TITHE RULES.

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Section 1 (1) of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that after the expiration of at least 40 days from the date hereof the Lord Chancellor, after consultation with the Rule Committee of County Court Judges, proposes to make Rules under Section 16 of the Tithe Act, 1936, and Section 3 of the Tithe Act, 1891, for carrying out the provisions of the Tithe Act, 1936, relating to the recovery of redemption annuities and arrears of or relating to tithe rentcharge, and for amending the Tithe Rentcharge Recovery Rules, 1891.

Notice is further given that under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, the Lord Chancellor has, on account of urgency, made the above-mentioned Rules to come into operation on the 10th day of March, 1937, as Provisional Rules.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

Lords Commissioners Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 19th March, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or (10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 22nd March, 1937, to Saturday, the 27th March, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the

Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
