MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1926.

Reference to the Standing Committee.

In accordance with the provisions of sub-section (4) of Section 2 of the Merchandise Marks Act, 1926, the Board of Trade give notice that in pursuance of an application received by them for the making of an Order-in-Council to require imported goods of certain

classes and descriptions to bear an indication of origin they have made a reference to the Standing Committee appointed by them under the Act in respect of the following descriptions of imported goods:—

The undermentioned textile smallwares made wholly or partly of cotton, wool (including alpaca, mohair, cashmere, llama, vicuna and camels' hair) silk, artificial silk, hemp, flax or jute, whether or not coated, impregnated or in any other way treated or operated upon, but not including goods made wholly or mainly of reed, rush, straw or coir:—

(a) Badges and Initials, Bindings, Boot, Shoe, Corset and similar laces, Coat and Boot Loops, Fringes, Galloons, Gimps, Hat Bands, Petershams, Tapes, Trimmings and Tassels, Wire Coverings.

(b) Armbands, Braces, Garters and Suspenders.

(c) Goods, other than elastic goods, of the following descriptions:—

Belts and Girdles (Sports, trouser and dress); Braids, Cords and Webbing.

Attention is called to the fact that while, under the provisions of the above Act, the Committee must in every case referred to them consider whether the goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of sale or exposure for sale, they may also at their discretion consider and report upon the question whether such goods should bear an indication of origin at the time of importation.

COAL MINES ACT, 1911.

The Secretary for Mines gives notice that on the 2nd day of March, 1937, the Board of Trade made General Regulations under Section 86 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, amending the statutory requirements as to measures for the prevention of overwinding and as to the care and treatment of winding and haulage ropes and detaching gear at all mines to which that Act applies.

Numbers 1-4 of the Regulations, relate to the efficiency of automatic contrivances to prevent overwinding and of winding engine brakes, and come into force on the 1st day of January, 1938.

Numbers 5-18 of the Regulations amend the statutory provisions governing the use of winding ropes, cage chains and detaching gear and the method of capping of winding and haulage ropes, and require special records concerning such apparatus to be kept at the mine. These regulations come into force on the 1st day of April, 1937.

BERKS, BUCKS AND OXON JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT 1930: SECTION 3.

89,855. (15th March, 1937.)

Whereas by the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1930 (in this order referred to as "the principal order") as amended by the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee (Amendment) Order, 1931, the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March 1937 for the combination of the administrative counties of Berks, Buckingham and Oxford and the county boroughs of Oxford and Reading for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a joint committee named the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health in pursuance of the powers given to him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act 1930 and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This order may be cited as the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee (Continuance) Order 1937.

(2) The principal order amended as aforesaid and this order shall be construed as one and may be cited together as the Berks, Bucks and Oxon Joint Vagrancy Committee Orders 1930 to 1937.

2. The principal order amended as aforesaid shall continue in force until the 31st day of March 1938 unless sooner revoked or otherwise amended.

CHESHIRE JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

89229 (12th March, 1937.)

Whereas by the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee Order 1930, as amended by the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee Order, 1936, the Minister of Health made provision until the 31st day of March 1937 for the combination of the county of Chester and the county boroughs of Birkenhead, Chester, Stockport and Wallasey for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a Joint Committee named the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should, subject as hereinafter provided, be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order.

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the Cheshire Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1937, shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1937, and shall continue in operation for a period of seven years:

Provided that for the purposes of the election of members of the Joint Committee and proceedings relating thereto this order shall operate from such date earlier than the first day of April, 1937, as may be necessary.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them—

"the combined areas" means the county and county boroughs for the continued combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this Order;

"The Joint Committee" means the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee constituted under the Cheshire Joint (Casual Relief) Committee Order 1930 and renamed by this Order;

"council" means the council of a county or county borough included within the combined areas, and "councils" means the councils of the county and all the county boroughs so included;

"casual" means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief;

"casual ward" means any ward, building or premises set apart or provided for the reception, relief or employment of casuals; and

"the Minister" means the Minister of Health.

Combination of County and County Boroughs.

3. The county of Chester and the county boroughs of Birkenhead, Chester, Stockport and Wallasey shall continue to be combined for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals.

Joint Committee.

