The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 9th day of February, 1937, (C.W. 1049/36) in the words following, viz.:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 26th day of April, 1920, Engineer Captains of less than three years' seniority, required to serve afloat, and who are actually accommodated afloat, and therefore not in receipt of Lodging and Provision Allowances, receive an allowance of 4s. a day in addition to full pay:

“And whereas by Order in Council bearing date the 29th day of March, 1935, Paymaster Captains of less than three years' seniority, holding appointments as Fleet Accountant Officers, Home and Mediterranean Fleets, and

actually accommodated afloat, and therefore not in receipt of Lodging and Provision Allowances, receive an allowance of 4s. a day in addition to full pay:

“And whereas we consider that Engineer Captains or Captains (E) employed as Fleet Engineer Officers, and Paymaster Captains employed as Fleet Accountant Officers should receive additional remuneration on account of the increased responsibilities and expenses attaching to their position:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction, with effect from the 20th January, 1937, an allowance of 8s. a day to Engineer Captains or Captains (E), and Paymaster Captains employed as Fleet Engineer and Accountant Officers respectively, irrespective of seniority, such allowance to be inclusive of the allowance of 4s. a day sanctioned by Orders in Council dated 26th April, 1920, and 29th March, 1935, for Engineer Captains and Paymaster Captains, with less than three years' seniority.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and forty-six of the Public Health Act, 1936, the Acts mentioned in the Third Schedule to that Act were repealed to the extent specified in the third column of that Schedule:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said section it was provided that if any enactments or words mentioned in the said Third Schedule were wholly or partly re-enacted in a Consolidation Act of the then present session of Parliament, the references in the said Schedule to those enactments or words should be construed as including references to such enactments or words in the Consolidation Act as His Majesty in Council might declare to be corresponding enactments or words, and that accordingly any enactments and words to which such declaration extended should also be repealed by the said section:

And whereas certain enactments and words mentioned in the said Third Schedule, being the enactments and words mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order were wholly or partly re-enacted by the Public Health (London) Act, 1936, which is a Consolidation Act passed in the same session of Parliament as the Public Health Act, 1936:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in the exercise of the power conferred upon Him by the said section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Public Health (London) (Repealed Enactments) Order, 1937, and shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1937.

2. It is hereby declared that the enactments and words specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Order are enactments and words corresponding to the enactments or words in the first column of the said Schedule and are accordingly repealed by section three hundred and forty-six of the Public Health Act, 1936.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme bearing date the 14th day of January, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Blackborough and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Sheldon, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Devon and in the Diocese of Exeter:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend William Bishop of Exeter, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Blackborough and Sheldon duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Exeter and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Exeter signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Sheldon is now full the Reverend Edward Evans being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Blackborough is at present vacant:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the Right Reverend Charles now Bishop of Exeter, and of the said Edward Evans (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme) do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Blackborough and the said Benefice of Sheldon shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Blackborough with Sheldon' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Cullompton but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the

union shall forthwith take effect and the said Edward Evans if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheldon shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Sheldon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Blackborough having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Sheldon having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Exeter has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty by and with the advice of His said Council is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and

further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measure.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Exeter.

The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 12th day of March, 1937, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge, made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923" (13 & 14 George V, Chapter 33), which amending Statutes are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, The Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance

of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:

STATUTE A

CHAPTER II

THE SENATE

By amending clause (d) of Section 3 so as to read as follows:

(d) Doctors of Philosophy, Masters of Letters, and Masters of Science, if they are University officers, but otherwise not until six years have elapsed since the beginning of their first term kept by residence, and two years have elapsed since their admission to the degree; except that in the case of a person who has been admitted to the degree by incorporation those intervals shall be reckoned respectively from the beginning of his first term kept by residence in the University of Oxford or in the University of Dublin (Trinity College) as the case may be, and from his admission to the degree in virtue of which he was admitted to his degree in the University of Cambridge:

CHAPTER IV

THE COUNCIL OF THE SENATE

By substituting for the last sentence of Section 3 the following sentence:

Change of Membership (except when there is a casual vacancy) shall take effect at the end of the calendar year.

STATUTE B

CHAPTER III

DEGREES

By substituting in Section 6 the words "to some office in the University, or to a Fellowship or some office in a College" for the words "to some office in the University or a College".

CHAPTER IV

TITLES OF DEGREES

By substituting in Section 4 the words "to some office in the University, or to a Fellowship or some office in Girton College or in Newnham College" for the words "to some office in the University or in Girton College or in Newnham College".

STATUTE D

CHAPTER XIV

ELECTIONS TO PROFESSORSHIPS

By substituting the words "the ninth day of November" for the words "the twentieth day of February" in Section 5.

STATUTE E

CHAPTER I

GENERAL PROVISIONS

By inserting the following section, the present Section 8 being renumbered 9:

8. Notwithstanding the provisions of any instrument of foundation governing a particular trust, when the income of a trust fund

is more than sufficient for the effective maintenance of a lectureship, scholarship, prize or other emolument charged upon the fund, the University shall have power to apply part of the income of the fund to the maintenance of additional emoluments of the same character, or otherwise in consonance with the original purpose of the endowment: provided that no such application shall be made during the life of the founder of the trust without his consent, and that if the trust is less than sixty years old, and has a trustee or governing body other than the University, no such application shall be made without the consent of such trustee or governing body.

STATUTE T

TEMPORARY PROVISIONS

By adding the following sections:

21. Notwithstanding Statute A Chapter IV Section 3, a member of the Council who was elected before the approval of this section shall remain a member until the end of the calendar year in which he was due to retire.

22. Notwithstanding Statute D Chapter XIV Section 5, an Elector to a Professorship who was appointed before the approval of this section shall remain an Elector until the ninth day of November in the year in which he was due to retire.
