TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 5th March, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 8th March, 1937, to Saturday, the 13th March, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

PETROLEUM (PRODUCTION) ACT, 1934.

In pursuance of Section 2 (3) of the Petroleum (Production) Act, 1934, the Board of Trade hereby give notice that in accordance with the provisions of that Act and of the Petroleum (Production) Regulations, 1935, they have granted to the D'Arcy Exploration Company, Limited, of Britannic House, Finsbury Circus, London, E.C.2, Prospecting Licences in respect of the areas contained in the First Schedule hereto. They have also granted an application by the same Company for the extension of two licensed areas previously granted to them, so as to embrace the additional lands contained in the Second Schedule hereto.

The boundaries of the areas contained in the Schedules hereto are described by reference to the one-inch Ordnance Survey Map (Fourth Edition).

FIRST SCHEDULE.

An area of approximately 189 square miles situated in the Counties of Derby and Stafford.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the junction of roads at Devil's Elbow near Sutton-on-the-Hill in the County of Derby, and situated about $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Burton-upon-Trent Railway Station and about 7 miles west of Derby, thence along the road running in a westerly direction through Sutton-on-the-Hill and Mount Pleasant and past the Church in Church Broughton to the cross-roads about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south-west of Barton Blount. Thence along the road running in a northerly direction past Bartonpark and in a north-westerly direction past Alkmonton Old Hall and Tophouse Farm to Alkmonton. Thence following the road running in a south-westerly and westerly direction past Bentley Hall and through Great Cubley to the cross-roads at Thurstaston. Thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction through Marston Montgomery to Waldley and in a southerly direction past Doveridge Woodhouse to the cross-roads by the Inn at Doveridge. Thence following the road running in a westerly direction through Uttoxeter in the County of Stafford past Park Fields, Bramshall Station, Painleyhill and Field to the road junction at Bearsbrook.

Western Boundary

Thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction past Fradswell Heath and Parkside Farm and through Gayton to the road junction about 1,600 feet north-west of Weston-upon-Trent Railway Station. Thence following the road running in a south-easterly direction to the railway station at Weston-upon-Trent. Thence in a south-easterly direction along the North Staffordshire Railway through Pasture Fields, Great Haywood and Colwich to the junction of railway lines about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of Rugeley. Thence continuing in a south-easterly direction along the London and North Western Railway to the bridge over the River Trent about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile west of Mavesyn Ridware.

Southern Boundary.

Thence following the left bank of the River Trent in a south-easterly and easterly direction to the point where it is crossed by the Pipe Ridware-Handsacre road at High Bridge. Thence following the said road in a southerly direction for approximately 300 feet to the road junction. Thence along the road running in an easterly direction through King's Bromley past Eastfields and Lupin and through Alrewas to the cross-roads near Alrewas Railway Station. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to Croxall Railway Station.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a north-easterly direction past Catton Hall through Walton-upon-Trent in the County of Derby past Warren Hill and skirting Drakelow Park to the road junction near the bridge over the Leicester and Burton Railway. Thence in a straight line running approximately north-east

for about 2 miles to the road junction near Moat Bank situated about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of Brizlincote Hall on the main Burton-Ashby road. Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road past Broken Flats to the road junction approximately 2,700 feet past Broken Flats. Thence following the road running in a north-westerly direction through Repton past Willington Railway Station and the Inn on Rykneld Street, over Etwall Common through Etwall and continuing in a north-westerly direction past Park Farm and Fields Farm to the road junction at Devil's Elbow near Sutton-on-the-Hill, the point of departure.

An area of approximately 182 square miles situated in the Counties of Southampton and Wilts.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the cross-roads by the Bell Inn in the village of Winterbourne Stoke situated in the County of Wilts, about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of Amesbury and about $6\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Wilton, thence along the road running in an east-north-easterly direction over Longbarrow Cross Roads to the road junction about 1,500 feet east of Stonehenge. Thence in an easterly direction following the main road to Andover, passing through Amesbury and crossing the Southern Railway by Ratfyn Barrow, skirting Beacon Hill and past Park House, Thruxton Down Farm, Thruxton, Weyhill and Hundred Acre Corner to Andover in the County of Southampton, passing through the town by way of Weyhill Road, Bridge Street and London Street. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction past Newstead and Ball's Cottages to the cross-roads about 700 feet north-east of Longparish Railway Station.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence along the road following the railway in a south-westerly direction past Dublin Farm, Wherwell and Cottonworth to Fullerton Junction. Thence in a south-easterly direction crossing the Southern Railway at the Seven Stars Inn past West Down to the road junction about 2,400 feet north-west of the White Hart Inn and thence in a westerly direction for about 1,500 feet to the road junction. Thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction past New Farm to the main Stockbridge-Basingstoke road, thence along the road in a south-easterly direction past The Game Farm and in a south-westerly direction past Bushy Copse, Winter Down Copse, Little Somborne, through King's Somborne past Compton Park, Brook and Stonymarsh to the road junction about 700 feet south of Stonymarsh.

