of this Article the expression "approved" in relation to a bed or accommodation means a bed or accommodation for the time being provided by a Council and approved by the Joint Committee.

14.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in respect of each accounting period pay to each of the Councils a sum in respect of each casual relieved by the Council during that accounting period.

(2) The sum payable to a Council under paragraph (1) of this Article shall—

(a) in respect of any casual maintained or treated otherwise than in a casual ward in circumstances which the Joint Committee approve, be such sum as the Joint Committee may from time to time determine; and

(b) in respect of each casual maintained in a casual ward, be such sum as may from time to time be fixed by the Joint Committee:

Provided that the Joint Committee may increase the sum payable under sub-paragraph (b) of this paragraph by such amount as they may consider warranted by special circumstances affecting any particular casual ward."
