WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that for the protection of the Public Health, the opening of any new burial ground in the County Borough of Southampton, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that burials should be discontinued therein as hereinafter directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 18th December, 1936, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 6th day of February next, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new burial ground shall be opened in the said County Borough of Southampton save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, and that burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

SOUTHAMPTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the Millbrook Church Burial Ground.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 26th day of November, 1936, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sheffield, Saint Mary, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and Sheffield, Saint Mary, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Sheffield and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Sheffield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices

based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total endowments of the Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice and that it is desirable that a part of such endowments should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the augmentation of a Benefice not having a competent provision that is to say a proposed District in the said Diocese of Sheffield:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and Sheffield, Saint Mary, are now full the Reverend Alfred George Jones being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and the Reverend Canon William Bracewell being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary with Saint Simon' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Sheffield, Saint Mary, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Sheffield, Saint Mary, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, and the then Incumbent of Sheffield, Saint Simon, shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, and if the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, shall have been instituted to Sheffield, Saint Mary, subsequently to the date

of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall have been instituted to the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, before that date and shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, following such avoidance of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and the then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as a fund for and towards the provision of a Parsonage House for the proposed District hereinafter mentioned.

"6. (a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

(b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Sheffield under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations and (2) the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection

of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Bishop of Sheffield as the District for which such Church shall be built; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Sheffield.

(c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint Mary, Sheffield, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Sheffield and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, or such of them as the Bishop of Sheffield shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Sheffield for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Sheffield which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, as aforesaid.

(d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Sheffield equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part of it out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 7. That upon the union taking effect all the properties revenues and income constituting the endowments (present and future) of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, and of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, shall subject to the provisions contained in Clause 8 of this Scheme be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice.

" 8. That with the consents of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified as aforesaid), and of Albert Harland, of Number 10, Psalter Lane, Sheffield, Esquire (testified by his signing this Scheme), being the Patrons of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon, upon the union taking effect a part of the endowments of the Benefices proposed to be constituted an United Benefice that is to say an annual payment of £213 6s. 8d. (being part of a larger annual payment at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon) shall be severed or diverted therefrom and shall be held and accumulated by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, for and towards the augmentation of the proposed District hereinbefore referred to.

" 9. That after the said union has taken effect (a) the Patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Patron of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Mary, and (b) the Patronage of the proposed District referred to in this Scheme shall belong wholly to the Patrons of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint Simon.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said Measures are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by those Measures of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Church of Saint Simon, Sheffield, and of the site thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

" And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Sheffield has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of January, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Syston (or Siston), in the County of Gloucester and in the Diocese of Bristol:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Syston (or Siston) is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in James Ernest Rawlins of Great Hormead Bury, Buntingford, in the County of Hertford, Esquire:

"And whereas the said James Ernest Rawlins is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Syston (or Siston) now vested in him as aforesaid should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Bristol for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Clifford Salisbury, now Bishop of Bristol, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:—

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Syston (or Siston) which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Syston (or Siston):

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said James Ernest Rawlins (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Clifford Salisbury,

Bishop of Bristol (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Syston (or Siston) now vested in him, the said James Ernest Rawlins as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and his successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Clifford Salisbury, Bishop of Bristol, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Bristol.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Balliol College, in the University of Oxford, on the 6th day of February, 1937, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

BALLIOL COLLEGE OXFORD.

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Balliol College in the University of Oxford duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of Balliol College especially summoned for that purpose on the seventh day of December one thousand nine hundred and thirty-six and passed at such Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

STATUTE for Balliol College made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.



*Preliminary.*

This Statute is supplementary to the existing Statutes of the College that is to say the Statutes dated the 19th day of December, 1925, made for the College by the University of Oxford Commissioners and the Statutes made for the College by the Master and Fellows dated respectively the 18th day of March, 1928, the 6th day of December, 1928, the 4th day of December, 1929, and the 4th day of March, 1933,

*Andrew Bradley Fellowship.*

Stat. I.: In the clause under this title, after the words "tenure of their Fellowships" shall be inserted the words "the Andrew Bradley Fellow, unless the Master and Fellows after any election otherwise determine," and after the words "first year of their Fellowships" the words "nor the Andrew Bradley Fellow, unless the Master and Fellows after any election otherwise determine."

Stat. III. 3 (iv): The following new clause shall be added and it is hereby enacted as follows:—

"(c) The Andrew Bradley Fellowship in English Literature, the holder of which shall be either a Senior or a Junior Research Fellow and shall have duties and rights as defined in clause (a) or in clause (b), except that the Master and Fellows shall after each election determine whether the holder shall or shall not be a member of the Governing Body."