4.—(1) For the execution of the purposes aforesaid, the Joint Committee shall continue in existence as a body corporate having for the purposes of their constitution perpetual succession and a common seal and power to hold land for the purposes of their functions without licence in mortmain.

(2) The Joint Committee shall be renamed the Cheshire Joint Vagrancy Committee and shall consist of 17 members, each of whom shall be a member of the council by whom he is elected.

(3) Nine members of the Joint Committee shall be elected by the council of the county of Chester and two members shall be elected by each of the councils of the county boroughs of Birkenhead, Chester, Stockport and Wallasey.

Election of Members.

5.—(1) In each year at the first meeting of each council held after the last day of February at which ordinary business is transacted, the council shall elect from their own body the number of members of the Joint Committee assigned to them by this Order.

(2) Every member of the Joint Committee shall come into office in the year 1937 upon the first day of April and in each subsequent year upon his election.

(3) The clerk of each council shall forthwith after any election notify in writing to the clerk of the Joint Committee the name, address and description of each of the persons elected.

(4) A council may nominate from their own body a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee elected by the council at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member shall be unable to be present.

Period of Office.

6.—(1) Except as in this Article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor comes into office.

(2) A member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Joint Committee:

Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk of the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, whereupon a casual vacancy shall be deemed to have arisen, and the clerk of the Joint Committee shall forthwith notify the clerk of the council by whom the member was appointed of the vacancy.

(4) Any casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee arising more than one month before the ordinary date for the election of a new committee shall be filled as soon as practicable by the election by the council in

whose representation the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected.

Meetings and Proceedings.

7. The meetings and proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be conducted in accordance with the rules set forth in the Schedule to this Order.

Appointment of Executive Sub-Committee.

8.—(1) The Joint Committee may constitute an executive sub-committee and include among the members thereof persons who are not members of the Joint Committee:

Provided that:—

(i) of the persons who are not members of the Joint Committee at least one shall be a woman;

(ii) of the whole number of members of the executive sub-committee two-thirds at least shall be members of the Joint Committee.

(2) Any matter relating to the exercise by the Joint Committee of their functions under this Order, except the duty of making contribution orders on the councils or the power of borrowing money, may—

(a) be delegated to the executive sub-committee with or without any restrictions or conditions as the Joint Committee think fit, or

(b) be referred to the executive sub-committee, and if so referred, the Joint Committee before exercising any such functions shall, unless in their opinion the matter is urgent, receive and consider the report of the executive sub-committee with respect to the matter in question.

Powers and Duties of Joint Committee.

9.—(1) It shall be the duty of the Joint Committee from time to time to take into consideration and furnish the Minister with their recommendations in regard to the following matters:—

(a) the number and situation of the casual wards which should be provided by any council;

(b) the number of casuals for whom accommodation should be provided at any existing casual ward and at any casual ward proposed to be established in the combined areas;

(c) the closing of any casual ward in the combined areas.

(2) It shall also be the duty of the Joint Committee to take such steps, whether by public notice or otherwise, as shall be necessary with a view to the repression of begging and sleeping-out in the combined areas.

(3) The Joint Committee shall have power to repay to any council the whole or any part of any expenditure incurred by the council in—

(a) the provision of accommodation for casuals in accordance with any requirement of the Minister (including any necessary acquisition of sites);

(b) the maintenance of casual wards;

(c) the reception and relief of casuals;

(d) the transfer to an appropriate institution of any casual;

(e) the maintenance and care in such an institution of any casual so transferred;

- (f) the burial of any casual;
 (g) the maintenance, care and education of any casual, being a child in respect of whom the council have exercised the powers vested in them under section 52 of the Poor Law Act, 1930;
 (h) the removal of any casual to his place of settlement;
 (i) the provision and supply of mid-day meals for casuals;

Provided that before making any repayment of expenditure falling within either of the classes enumerated in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b) of this paragraph, the Joint Committee shall obtain the consent of a majority of the councils.

(4) Subject to the statutory provisions and orders and regulations for the time being in operation, the Joint Committee may make rules in regard to the administration of casual wards within the combined areas, and in particular to the following matters, namely—

- (i) times and methods of admission;
 (ii) searching;
 (iii) bathing, night clothing and bedding;
 (iv) smoking;
 (v) treatment of sick, aged and infirm casuals;
 (vi) treatment of female and child casuals;
 (vii) dietary;
 (viii) discharge and detention; and
 (ix) tasks;

and any rules so made shall be binding on the councils:

Provided that before making any such rules the Joint Committee shall notify the councils of their proposals relating thereto and shall give a reasonable opportunity to every council to make representation to the Joint Committee regarding the proposals.

