WHEREAS by Section 29 of the Copyright Act 1911 (1-2 G. 5 c. 46) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the Act (except such parts, if any, thereof as may be specified in the Order) shall apply to certain classes of foreign works:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the State of North Borneo has made or has undertaken to make such provision as it appears to His Majesty expedient to require for the protection of works entitled to copyright under the provisions of Part I of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the Act, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct and doth hereby direct as follows:—

i. The Act shall apply—

(a) to works first published in North Borneo, in like manner as if they were first published within the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which the Act extends;

(b) to literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works, or any class thereof, the authors whereof were at the time of the making of the work citizens of North Borneo, in like manner as if the authors were British subjects;

(c) in respect of residence in North Borneo, in like manner as if such residence were residence in the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which the Act extends.

2. Where any musical work to which the Act is applied by this Order has been published before the date of this Order but no contrivance by means of which the work may be mechanically performed has before the said date been lawfully made or placed on sale within the parts of His Majesty's dominions to which this Order applies, copyright in such work shall include all rights conferred by the Act with respect to the making of records, perforated rolls and other contrivances by means of which the work may be mechanically performed.

3. In the application of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Act, to any work to which the Act is applied by this Order, the date of this Order shall be substituted for "the commencement of this Act" and for "the passing of this Act" in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever those expressions occur.

4. Where any person has, before the date of this Order, taken any action whereby he has incurred any expenditure or liability in connection with the reproduction or performance of any work in a manner which at the time was lawful, or for the purpose of or with a view to the reproduction or performance of a

work at a time when such reproduction or performance would, but for the making of this Order, have been lawful, nothing in this Order shall diminish or prejudice any rights or interest arising from or in connection with such action which are subsisting and valuable at the said date unless the person who, by virtue of this Order, becomes entitled to restrain such reproduction or performance agrees to pay such compensation as failing agreement may be determined by arbitration.

5. The Interpretation Act 1889 (52-3 V. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

6. This Order may be cited as the Copyright (North Borneo) Order, 1937.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Saint John Baptist College, in the University of Oxford, on the 2nd day of February, 1937, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

EX-PARTE THE PRESIDENT AND FELLOWS OF SAINT JOHN BAPTIST COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

A STATUTE made to amend certain Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 (13 and 14 Geo. 5 Ch. 33) in relation to Saint John Baptist College in the University of Oxford duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose on the fifteenth day of December one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six under Section 7 (2) of the said Act by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of the persons present and voting (notice of which has in accordance with Section 7 (2) of the said Act been given to the University of Oxford and which is not a Statute which affects the University of Oxford within the meaning of the said Section) and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas it appears to us the President and Fellows of the said College that it is desirable that certain Statutes of the said College shall be altered amended and added to in manner hereinafter appearing.

Now We the President and Fellows of the said College in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of Section 7 of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 Do by this present instrument under our Seal alter amend and add to the Statutes of the said College in manner following that is, to say:—

In Statute II Clause 1 by deleting from the clause the words "(a) Honorary Fellows and (b) during their periods of probation"

In Statute III Clause 1 by inserting after the words "in the" the words "Fellows of the College being members of the"

In Statute III Clause 3 by substituting the words "As soon as may be after the 31st January in any year in which it shall become known that a vacancy will occur on the 31st July in the office of President by retirement in accordance with the provisions of Clause 5 of this Statute, or as soon as it shall have become known that a vacancy has occurred in the office of President for any other reason," for the words "As soon as it shall have become known that a vacancy has occurred in the office of President,"; by substituting the word "Electors" in two places for the words "Governing Body"; and by inserting after the words "if the vacancy occur" the words "otherwise than in accordance with Clause 5 of this Statute"

In Statute III Clause 4 by deleting the word "Each" at the beginning of the clause and substituting therefor the words "At the meeting for election, each"; and by inserting the word "Official" in two places between the words "Senior" and "Fellow"

In Statute III Clause 5 by inserting after the words "But the" the words "Fellows of the College being members of the"; by substituting for the words "years, provided that such" the words "years. Such"; by inserting after the words "shall take place" the words "at a meeting which shall, at the request in writing of not less than four Fellows being members of the Governing Body, be summoned by the Vice-President or, if within seven days of his receipt of such a request he fails to summon a meeting, by the Senior Official Fellow in residence (not being the Vice-President), and shall be held not earlier than the 1st January nor"; and by deleting the word "not" before the words "later than the 31st January next"

In Statute III Clause 9 by substituting "£400" for "£300"

In Statute III Clause 10 by substituting "£2,000" for "£1,900"

In Statute III Clause 11 by deleting the words "of the College after these Statutes have come into operation" after the word "Presidency"

In Statute IV Clause 3 Sub-clause (xiii) by inserting the words "Emeritus or" after the word "No"

In Statute IV Clause 6 Sub-clause (iii) by substituting the words "admission to" for the words "acceptance of"; and by the substitution of the word "to" for the word "of" before the words "a Fellowship (stipendiary or non-stipendiary)"

In Statute IV Clause 7 by deleting the words "to reside and" after the words "requiring the person elected"

In Statute IV Clause 7 Sub-clause (2) by deleting the words "residing and" after the words "Church of England"

In Statute IV Clause 8 Sub-clause (i) by substituting the words "elsewhere. There" for the words "elsewhere; and there"; by substituting the word "three" for the word "four"; and by deleting the word "such" before the words "Fellows resident in rooms"

In Statute IV Clause 12 Sub-clause (i) by inserting the words "and no Senior Research Fellow" after the words "the Principal Bursar," and by inserting the words "or Senior Research" after the word "Official"

In Statute V Clause 1 by substituting the words "and a Librarian or Librarians," for the words "and Librarian."