*Retiring Age.*

Stat. II. 5: The last sentence of this clause commencing with "until the day when" to the end shall be deleted and in their stead the following is hereby enacted: "until the 31st of July next following his seventieth birthday."

Stat. III. 10: The following words "after he has attained the age of sixty-five years" shall be deleted and in their stead the following is hereby enacted: "after the 31st of July next following his sixty-fifth birthday."

## TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 26th February, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 1st March, 1937, to Saturday, the 6th March, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. The Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on

the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to John Edward Samuels, in recognition of his gallantry in connection with the Gresford Colliery Explosion on the 22nd September, 1934.

The sole survivors of those working underground were six men, of whom Samuels, a coal-cutting machineman, was one. They had been working at the time in what was known as No. 29's District. The effect of the explosion was to close the normal means of access to this section of the mine and thereby to cut off those working there, but it seemed to a group of men who had got together that a way out might be found along a little used road which served as a return airway. This hope proved in the end to be justified but the survivors had to fight their way for nearly half a mile through an atmosphere so laden with gas that at an early stage some of the party turned back to seek some other way out, only to meet their deaths. The worst place proved to be at a point where the road crossed a fault and it was necessary for a ladder to be climbed in order to reach the upper level. At various points, members of the party fell behind and the temptation to leave them to their fate must have been very strong.

Throughout Samuels took a leading part in encouraging members of the party, in advising as to what should be done or attempted, and in giving other help, staying behind to render assistance at a time when any delay in escaping was fraught with grave danger. The Chief Inspector of Mines, in the Report just published on the explosion, states that Samuels summed up the position and displayed qualities of leadership in a most terrifying situation, and there seems to be no doubt that some at least of the party owe their lives to his coolness and courage.

The following definition of the limits of the Admiralty waters shall be substituted for that given in the Regulations made on the 12th day of October, 1932:—

The limits of the Admiralty waters are as follows:—

All the water area lying between the shore and the following line, namely from a point on the high water line 60 yards south of the root of Rosia Mole in a direction  $272^{\circ}$  for a distance of 115 yards, thence  $310^{\circ}$  for a distance of 340 yards, thence along lines parallel to and 200 yards from the South and Detached Moles respectively and including the North and South Entrances, thence along lines parallel to and 50 yards from the faced wall of the North Mole, thence to the shore along the North Mole, the boundaries being as delineated on the chart attached to the Order in Council bearing date the 22nd March, 1911.

2. To enable the Council to provide dwelling-houses for employees, offices, showrooms, etc. and to exhibit specimen installations and give demonstrations of the uses to which gas can be put.

3. To make provision in regard to the laying of gas mains and pipes in streets which form the boundary of the limits of supply of the Council, to enable the Council to lay pipes for ancillary purposes and to make a specification with regard to the minimum size and the material of the pipes and fittings to be laid by the owner or occupier of any premises, and to enact other provisions for the conduct of the gas undertaking of the Council including provisions in regard to the position of the meter, power to compel repairs in case of danger, for prevention of improper use of gas, inspection and testing of meters, relief from obligation to supply in certain cases, as to the application of proceeds of sale and hire of fittings, fittings let for hire not to be subject to distress and as to recovery of sums due for fittings, etc., charges for special readings of meters, power to take licences for use of patents.

4. To empower the Council to borrow money for the purposes of and in connection with the proposed Special Order and to make other financial provisions including provision for all receipts of the undertaking both on capital and revenue account to be carried to and form part of the general rate fund of the urban district of Brigg and for all payments and expenses of the undertaking to be paid or provided out of the general rate fund.

5. To make provision as to the form and nature of the accounts of the undertaking to be kept by the Council, and as to the method by which and the purposes for which the surplus revenue of the undertaking shall be expended and applied by the Council, and amongst other things to permit of the formation of a reserve fund in connection with the undertaking for making good any deficiency charged to the general rate fund, in meeting any extraordinary claims or demand in respect of the undertaking or in paying the cost of renewing improving or extending any works forming part of the undertaking or otherwise for the benefit thereof.

6. To authorise the use by the Council for the purposes of any borrowing power exercisable by them of any moneys forming part of any fund accumulated for the redemption of debt or as a reserve or other similar fund.

7. To make provision in regard to the notice to be given by a consumer to discontinue a supply of gas and as to the service of gas demand notes and the inclusion of several sums in one summons and for the recovery of demands and penalties.

8. To incorporate with the Order with or without amendment or modification all or any of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts and the Gasworks Clauses Acts 1847 and 1871 and the Acts amending those Acts respectively and to amend and repeal some of the provisions of the Brigg Urban District Gas Act 1899 and the Brigg Urban District Gas (Charges) Order 1921 and any other Act or Order relating to the gas undertaking of the Council.

Any local or other public authority company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 22nd day of March, 1937.