(5) The Joint Committee shall also have power, with the approval of the Minister, to contribute by way of an annual subscription towards the support and maintenance of any institution which appears to the Joint Committee to be calculated to render useful aid in the administration of the relief of casuals:

Provided that whenever any annual contribution proposed to be made under this article exceeds the sum of £100 to any individual institution notice of the intention of the Joint Committee to make application to the Minister for his approval shall be given to the councils and if a majority of the councils object to the proposal no application shall be made to the Minister.

(6) Nothing in this Order shall affect the powers and duties conferred or imposed on any of the councils in their capacity as a poor law authority, or shall deprive or relieve any of the councils of their powers, duties and obligations with reference to the relief of casuals, except so far as any such powers, duties or obligations are being exercised, undertaken or discharged by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order.

Expenses of Members.

10.—(1) The Joint Committee may defray expenditure, including travelling expenses, necessarily incurred by members of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof for the purpose of attending meetings of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof.

(2) The Joint Committee may confer with other Joint Committees for all or any of the purposes of this Order, and may pay their reasonable share of the expenses of such conferences and may also defray any expenses necessarily incurred by their representatives in travelling to and from such conferences.

Contracts.

11. All contracts and agreements relating to the purposes of this Order shall be made by the Joint Committee, and shall be signed and sealed on their behalf by the presiding chairman and by one other member of the Joint Committee, and countersigned by the clerk to the Joint Committee.

Expenses of Joint Committee.

12.—(1) A fund shall be established to be called the Joint Fund, to which all moneys received by the Joint Committee shall be carried, and out of which all expenses incurred by the Joint Committee in the execution of this Order shall be defrayed.

(2) The sums to be paid on account of the maintenance of casuals in casual wards shall be calculated so far as possible in accordance with a uniform scale.

Apportionment of Expenses.

13.—(1) For the purpose of defraying the expenses incurred by the Joint Committee for the purposes of this order, each of the councils shall contribute to the Joint Fund in the proportion which the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in their area as shown in the valuation lists on the 1st day of April or the 1st day of October, as the case may be, immediately preceding the date of the order made on the council by the Joint Committee for contributions in respect of those expenses bears to the aggregate rateable value of all the hereditaments in the combined area as then shown in the valuation lists.

(2) The Joint Committee shall furnish to the councils not later than the 14th day of January in each year an estimate of their income and expenditure in respect of the ensuing year and if during any financial year the Joint Committee find it expedient to increase the amounts in the estimates then sanctioned by a majority of the councils, they shall furnish a supplementary estimate to the councils.

Contribution Orders.

14.—(1) The Joint Committee shall, as soon as may be after the 31st day of March and the 30th day of September in each year, make orders on each of the councils for the payment to the Joint Committee of such sums as may be required for the contributions of the council to the expenses of the Joint Committee.

(2) Every order for contributions shall direct that the contribution shall be paid in one sum or by instalments, as the Joint Committee may see fit, on the dates mentioned in the order.

(3) Any sum mentioned in any order for contributions shall be a debt due from the council to whom the order is addressed, and may be recovered accordingly: Provided that the Joint Committee shall not institute proceedings for the recovery of the debt until after the expiration of a period of three months from the date of the order.

Application of Statutes and Orders.

15.—(1) The statutory provisions and the orders and regulations of the Minister and his predecessors for the time being applicable to a council by reason of their being a poor law authority shall, so far as they are consistent with the provisions of this Order, apply to the Joint Committee as if the Joint Committee were a council of a county or county borough exercising poor law functions, and as if the combined areas were the area of such a council.

(2) The accounts of the income and expenditure of the Joint Committee and of their sub-committees and officers shall be made up and audited in like manner and subject to the same provisions as the accounts of a county council, and the enactments relating to the audit of those accounts and to all matters incidental thereto or consequential thereon (including the penal provisions of those enactments) shall apply and have effect as if they were herein re-enacted and in terms made applicable:

Provided that prior to audit a copy of the abstract of accounts shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils.