Southern Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a westerly and north-westerly direction to Mottisfont, thence in a westerly direction to Hatt Hill, and along the road in a southerly direction to Dunbridge Railway Station. Thence in a westerly direction along the road past Butt's Green, Lockerley Green, East Dean, West Dean, Manor Farm and Butter Furlong Farm, crossing the Southern Railway at West Grimstead, past Crockford Copse to the junction of roads near Whaddon. Thence in a north-westerly direction past Whaddon Common and following the main Salisbury road past Alder-

bury and Peter's Finger to the city of Salisbury in the County of Wilts, passing through Salisbury by way of Southampton Road, Fowler's Hill, Fowler's Road, Milford Street, Queen Street, Fish Row, Butcher Row, Silver Street, Bridge Street, Fisherton Street and Wilton Road. Thence along the road in a west-north-westerly direction crossing the Southern Railway near Bemerton to the road junction by the Workhouse near Fugglestone St. Peter.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a north-westerly direction through Chilhampton, South Newton, Stoford, Little Wishford, Stapleford and Berwick St. James to the cross-roads by the Bell Inn at Winterbourne Stoke, the point of departure.

An area of approximately 164 square miles situated in the Counties of Chester, Derby and Stafford.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the cross-roads in the village of Dove Holes in the County of Derby, situated about 3 miles north of Buxton and about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-east of Chapel en le Frith Railway Station, thence along the road running in a northerly direction past Hallsteads Top to the road junction about 800 feet south of the road junction by Clough Inn. Thence westwards along the road leading to Paradise to the point where it crosses the London Midland and Scottish Railway (Stockport and Buxton branch), thence along the railway in a north-westerly and westerly direction past Hollinknoll and Combs Reservoir to the point near Over Leigh where it crosses the main road from Chapel en le Frith to Macclesfield. Thence following the said main road in a westerly direction through Horwich End and Kettleshulme to the road junction at Charles Head in the County of Chester. Thence along the road running in a westerly direction past Brink Farm and Bakestonedale Farm to the road junction by the Church in the village of Pott Shrigley.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction to Bollington, passing through the town by way of High Street, Chancery Lane and Jackson Lane to the road junction about 1,300 feet south of the Church situated east of Hollin Hall. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to the fork-roads about 500 feet east of Endon Hall, thence following the left fork-road in a south-easterly direction to the road junction at Kerridge End. Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road to Brookhouse, thence in a southerly direction following the road past Marsh Farm, Grove, Rulowknob and Ward's Knob to the road junction by the silkworks at Langley. Thence along the road running in a south-westerly direction through Sutton to the road junction about 500 feet north-east of Hockley. Thence in a southerly direction following the road past Hockley and Sutton Reservoir to the cross-roads about 900 feet east of Oakgrove and thence in a westerly direction to Oakgrove. Thence in a southerly direction along the road leading past White-

