PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 25th day of February, 1937, (C.W. 1492/37), in the words following, viz. :—

“ Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“ And whereas the growing requirements of Your Majesty's Fleet necessitate an increase in the list of Paymaster Lieutenants, Royal Navy:

“ And whereas we are of opinion that Accountant Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve should be entered in the Royal Navy:

“ We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the entry of such Officers under the conditions and with

the pay set forth in the Schedules annexed hereto.

“ The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

“ SCHEDULE I.

“ 1. *Qualification for transfer.*

Candidates must be on the Active List of the Royal Naval Reserve or Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve in the rank of Paymaster Lieutenant or Paymaster Sub-Lieutenant, and must also have attained the age of 24 and be less than 30 years of age.

“ 2. *Rank, seniority and probationary period.*

All officers will be transferred with the rank of Probationary Paymaster Lieutenant, R.N. They will be required to serve for a period of six months in that rank. If recommended at the termination of this period they will be eligible for permanent transfer with the rank of Paymaster Lieutenant, R.N. and will be given their first increment of pay two years from the date of original transfer, their seniority being adjusted accordingly.

“ 3. *Conditions of Service.*

After transfer to the general list of Accountant Officers, Royal Navy, officers to be subject to the Regulations in force for such general list officers, except as provided in Schedule III.

" SCHEDULE III.

" Retirement.

" Officers transferred from the Royal Naval Reserve and Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve unless promoted to Paymaster Commander, to be retired at the age of 45 years. They will, however, be eligible to retire voluntarily at Admiralty discretion, between the ages of 40 and 45 years.

" 2. The rates of Retired Pay or Gratuity for officers below the rank of Paymaster Commander to be as follows:

(i) *Officers retiring between the ages of 40 and 45.*

Retired Pay at the rate of £250 a year with additions or deductions of £12 a year for each full year in excess or short of 15 years' service in the Royal Navy.

(ii) *Officers invalided on account of disabilities not attributable to the service.*

(a) Officers with less than 5 years' service in the Royal Navy to receive a gratuity of £125 for each complete year of service.

(b) Officers with 5 years' service and over to receive retired pay at the following rates, or (if they are over 40 years of age), as at (i) above, whichever is greater:—

£136 a year for 5 years' service with an addition of £9 a year for each additional year of service.

(iii) *Officers invalided on account of disability attributable to the service.*

(a) Officers with less than 5 years' service in the Royal Navy to receive retired pay on the following scale while the attributable disability lasts:—

(b) Officers with 5 years' service and over, will receive retired pay as at (ii) (b) with an addition, while the attributable disability lasts upon the following scale:—

(iv) Officers discharged for misconduct or otherwise deemed by the Admiralty to be unworthy of further employment, may be granted retired pay or retiring gratuities at reduced rates, at Admiralty discretion.

" 3. Pensions for Widows and Compassionate Allowances for Children to be at the same rates and under the same conditions as those for officers on the general list of the Royal Navy."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Roads Act, 1920, His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council was pleased to make an Order dated the 7th day of February, 1921, providing for, amongst other things, the manner in which repayments in connection with the duties mentioned in Section 1 of the said Act should be made and the manner in which penalties and forfeitures recovered under or in pursuance of the said Act should be paid into the Exchequer:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order") should be amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

1.—(1) For Paragraph (4) of Article 3 of the Principal Order there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(4) The Minister may from time to time advance to any County Council such sums as he considers necessary to enable the County Council to make repayments in connection with the said duties under this Article and any County Council which makes any such repayment shall, if no such advance or no sufficient advance has been made, be entitled to be reimbursed by the Minister the sums properly expended by the Council in respect of the repayment.”

(2) In Paragraph (2) of Article 4 of the Principal Order the word “only” shall be omitted, for the words “certify as being required” there shall be substituted the word “require”, for the words “the reimbursement” there shall be substituted the words “making advances or reimbursements”, and the words “of the amounts paid by them” shall be omitted.