(3) The said accounts and all minute books of the Joint Committee and their sub-committees shall at all reasonable times be open to inspection and transcription without payment by any member of any of the councils or by any officer of any of the councils authorised by that council for that purpose.

(4) A copy of the auditor's report and of the abstract of the accounts of the Joint Committee, when duly audited, shall be sent by the Joint Committee to each of the councils within one month after the completion of the audit of the accounts of the Joint Committee.

(5) Nothing contained in this Article shall be deemed to confer on the Joint Committee any power of raising money by loan for the purposes of this Order.

Reports.

16. The Joint Committee shall furnish to any council such reports, returns and information as that council may from time to time require.

Settlement of Disputes.

17. In the event of any dispute arising in connection with the provisions of this Order between any of the councils and the Joint Committee, or between any two or more councils, the dispute may, on the application of any one or more of the parties affected, be referred to the Minister, who may, at his option, either decide the dispute himself or appoint some other person to decide it, and in the latter event, the provisions of the Arbitration Act, 1889, and of any enactment amending that Act shall apply as though the person appointed by the Minister were a single arbitrator appointed by consent of the parties.

Financial Adjustments.

18. Upon the expiration or sooner revocation of this Order, or upon any alteration of this Order by the Minister, the Joint Committee and the councils may make agreements for the purpose of adjusting any property, income, debts, liabilities and expenses (so far as affected by the expiration, revocation or alteration of this Order) of, and any financial relations

between, the parties to the agreement, and section 151 of the Local Government Act, 1933, shall apply as if this Order were an order made under Part VI of that Act.

SCHEDULE.

Rules as to Meetings and Proceedings.

1.—(1) The Joint Committee shall in every year hold an annual meeting and at least three other meetings for the transaction of general business which as near as may be shall be held at regular intervals.

(2) The first meeting held after the 31st day of March in any year shall be the annual meeting.

2. Subject to the provisions of this order, the Joint Committee may make standing orders for the regulation of their proceedings and business and may vary or revoke any such orders.

3. No business shall be transacted at a meeting of the Joint Committee unless at least five members are present thereat.

4.—(1) The Joint Committee shall at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be chairman, and the chairman shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until his successor is appointed.

(2) The Joint Committee may at their annual meeting appoint one of their number to be vice-chairman who shall, unless he resigns his office or ceases to be a member of the Joint Committee, continue in office until immediately after the election of the chairman at the next annual meeting.

5.—(1) At a meeting of the Joint Committee the chairman, if present, shall preside.

(2) If the chairman is absent from a meeting of the Joint Committee the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside.

(3) If both the chairman and vice-chairman of the Joint Committee are absent, such member of the Joint Committee as the members present shall choose shall preside.

6.—(1) Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question.

(2) In the case of an equality of votes, the person presiding at the meeting shall have a second or a casting vote.

7.—(1) Minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be drawn up and entered in a book kept for the purpose, and shall be signed at the same or next ensuing meeting of the Joint Committee by the person presiding thereat, and any minute purporting to be so signed shall be received in evidence without further proof.

(2) Until the contrary is proved, a meeting of the Joint Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been so made and signed shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have been duly qualified.

8. The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member thereof.

9. A copy of the minutes of proceedings at each meeting of the Joint Committee shall be sent to the clerks of the councils within 14 days after the date of the meeting.

THE NORTH WALES JOINT VAGRANCY COMMITTEE.

POOR LAW ACT, 1930: SECTION 3.

89,191. (12th March, 1937.)

Whereas by the North Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1930 as amended by the North Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee Order 1936 the Minister of Health made provision until the 1st day of April 1937 for the combination of the counties of Anglesey, Caernarvon, Denbigh, Flint, Merioneth and Montgomery for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals by a Joint Committee named the North Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee;

And whereas it is expedient that such provision as aforesaid should, subject as hereinafter provided, be continued:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by section 3 of the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following order.

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as the North Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1937, shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1937, and shall continue in operation for a period of seven years:

Provided that for the purposes of the election of members of the Joint Committee and proceedings relating thereto this Order shall operate from such date earlier than the first day of April, 1937, as may be necessary.

Interpretation.