In Statute V Clause 12 by inserting the words "or Librarians" after the words "The Librarian"

In Statute VI Clause 3 by deleting the words "Whenever a vacancy shall occur in any of the Fellowships such vacancy shall be filled by election."

In Statute VI Clause 4 by substituting the words "Not more than four nor less than two months before the expiry of a Fellowship or within a convenient time after the occurrence of a vacancy for any reason other than efflux of time the Electors shall proceed to the election of a Fellow in accordance with Clauses 5, 6, and 7." for the words "Any vacancy which shall occur in any Fellowship shall be filled up as soon as conveniently may be."

In Statute VI Clause 5 by substituting the words "Notice of a vacancy" for the words "Within a convenient time after the occurrence of any vacancy notice thereof"

In Statute VI Clause 9 by substituting the words "the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland" for the words "Great Britain"

In Statute VI Clause 12 by substituting the words "years. No Fellow" for the words "years, but the Electors may extend any Fellowship for one further period not exceeding three years. Except for such extension no Fellow"; and by inserting at the end of the clause the following words "But the Electors may extend any Fellowship held on 31st December, 1936, for one further period not exceeding three years."

In Statute VI Clause 13 by substituting "1936" for "1924"; by substituting the words "one Fellowship" for "two Fellowships"; by substituting "£300" for "£200" in three places; by substituting the word "second" for the word "third"; and by substituting the word "two" for the word "three"

In Statute VI Clause 17 by substituting the words "be members of the Governing Body of the College," for the words "participate in the property or emoluments of the College, nor shall they have any voice in, or control over, its administration or in the exercise of its ecclesiastical patronage,"

In Statute VIII Clause 7 by deleting the words "in the case of Coventry and Bristol Schools, by the Headmaster and Chairman of the Governing Body of the School; in the case of Reading School by the Mayor of Reading, the Chairman of the Church Charity Trustees of Reading, and the Headmaster, or any two of them; and in the case of Tonbridge School by the Head Master; after the receipt, in each case, of the aforesaid notice by the Head Master." and substituting the words "by the Head Master after the receipt by him of the aforesaid notice." after the words "The Certificate shall be signed"

In Statute IX Clause 11 by substituting the words "prosecute their studies." for the words "complete their course of study in the University."

In Statute XV by inserting after Clause 13 the following new clause:—

"14. On behalf of every Senior Research Fellow the College shall effect with one of the Life Assurance Offices recognised by the Central Council administering and controlling the Federated Superannuation System for Universities an assurance which shall be subject to the provisions of Clause 3 of this Statute and upon which the annual premium shall be 15 per cent. of the beneficiary's annual stipend from the College. Of this premium the College shall pay two-thirds and the remaining one-third shall be deducted from the stipend of the beneficiary."

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th February, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd February, 1937, to Saturday, the 27th February, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

Whereas by Section 3 subsection (1) of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926 (16 & 17 Geo. 5, c. 53), it is provided that if, where an Order in Council has been made under that Act with respect to any goods, it is shown to the satisfaction of the appropriate Department by persons appearing to the Department to have a substantial interest in the matter that the application of the provisions of the Order, or of some of those provisions, to any particular class or description of those goods has caused, or is likely to cause, injury or hardship to the said persons, or any of them, the Department may direct that the Order, or any particular provisions of the Order, shall cease to apply to goods of that class or description or shall apply to such goods subject only to such modifications and conditions as the Department think fit, and the Order shall, while the direction is in force, have effect subject thereto;

And whereas by Article 1 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 4 Order, 1930,* it is provided that it shall not be lawful to import into the United Kingdom or, if imported, to sell or expose for sale in the United Kingdom, any goods of the following descriptions:—

- (a) Tiles of earth or clay, other than enamelled tiles and mosaics;
- (b) Refractory bricks, blocks and tiles, other than metallic bricks, blocks and tiles; unless they bear an indication of origin;

And whereas by Article 2 of the said Order it is provided that in the case of refractory bricks, blocks and tiles, the indication of origin shall be impressed or embossed on each brick, block or tile:

And whereas the Board of Trade, being the appropriate Department in this case, having considered representations made to them in that behalf by persons appearing to the Board to have a substantial interest in the matter, are satisfied that the application of the aforesaid provisions of Article 2 of the said Order to refractory bricks, blocks and tiles cast from molten material is likely to cause hardship to the said persons:

Now therefore the Board of Trade in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the said Section 3 hereby direct as follows:—

1. It shall be a sufficient compliance with the provisions of Article 2 of the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 4 Order, 1930, if in the case of any refractory bricks, blocks or tiles cast from molten material, the indication of origin is durably painted or stencilled in a contrasting colour on each brick, block or tile.