moor Hill and through Marshhead and Bosley to the cross-roads at Old Mill. Thence in a westerly and north-westerly direction following the road to Bosley Railway Station thence crossing the London Midland and Scottish Railway and following the railway northwards for a distance of about 1,400 feet. Thence in a westerly and southerly direction following the road which crosses the River Dane and leads past Lymford and Toftgreen Farm in the County of Stafford to the cross-roads about 900 feet east of High Bent. Thence along the road in a south-westerly direction to the cross-roads at Timbersbrook in the County of Chester. Thence along the road running in a southerly direction to the cross-roads about 1,200 feet north of Overton Hall, thence in a south-westerly and westerly direction to the road junction at Dane in Shaw. Thence in a southerly direction along the road passing under the London Midland and Scottish Railway and leading past Whitmore and Biddulph in the County of Stafford, and through Bradley Green by way of John Street, and through Brindley Ford to the road junction about 1,200 feet south of Brindley Ford. Thence in an easterly direction along the road to Bemersley Green, thence in a south-easterly direction through Ridgeway, Ball Green and Norton in the Moors to Milton Railway Station. Thence in an easterly direction through the town by way of Station Road and Market Street and in a southerly direction along Leek Road past the Abbey to the cross-roads near the Church in Bucknall.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in an easterly direction along the road running past Brookhouse and Ash House to the road junction about 900 feet east of Ash House. Thence following the road running in a southerly direction to the road junction about 700 feet north-east of Boltongate. Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road leading past Malthouse Farm, Grove Cottage, through the village of Cellarhead, and past Southlow to the cross-roads south of the Church in Wetleyrocks. Thence in a northerly direction along the road leading past Prospect House and Ashcombe Park, through Cheddleton and skirting the west side of Cheddleton Heath to the point where the North Staffordshire Railway crosses the road about 400 feet south-west of Sheephouse Farm. Thence along the said railway in an easterly and north-easterly direction to the bridge near the cross-roads south-west of Bradnop. Thence following the road running in a north-easterly and easterly direction through Bradnop and past High Cross to the road junction by the Inn in the village of Onecote.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a north-easterly direction along the road running through Butterton Moor to the road junction about 400 feet west of Brownlow. Thence following the road in a westerly direction to the road junction about 600 feet east of Crowtrees. Thence in a northerly direction along the road running past Cowhay Head and in a north-easterly direction over Swallow Moss and Reaps Moor to Piggerhole. Thence in a northerly direction past Brownspit and Longnor to the cross-roads about 900 feet north-west of the Church in Longnor. Thence

in a westerly and north-westerly direction along the road through Dunbrook, Fawside Edge, Edgetop and Croftbottom to the road junction by the Inn about 650 feet south-east of New Lodge. Thence in a northerly direction following the road running along Axe Edge, passing through Wallnook and past Stanley Moor, Canholes and in a north-easterly direction through Burbage to Buxton in the County of Derby, passing through the town by way of Devonshire Hospital, The Quadrant, Spring Gardens and Fairfield Road. Thence along the road running in a northerly direction over Fairfield Common, past Brook House and Lower Bibbington to the cross-roads in the village of Dove Holes the point of departure.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

An area of approximately 12 square miles situated in the County of Dorset, being an Extension of the licensed area of approximately 188 square miles in the County of Dorset, particulars of which were published in the London Gazette on the 19th November, 1935.

Northern Boundary.

Commencing at the junction of the main Weymouth-Dorchester road with Watery Lane by the Church in Broadway about $4\frac{1}{2}$ miles south-south-west of Dorchester, thence for a short distance along Watery Lane to the point where it is crossed by the Great Western Railway. Thence along the railway in a westerly direction past Shilvinghampton Halt to the point where the railway crosses the road at Goose Hill Cottages near Portisham.

Western Boundary.

Thence along the road running in a southerly direction past Goose Hill and in a westerly direction to the point about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of Linton Hill, where a water-course joins the road. Thence following the left bank of the water-course in a westerly and southerly direction to the coast.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in a south-easterly direction following the high-water mark in West Fleet and East Fleet to the point where the stream which flows west of Fleet enters East Fleet. Thence in a northerly direction following the right bank of the stream to the point where it crosses the road near Pound. Thence along the road running in a north-easterly direction past the cross-roads at East Fleet, and through Chickrell, by way of West Street, North Square and East Street, and passing to the north-west of the Golf Course to the road junction by the mill at Radipole. Thence along the road running through Radipole to the road junction by the Church. Thence along the road running in a north-easterly direction to its junction with the main Weymouth-Dorchester road, about 1,500 feet south-east of Redlands.

Eastern Boundary.

Thence in a northerly direction along the main Weymouth-Dorchester road to the junction with Watery Lane by the Church in the village of Broadway the point of departure.

An area of approximately 91 square miles situated in the Counties of Southampton, Sussex and Surrey, being an Extension of the licensed area of approximately 101 square miles in the Counties of Southampton and Surrey, particulars of which were published in the London Gazette on the 19th November, 1935.

Western Boundary.

Commencing at the cross-roads by the Inn at Blacknest situated in the County of Southampton about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles west of Frensham and about 4 miles south-south-west of Farnham. Thence along the road running in a south-easterly direction to the cross-roads by Frithend House, thence in a south-westerly direction crossing the River Slea, through the village of Sleaford, across Broxhead Common, and passing through Bordon Camp and Hogmoor Inclosure to the Cross-roads near the Inn at Whitehill.

Southern Boundary.

Thence in an easterly and north-easterly direction past Hollywater and the smithy to the road junction at Eveley House by the ford at Standford. 5. To make provisions as to the sale by auction or tender of shares issued by the Company for the purposes of the said undertaking.