2.—(1) In Paragraph (1) of the said Article 4 the words “whether in composition for any penalty or forfeiture or otherwise” shall be omitted.

(2) Paragraph (4) of the said Article 4 shall be omitted.

(3) For Paragraph (5) of the said Article 4 there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(4) At such times in each year as the Treasury and the Minister may direct the Bank of England shall transfer to the Exchequer Account the amount standing to the credit of the Motor Tax Account in excess of such minimum balance as the Treasury may from time to time determine, fractions of £1,000 in the amount so transferable being for this purpose neglected and carried forward in the Motor Tax Account.”

(4) The provisions of this Article shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1937.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) (Amendment) Order, 1937, and the Principal Order and this Order may be cited together as the Road Vehicles (Registration and Licensing) Orders, 1921 and 1937.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance and other lawful means His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the territories known as the Protectorate of Aden:

And whereas it is expedient to make provision for the peace, order, and good government of the Protectorate of Aden:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Aden Protectorate Order, 1937.

2. This Order shall apply to the territories of Arabia which are bounded on the south by the Colony of Aden and the Gulf of Aden, on the west and north by the Kingdom of the Yemen and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, and on the east by the Sultanate of Oman, and also to the Islands of Socotra and Abdul Quri and any other islands adjacent to the said territories.

3.—(1) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires—

“His Majesty” includes His Majesty's heirs and successors;

“the Secretary of State” means one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State;

“the Governor” includes every person for the time being administering the Government of the Colony of Aden;

“the Colony” means the Colony of Aden;

“the Protectorate” means the territories described in section 2 of this Order;

“the appointed day” means the first day of April nineteen hundred and thirty-seven;

“the Gazette” means the Gazette of the Protectorate;

“native of the Protectorate” means any person who is a member or either of whose parents is or was a member of a tribe or community indigenous to the Protectorate.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

4. The Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Colony shall be the Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the Protectorate, and he is hereby empowered and commanded to exercise on His Majesty's behalf all such powers and jurisdiction as His Majesty now has, or may from time to time have, therein, and to that end to take or cause to be taken all such measures and to do or cause to be done all such things therein as in the interest of His Majesty's service he may think expedient.

5. The Governor is hereby empowered and commanded to do all things that belong to his said office in accordance with such Commission as may be issued to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet, such Instructions as may from time to time be addressed to him under His Majesty's Sign Manual and Signet or through the Secretary of State, and such Orders in Council and other laws as may from time to time be in force in the Protectorate.

6. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His heirs and successors power, with the advice of His or their Privy Council, from time to time, to make laws for the peace, order and good government of the Protectorate.

7.—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Order, all Acts, Orders, Rules, Regulations and other enactments having the force of law in the Protectorate on the appointed day shall, except so far as the same shall, in their application to the Protectorate, thereafter be re-

pealed, amended or otherwise affected by or under any subsequent order, rule or other law, continue to have effect in the Protectorate, but shall be construed subject to such modifications as may be necessary to bring them into conformity with the provisions of this Order and of the Aden Colony Order, 1936.

(2) Without prejudice to any powers otherwise vested in him, the Governor is hereby empowered to make rules and orders for the following purposes:—

(a) to modify the provisions of any Order of His Majesty in Council in force in the Protectorate on the appointed day, in order to bring such provisions into conformity with the provisions of this Order and of the Aden Colony Order, 1936;

(b) to amend, add to, or repeal any other enactment to which subsection (1) of this section applies;

(c) to apply in whole or in part, with such modifications (if any) as to him may seem necessary or expedient, any Act, Order, Rule, Regulation or other enactment from time to time in force in the Colony, to persons in the Protectorate not being natives of the Protectorate;

(d) to regulate or prohibit the entry into the Protectorate of persons not being natives of the Protectorate; and

(e) to secure the enforcement within the Protectorate of judgments, orders and decrees of the Courts of the Colony.

