

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 18th day of *March*, 1937.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by section three hundred and forty-six of the Public Health Act, 1936, the Acts mentioned in the Third Schedule to that Act were repealed to the extent specified in the third column of that Schedule:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of the said section it was provided that if any enactments or words mentioned in the said Third Schedule were wholly or partly re-enacted in a Consolidation Act of the then present session of Parliament, the references in the said Schedule to those enactments or words should be construed as including references to such enactments or words in the Consolidation Act as His Majesty in Council might declare to be corresponding enactments or words, and that accordingly any enactments and words to which such declaration extended should also be repealed by the said section:

And whereas certain enactments and words mentioned in the said Third Schedule, being the enactments and words mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order were wholly or partly re-enacted by the Public Health (London) Act, 1936, which is a Consolidation Act passed in the same session of Parliament as the Public Health Act, 1936:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in the exercise of the power conferred upon Him by the said section and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Public Health (London) (Repealed Enactments) Order, 1937, and shall come into operation on the first day of October, 1937.

2. It is hereby declared that the enactments and words specified in the second column of the Schedule to this Order are enactments and words corresponding to the enactments or words in the first column of the said Schedule and are accordingly repealed by section three hundred and forty-six of the Public Health Act, 1936.
