NEWCASTLE-UPON-TYNE AND GATESHEAD GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade forthwith by the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and

Gateshead Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is 30 Grainger Street, Newcastle-upon-Tyne for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934 for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Company to purchase the Undertaking (hereinafter referred to as "the South Shields undertaking") of the South Shields Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Vendors").

2. To transfer to and vest in the Company and empower them to carry on the South Shields undertaking and (if thought fit) to confirm and make binding on the parties any agreement which may have been entered into between the Company and the Vendors with respect to the purchase and sale of the South Shields undertaking and to enact all such incidental and consequential provisions as may be necessary or convenient.

3. To make provision as to the consideration for such purchase and sale and as to the debts and liabilities of and moneys due or accruing due to the Vendors.

4. To make provision for the creation of ordinary stock of the Company to the amount requisite for the purpose of such purchase and sale and to define the ranking of the stock so created and the rights of the holders thereof.

5. To provide for the transfer to the Company of the obligations of the Vendors in regard to certain outstanding mortgage bonds of the Vendors, to charge the said mortgage bonds upon the undertaking of the Company and to define the rights of the holders of the said mortgage bonds or to provide for the payment off of the said mortgage bonds.

6. To provide for the dissolution of the Vendors and the winding-up of their affairs.

7. To make provision as to the compensation to be paid by the Company to the directors secretary and auditors of the Vendors and as to the employment by the Company of, or the payment of compensation to, other employees of the Vendors and as to the payment by the Company of pensions granted by the Vendors.

8. To make provisions as to the declaration of the calorific values of and as to the price which may be charged by the Company for gas supplied within the added limits (including provisions empowering the Company to charge different prices for gas supplied by them in different parts of the added limits).

9. To define or fix for the purposes of the intended Order and of the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Gateshead Gas Act 1929 and the Newcastle-upon-Tyne and Gateshead Gas (Basic Prices) Order 1936 a basic price or basic prices for the gas to be supplied by the Company within the added limits or any part or parts thereof.

10. To authorise the Company to exercise the existing and unexercised powers of the Vendors of raising money by the creation and issue of capital or debenture stock or by mortgage of their undertaking.

11. To make provision for the dissolution of the Officers' Superannuation Fund Association of the Vendors and the payment (in certain cases) out of the funds or property of that association of sums to persons entitled thereto and the disposal of the balance of such funds and property and to make provisions as to the