(3) For the avoidance of doubts it is hereby declared that all Rules and Orders made before the appointed day by the Governor-General of India in Council under the Indian (Foreign Jurisdiction) Order in Council, 1902, have, in so far as at any time before the date of this Order they applied to the Protectorate and have not in such application been expressly repealed or revoked, continued in force in the Protectorate notwithstanding that the Protectorate has ceased to be a territory in which jurisdiction is exercised by or on behalf of His Majesty through the Governor-General of India in Council or some authority subordinate to him, and subsection (1) of this section shall apply accordingly to such Rules and Orders.

8. It shall be lawful for His Majesty to disallow any rule or order made by the Governor in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by this Order or any other Order of His Majesty in Council and to signify such disallowance through the Secretary of State. Every rule or order so disallowed shall cease to have effect from the time when the significance of such disallowance shall be published by the Governor by notice in the Gazette, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done or suffered thereunder.

9. The Supreme Court of the Colony and all Courts of the Colony inferior to the Supreme Court shall, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of any law in that behalf from time to time in force in the Colony, have jurisdiction in all matters arising in the Protectorate in which any person not being a native of the Protectorate is concerned, in the same manner and to the same extent as if such matters had arisen in the Colony.

10. In the event of the Governor having occasion at any time to be absent for a short period from the seat of Government, or in the exercise or discharge of any powers or duties conferred or imposed upon him by virtue of his office to visit any neighbouring territories, he may by an Instrument under the Public Seal appoint any person to be his Deputy within the Protectorate or any part thereof during such temporary absence, and in that capacity to exercise, perform and execute for and on behalf of the Governor during such absence, but no longer, all such powers and authorities vested in the Governor as shall in and by such Instrument be specified and limited, but no others.

Every such Deputy shall conform to and observe all such instructions as the Governor shall from time to time address to him for his guidance. The power and authority of the Governor shall not by the appointment of a Deputy as aforesaid be abridged, altered or in any way affected otherwise than His Majesty may at any time hereafter think proper to direct.

11. The Governor may constitute and appoint all such necessary officers as may be lawfully constituted or appointed by His Majesty, all of whom, unless otherwise provided by law, shall hold their offices during His Majesty's pleasure.

12. When any offence has been committed for which the offender may be tried by any of His Majesty's courts having jurisdiction within the Protectorate, the Governor may, as he shall see occasion, in His Majesty's name and on His Majesty's behalf, grant a pardon to any accomplice in such offence who shall give such information as shall lead to the conviction of the principal offender or of any one of such offenders if more than one; and further may grant to any offender convicted in any such court a pardon, either free or subject to lawful conditions, or any remission of the sentence passed on such offender, or any respite of the execution of such sentence, for such period as the Governor thinks fit, and may remit any penalties or forfeitures due to His Majesty.

13. The Governor may, subject to the provisions of any law for the time being in force in the Protectorate and to such instructions as may from time to time be given to him by His Majesty through the Secretary of State, upon sufficient cause to him appearing, dismiss or suspend from the exercise of his office any person holding any public office under the Crown in the Protectorate, or, subject as aforesaid, may take such other disciplinary action as may seem to him desirable.

14. The Seal now or hereafter in use as the Public Seal of the Colony shall be also the Public Seal of the Protectorate and shall be used for sealing all things whatsoever that shall pass the said Seal.

15. Nothing in this Order shall affect the validity or future operation of any lawful act done by any authority in the Protectorate before the appointed day.

16. His Majesty may from time to time revoke, add to or amend this Order.

17. This Order shall come into operation on the appointed day.

WHEREAS by Section six of the Merchant Shipping (International Labour Conventions) Act, 1925 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted among other things that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the provisions of the Act shall, subject to such modifications and adaptations, to be specified in the Order, as appear to His Majesty necessary or expedient in the circumstances of the case, apply to ships registered in any British possession outside the United Kingdom, other than the Dominions mentioned in the Second Schedule to the Act, as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

And whereas it is expedient that the provisions of the Act should, subject to the modifications and adaptations specified in this Order, apply to ships registered in Ceylon in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and it is hereby directed, as follows:—

