POULTRY MARKETS AND RECEPTACLES
(DISINFECTION) (AMENDMENT)
ORDER OF 1937.

SUBJECT.

Amends Article 2 of the Poultry Markets and Receptacles (Disinfection) Order of 1936 by adding the following proviso thereto:—

" Provided that if the receptacle is used for the conveyance of pigeons for the purpose of a race or of a flight by way of training for racing it shall not be necessary after such pigeons have been released to cleanse and disinfect such receptacle before it is returned empty to the Sender.