2.—(1) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them—

“the combined areas,” means the counties for the continued combination of which for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals provision is made by this Order;

“the Joint Committee” means the North Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee constituted under the North Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee Order, 1930;

“council” means the council of a county included within the combined areas, and “councils” means the councils of all the counties so included;

“casual” means any destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor

relief, and includes any person admitted into any establishment by a council or otherwise under the care of a council by way of poor relief who was, immediately before the date when he was so admitted or came under such care, a destitute wayfarer or wanderer applying for or receiving poor relief;

“casual ward” means any ward, building or premises set apart or provided for the reception, relief or employment of casuals; and

“the Minister” means the Minister of Health.

Combination of Counties.

3. The counties of Anglesey, Caernarvon, Denbigh, Flint, Merioneth and Montgomery shall continue to be combined for the purpose of the better administration of the relief of casuals.

Joint Committee.

4.—(1) For the execution of the purposes aforesaid, the North Wales Joint Vagrancy Committee shall continue in existence as a body corporate having for the purposes of their constitution perpetual succession and a common seal and shall have power to hold land for the purposes of their functions without licence in mortmain.

(2) The Joint Committee shall consist of 24 members, each of whom shall be a member of the council by whom he is elected.

(3) Three members of the Joint Committee shall be elected by the council of the county of Anglesey, five by the council of the county of Caernarvon, six by the council of the county of Denbigh, four by the council of the county of Flint, three by the council of the county of Merioneth and three by the council of the county of Montgomery.

Election of Members.

5.—(1) In each year at the first meeting of each council held after the first day of February at which ordinary business is transacted, the council shall elect from their own body the number of members of the Joint Committee assigned to them by this Order, and the members so elected shall come into office upon the first day of April.

(2) The clerk of each council shall forthwith after any election notify in writing to the clerk of the Joint Committee the name, address and description of each of the persons elected.

(3) A council may nominate from their own body a person to act on behalf of a member of the Joint Committee elected by the council at any meeting of the Joint Committee at which that member shall be unable to be present.

Period of Office.

6.—(1) Except as in this Article otherwise provided, a member of the Joint Committee shall hold office until the date on which his successor comes into office.

(2) A member of the Joint Committee who ceases to be a member of the council by whom he was elected shall thereupon cease to be a member of the Joint Committee:

Provided that a member of the Joint Committee shall not be deemed to have ceased to be a member of the council by whom he was elected if on or before the day on which he goes out of office he has been re-elected a member of the council.

(3) A member of the Joint Committee may resign his membership by sending to the clerk of the Joint Committee notice in writing of his desire to do so, whereupon a casual vacancy shall be deemed to have arisen, and the clerk of the Joint Committee shall forthwith notify the clerk of the council by whom the member was appointed of the vacancy.

(4) Any casual vacancy in the membership of the Joint Committee arising more than three months before the ordinary date for the election of a new committee shall be filled by the election by the council of the area in respect of which the vacancy arises of a new member, and the person so elected shall hold office during the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is elected.

5.—(1) At a meeting of the Joint Committee the chairman, if present, shall preside.

(2) If the chairman is absent from a meeting of the Joint Committee the vice-chairman, if present, shall preside.

(3) If both the chairman and vice-chairman of the Joint Committee are absent, such member of the Joint Committee as the members present shall choose shall preside.

6.—(1) Every question at a meeting shall be decided by a majority of votes of the members present and voting on that question.

(2) In the case of an equality of votes, the person presiding at the meeting shall have a second or a casting vote.

7.—(1) Minutes of the proceedings of the Joint Committee shall be drawn up and entered in a book kept for the purpose, and shall be signed at the same or next ensuing meeting of the Joint Committee by the person presiding thereat, and any minute purporting to be so signed shall be received in evidence without further proof.

(2) Until the contrary is proved, a meeting of the Joint Committee in respect of the proceedings whereof a minute has been so made and signed shall be deemed to have been duly convened and held, and all the members present at the meeting shall be deemed to have been duly qualified.

8. The proceedings of the Joint Committee shall not be invalidated by any vacancy among their number or by any defect in the election or qualification of any member thereof.

9. The clerk or any authorised officer of a council may attend the meeting of the Joint Committee or any sub-committee thereof and may speak but not vote thereat.

6. The functions under the Registration Acts in relation to any parish specified in items 4 and 5 in the first column of the Schedule hereto are hereby transferred to the council of the county specified in the second column of the said Schedule.