1. The provisions of the Act shall apply to British ships registered in Ceylon in like manner as they apply to ships registered in the United Kingdom subject to the following modifications and adaptations, that is to say:—

(1) In subsection (1) of Section 1 of the Act the words from "be entitled, in respect of each day" to the end of the subsection shall be omitted and the following words shall be substituted therefor:—

"be entitled to receive from the master or owner of the ship wages at the rate at which he was entitled to receive wages at the date of the termination of his service, until he is returned to a proper return port under the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1932, or has in any other way reached his port of departure from Ceylon or a port in the country to which he belongs."

(2) Subsection (2) of Section 1 of the Act shall be omitted and the following subsection shall be substituted therefor:—

"(2) A seaman shall not be entitled to receive wages under this section in respect of any period during which he negligently failed to apply to any proper authority within the meaning of the aforesaid Merchant Shipping Acts for relief as a distressed seaman, or during which he was or could have been suitably employed."

(3) In paragraph (a) of the proviso to subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Act, for the expressions "the Board of Trade" and

"officers of the Board" there shall be respectively substituted the expressions "the Governor" and "officers authorized for such purpose by the Governor".

(4) In subsection (1) of Section 4 of the Act, for the expressions "forty shillings" and "five pounds", there shall be respectively substituted the expressions "twenty rupees" and "fifty rupees".

(5) In subsection (2) of Section 4 of the Act, for the words "an officer of the Board of Trade or any other person", there shall be substituted the words "an officer authorized for such purpose by the Governor or any person", and for the expression "twenty pounds" there shall be substituted the expression "two hundred rupees".

(6) The first paragraph of Section 5 of the Act shall be amended by the substitution for the words "is under" of the words "is, in the opinion of the court by which any case in relation to such person is tried, under".

(7) The second paragraph of Section 5 of the Act shall be omitted, and the following paragraph shall be substituted therefor:—

"The expression 'ship' means any sea-going ship or boat of any description which is registered in Ceylon as a British ship, but does not include any tug, dredger, sludge vessel, barge, or other craft whose ordinary course of navigation does not extend beyond the seaward limits of the jurisdiction of the harbour authority of the port at which such vessel is regularly employed, if and so long as such vessel is engaged in her ordinary occupation."

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (International Labour Conventions) (Ceylon) Order, 1937.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1935 (33 & 34 Vict. c. 52; 36 & 37 Vict. c. 60; 58 & 59 Vict. c. 33; 6 Edw. 7. c. 15; 22 & 23 Geo. 5. c. 39; 25 & 26 Geo. 5. c. 25), it was amongst other things enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas under the provisions of Article 18 of the Treaty signed on the 2nd day of May, 1932, between His late Majesty King George V and His Majesty the King of Iraq for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, the

terms whereof were recited in the Iraq (Extradition) Order in Council, 1933, His Majesty has acceded to the said Treaty in respect of India:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 5th day of April, 1937, the said Acts shall apply in respect of India in the case of Iraq under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 2nd May, 1932.

This Order may be cited as the "Iraq (Extradition: India) Order in Council, 1937".

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Colonial Boundaries Act, 1895, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

From and after the proclamation of this Order by publication in the Western Pacific High Commission Gazette the Boundaries of the Gilbert and Ellice Islands Colony shall be extended so as to include—

Birnie Island (Lat. 3° 35' S., Long. 171° 33' W.),
Canton Island (Lat. 2° 49' S., Long. 171° 43' W.),
Enderbury Island (Lat. 3° 07' S., Long. 171° 03' W.),
Gardner Island (Lat. 4° 40' S., Long. 174° 31' W.),
Hull Island (Lat. 4° 30' S., Long. 172° 13' W.),
McKean Island (Lat. 3° 35' S., Long. 174° 04' W.),
Phoenix Island (Lat. 3° 42' S., Long. 170° 43' W.), and
Sydney Island (Lat. 4° 27' S., Long. 171° 15' W.).