2. This Direction may be cited as the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) Exemption Direction (No. 1), 1937.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATIONS OF (1) ASSISTANT INSPECTOR OF TAXES IN THE INLAND REVENUE DEPARTMENT, AND (2) THIRD CLASS OFFICER IN THE MINISTRY OF LABOUR.

Competitions under these Regulations are open both to men and women. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 21 and 24; candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st September of the year in which the examination is held.

In reckoning age for competition, the following allowances will be made, viz. :—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy, or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served,

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every Candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department in which she is serving.

4. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

stances. A further fee of £4, being the balance of the prescribed fee of £6, will be required from every candidate attending such Examination.

The Civil Service Commissioners further give notice that an Open Competitive Examination will be held in London under the foregoing Regulations, the written work commencing on the 10th August, 1937.

Not fewer than 22 vacancies for Assistant Inspector of Taxes and 10 vacancies for Third Class Officers will be filled on the result of this Examination, if so many candidates should be found to be qualified in all respects.

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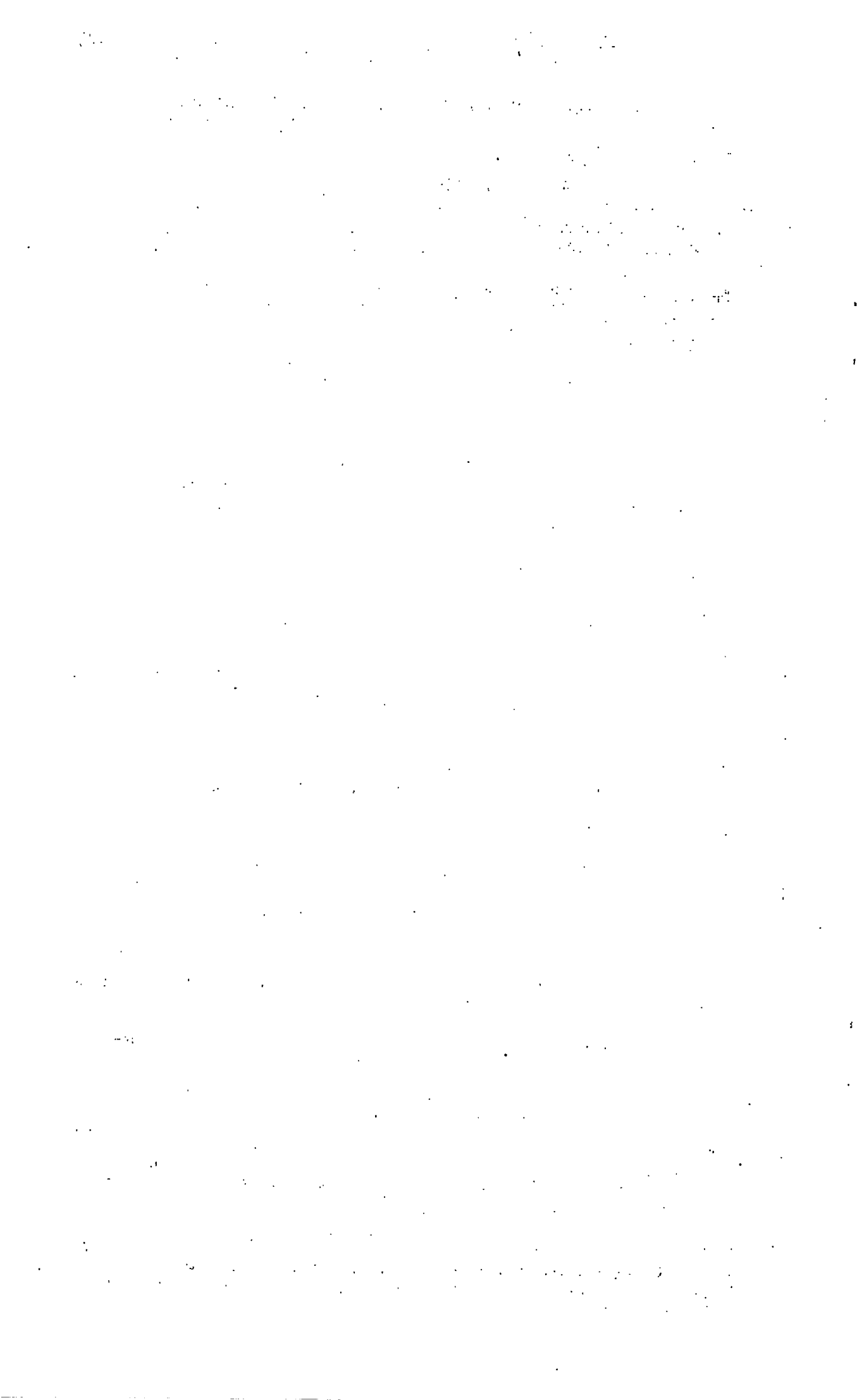
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
