A PROCLAMATION

GIVING CURRENCY TO A NEW THREEPENNY PIECE OF MIXED METAL AND DETERMINING NEW DESIGNS FOR GOLD, SILVER AND BRONZE COINS.

GEORGE R.I.

Whereas under section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, We have power with the advice of Our Privy Council, by proclamation to direct that any coins other than gold, silver or bronze, shall be current and be a legal tender for the payment of any amount not exceeding five shillings and also from time to time to determine the design for any coin:

And whereas it appears to Us desirable to order that in addition to the silver piece a new piece of mixed metal, that is to say, an admixture of copper, nickel and zinc, shall be coined of the value of three pence and to determine new designs for the gold, silver and bronze coins mentioned in the First Schedule to the Coinage Act, 1870:

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said enactment and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct, and ordain as follows:—

1.—(1) A new piece of mixed metal of the value of threepence shall be coined of a standard weight of 105 grains, equivalent to a metric weight of 6.804 grams; the remedy allowance on the piece shall be a weight not exceeding the weight of one piece in every fifty pieces.

(2) A tender of payment of money, if made in threepences of mixed metal issued in accordance with this Proclamation, shall be legal tender for the payment of an amount not exceeding two shillings.

2. The designs for the said gold, silver and bronze coins, and for the new piece of mixed metal shall be as follows:—

GOLD COINS.

(1) *Five-Pound Piece*.—Every five-pound piece shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIVS VI D:G:BR:OMN:REX F:D:IND:IMP." and for the reverse the image of Saint George

armed, sitting on horseback, attacking the dragon with a sword, and a broken spear upon the ground, and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(2) *Two-Pound Piece*.—Every two-pound piece shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(3) *Sovereign*.—Every sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(4) *Half-sovereign*.—Every half-sovereign shall have the same obverse and reverse impression and inscription in all respects as the five-pound piece. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

#### SILVER COINS.

(1) *Crown*.—Every Crown shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D:G:BR:OMN:REX", and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a shield surmounted by the Royal Crown: with Supporters both standing on a mount with the Royal Motto "DIEU ET MON DROIT" and the inscription "FID:DEF:IND:IMP." together with the word "CROWN" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(2) *Half-Crown*.—Every half-crown shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the Crown, and for the reverse the Ensigns Armorial of the United Kingdom contained in a Shield having on each side the initial letter of Our Name in duplicate and interlaced surmounted by the Royal Crown, with the inscription "FID:DEF:IND:IMP." together with the words "HALF CROWN", and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(3) *Florin*.—Every florin shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the Crown, and for the reverse a Rose, Thistle and Shamrock surmounted by a Crown; and the letters "G" and "R" below; with the inscription "FID:DEF:IND:IMP." together with the words "TWO SHILLINGS" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(4) *Shilling*.—Every shilling shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the Crown, and for the reverse either

(a) Our Royal Crest of England  
or

(b) Our Royal Crest of Scotland, with the inscription "FID:DEF:IND:IMP." together with the words "ONE SHILLING" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(5) *Sixpence*.—Every sixpence shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the Crown, and for the reverse the letters "GRI" surmounted by a Crown, with the inscription "FID:DEF:IND:IMP." together with the word "SIXPENCE" and

the date of the year. The Coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

(6) *Threepence*.—Every silver threepence, not being a coin of the King's Maundy monies, shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the Crown and for the reverse the Shield of St. George superimposed upon a Tudor Rose, with the inscription "FID:DEF:IND:IMP.", together with the words "THREE PENCE" and the date of the year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

(7) *The King's Maundy Monies*.—Every Maundy silver fourpence, threepence, twopence and penny shall have for the obverse impression Our aforesaid effigy, with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D:G:BR:OMN:REX F:D:IND:IMP." and for the reverse the respective figures "4", "3", "2", "1" (according to the denomination or value of the piece), in the centre, with the date of the year placed across the figure, and encircled with an oak wreath surmounted by the Royal Crown. The Coins shall have a plain edge.

#### COIN OF MIXED METAL.

*Threepence*.—Every threepence of mixed metal, shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D:G:BR:OMN:REX F:D:IND:IMP." and for the reverse impression a representation of the Plant commonly known as "Thrift", together with the words "THREE PENCE" and the date of the year. The coin shall have an edge having twelve sides.

#### BRONZE COINS.

(1) *Penny*.—Every penny shall have for the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "GEORGIUS VI D:G:BR:OMN:REX F:D:IND:IMP." and for the reverse impression the figure of Britannia seated on a rock surrounded by the sea, her right hand holding a shield which rests against the rock, while in her left hand she grasps a trident, with a Lighthouse in the distance; and the words "ONE PENNY", with the date of the year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

(2) *Half-penny*.—Every half-penny shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a sailing ship, and the words "HALF PENNY" with the date of the year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

(3) *Farthing*.—Every farthing shall have the same obverse impression and inscription as the penny, and for the reverse the representation of a Wren, and the word "FARTHING" with the date of the year. The Coin shall have a plain edge.

This Proclamation shall come into force on this day.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace this Eighteenth day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, and in the First year of Our Reign.

(being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

#### ROAD AND RAIL TRAFFIC ACT, 1933.