And whereas it is expedient to amend paragraph (g) of Article 3 (i) of the Principal Order as amended as aforesaid:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the Fugitive Offenders Acts, 1881 and 1915, and otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Order in Council, 1937", and shall be read and construed as one with the Principal Order and the Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Order in Council, 1917, and shall come into force as from the date hereof.

2. Article 3 (i) of the Principal Order as amended by the Straits Settlements and Protected States Fugitive Offenders Order in Council, 1917, is hereby further amended by the substitution of the following paragraph for paragraph (g) thereof:—

"(g) As regards Trengganu, of British Adviser."

And the Right Honourable William Ormsby-Gore, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly

lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington, the New Parish of Cornforth, and the New Parish of Coxhoe, all in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 31st day of March, 1865, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the following month, certain portions of the Parish of Kelloe and of the Parish of Bishop Middleham both in the said County and Diocese were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and such District was named 'The District of Cassop-cum-Quarrington':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council also bearing date the 31st day of March, 1865, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the following month, certain other portions of the said Parish of Kelloe and of the said Parish of Bishop Middleham were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and such District was named 'The District of Cornforth':

"And whereas by the authority of another Order of Her said late Majesty in Council also bearing date the 31st day of March, 1865, and published in the London Gazette on the 4th day of the following month, certain other portions of the said Parish of Kelloe and of the said Parish of Bishop Middleham, were constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and such District was named 'The District of Coxhoe':

"And whereas the said District of Cassop-cum-Quarrington, the said District of Cornforth, and the said District of Coxhoe have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington, the said New Parish of Cornforth, and the said New Parish of Coxhoe, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the boundaries of the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington, of the said New Parish of Cornforth, and of the said New Parish of Coxhoe, shall be altered so that (first) all those portions of the said New Parish of Cornforth, of the said New Parish of Coxhoe, and of the said Parish of Kelloe, which are described in the First Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New

Parishes and Parish respectively and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington; (secondly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Cornforth and of the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington which are described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parishes and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Coxhoe; and (thirdly) all those portions of the said New Parish of Coxhoe which are described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the said map or plan hereunto annexed and are thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be restored to and shall in future form part of the said Parish of Kelloe.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The First Schedule.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, comprising:—

"I. All that portion of the New Parish of Cornforth, in the said County and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north-east partly by the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington and partly by the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Whitwell House, upon the north-west by the Parish of Shincliffe, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Shincliffe from the said New Parish of Cornforth crosses the middle of the Newcastle, Leamside and Ferryhill Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence southward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 64 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the footpath leading towards Crow Trees, and extending thence first eastward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 26½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the western side of the road leading from Crow Trees to Tursdale Colliery, and extending thence first eastward to and then southward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of the footpath leading to Cornforth Lane Junction, and extending thence first eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath which leads to Cornforth Moor past the south-western side of the close numbered 321 upon the Ordnance Survey Map

of the Civil Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington published in the year 1919 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-western end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the said close numbered 321, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Cornforth from the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington.

" II. And also all those contiguous portions of the New Parish of Coxhoe and of the Parish of Kelloe both in the said County and Diocese which taken together are bounded upon part of the east by the New Parish of Thornley (near Kelloe) in the said County and Diocese, upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west, upon the south, and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington from the said New Parish of Coxhoe at the northern end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the close numbered 16 upon the above mentioned maps, and extending thence first southward and then in various directions along the said wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the southern boundary of the said close numbered 16 and the close numbered 12 upon the said maps and along the walls or fences forming the western and southern boundaries of the close numbered 33A upon the same maps for a distance in all of 18½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the north-western side of Quarrington Street, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of Quarrington Street for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the close numbered 10 upon the same maps, and extending thence south-eastward to and along such wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the southern boundary of the closes numbered 8 and 9 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 41 chains or thereabouts to the south-eastern corner of the said close numbered 9 upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Coxhoe from the said Parish of Kelloe, and extending thence north-westward along such boundary for a distance of 34½ chains or thereabouts to a point distant 150 yards from the south-eastern side of Front Street, and extending thence north-eastward in a line parallel to and distant 150 yards from the southern side of Front Street for a distance of 47 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the footpath leading past the southern side of Cassop Colliery and continuing thence north-eastward in a line parallel to and distant 150 yards from the middle of the said footpath for a distance in all of 12 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Kelloe from the said New Parish of Thornley (near Kelloe).

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory to be annexed to the said New Parish of Coxhoe, comprising:—

" All those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of Cornforth and of the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington which, taken together, are bounded upon part of the east by the said New Parish of Coxhoe, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south, upon the west, upon the north, and upon the remaining part of the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near Coxhoe Bridge where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Coxhoe from the said New Parish of Cornforth diverges north-westward from following the middle of the Ferryhill and East Hartlepool Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 19½ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries it across the footpath leading to White House, and extending thence northward in a straight line for distance of 13 chains or thereabouts to the south-western corner of the close numbered 96 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Coxhoe published in the year 1919 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the said map or plan annexed to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence northward along the walls or fences forming the western boundary of the said close numbered 96 and of the closes numbered 97, 90 and 89 upon the said maps for a distance of 25½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the fence forming the northern boundary of the close numbered 87 upon the same maps, and extending thence westward along the last mentioned wall or fence for a distance of 5½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the house and premises situate at the north-eastern end of Victoria Terrace, and extending thence first north-eastward along the last mentioned wall or fence and then north-westward along the wall or fence forming the north-eastern boundary of the same premises for a distance in all of 2 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the south-eastern side of Cornforth Lane, and extending thence north-westward across Cornforth Lane to and along the middle of the roadway leading towards the close numbered 82 upon the last mentioned maps for a distance in all of 1¼ chains or thereabouts to a point in the wall or fence at its northern end, and extending thence first westward along such wall or fence and then first westward, then northward and then again westward along the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the said close numbered 82 for a distance in all of 4½ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the eastern side of the roadway leading through Cow Close, and extending thence first eastward to and then northward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of 8¼ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 57 upon the last mentioned maps, and extending thence north-westward to and along such wall or fence and along the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the

close numbered 58 upon the same maps for a distance in all of $11\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the Coxhoe Branch Line of the London and North Eastern Railway, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line across the said line of railway for a distance of 17 yards or thereabouts to the southern end of the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 46 upon the said maps, and extending thence first north-westward and then in various directions along such wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the southern, western and northern boundaries of the close numbered 45A upon the same maps and the western boundary of the close numbered 47 upon the same maps for a distance in all of $20\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the southern side of the stream which flows under Four Mile Bridge, and extending thence first north-westward to and then south-westward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 18 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the footbridge which carries the footpath leading from Cornforth Lane Junction towards Crow Trees across such stream, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the footpath which leads to Cornforth Moor past the south-western side of the close numbered 321 mentioned in the First Schedule to this Scheme or Representation, and extending thence first north-eastward and then south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 17 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-western end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the last mentioned close, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Cornforth from the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington), for a distance of 12 chains or thereabouts to the point where it reaches the south-western side of the road from Bowburn to Coxhoe, and extending thence first north-eastward to and then south-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of 9 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway leading to Wood Houses, and extending thence north-eastward along the said roadway and in a straight line in continuation of the first portion thereof for a distance in all of 49 chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the stream which flows past the eastern side of Wood Houses, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Cassop-cum-Quarrington from the said New Parish of Coxhoe.

“ The Third Schedule.

“ The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Coxhoe, and to be restored to the said Parish of Kelloe, comprising:—

“ I. All that portion of the said New Parish of Coxhoe which is bounded upon part of the south-east by an isolated portion of the said Parish of Kelloe, upon the east partly by the Extra Parochial Place called or known as

Garmondsway Moor in the said County and Diocese and partly by the main portion of the said Parish of Kelloe and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the north, upon the west and upon the remaining part of the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Kelloe from the said New Parish of Coxhoe at the north-eastern corner of the close numbered 101 upon the last mentioned maps, and extending thence first westward and then in various directions along the walls or fences forming the northern and western boundaries of the said close numbered 101, the western boundary of the close numbered 100 upon the same maps, and the northern and western boundaries of the close numbered 99 upon the same maps for a distance in all of 57 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence reaches the north-western side of the road from Coxhoe to Kelloe, and extending thence first south-eastward to and then north-eastward along the middle of the last mentioned road for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the close numbered 113 upon the same maps, and extending thence south-eastward to and along such wall or fence and along the walls or fences forming the south-western boundary of the closes numbered 115, 114 and 114A upon the same maps for a distance in all of 13 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the Mineral Railway leading to the East Hetton Colliery, and extending thence south-eastward in a straight line across the said mineral railway for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to the northern end of the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the close numbered 124 upon the same maps, and extending thence first south-eastward and then north-eastward along the walls or fences forming the south-western and south-eastern boundaries of the said close numbered 124 for a distance of 7 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Coxhoe from the said isolated portion of the Parish of Kelloe.

“ II. And also all that other portion of the said New Parish of Coxhoe which is bounded upon the north by the said isolated portion of the Parish of Kelloe, upon the east and upon the south by the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Garmondsway Moor, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Extra Parochial Place called or known as Garmondsway Moor from the said New Parish of Coxhoe at the south-western corner of the close numbered 125 upon the last mentioned maps, and extending thence north-westward along the wall or fence forming the south-western boundary of the said close numbered 125 for a distance of $5\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Coxhoe from the said isolated portion of the Parish of Kelloe.”

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation

and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of January, 1937 in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for effecting the unions (1) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Mautby with the Benefice of Runham (now part of the United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby) and (2) of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Filby with the Benefice of Thrigby (now part of the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby) all of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:—

" Whereas by an Order of His late Majesty King George the Fifth in Council dated the 6th day of February, 1925, and published in the London Gazette on the 10th day of the same month provision was made for the union of the Benefices of Runham and Thrigby aforesaid, and such union has since taken effect:

" And whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Benefices of Mautby and Runham and (2) of the said Benefices of Filby and Thrigby duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the said unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions of Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended

in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich embodies certain modifications thereof:

" And whereas the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby and the said Benefice of Filby are now full, the Reverend Francis Edward Rogers Thompson being the present Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby and the Reverend Harold Henry Peck being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Filby, and the said Benefice of Mautby is at present vacant:

" And whereas the Patronage of the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby now belongs to Thomas Browne Francis Daniel, Esquire, and the Bishop of Norwich for the time being as alternate Patrons:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and with the consent of the said Francis Edward Rogers Thompson (in testimony whereof they have respectively signed this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

" 1. That the said Benefice of Mautby and the part of the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby which consists of the said Benefice of Runham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Mautby with Runham ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That the said Benefice of Filby and the part of the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby which consists of the said Benefice of Thrigby shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under style of ' The United Benefice of Filby with Thrigby ' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 3. That if at the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Filby shall be vacant the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme shall forthwith take effect and the said Francis Edward Rogers Thompson if he is then Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham but if at that date the said Benefice of Filby shall not be vacant then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first avoidance after that date of the said Benefice of Filby, and pending such avoidance of the said Benefice of Filby, (a) the said Benefice of Mautby, and the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby shall forthwith be united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of ' The United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby ' but the parishes of the said Benefice of Mautby, Runham and Thrigby shall continue distinct in all respects and the said Francis Edward Rogers Thompson, if he is then Incumbent of the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby, shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby; (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the

said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby; (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Mautby and the site and appurtenances thereof and the ground heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and such part of the net proceeds of such sale as shall be determined by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners with the approval of the Bishop of Norwich shall be applied either towards the cost of improvements to the Parsonage House of the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby or towards the cost of the provision of a new Parsonage House for the same United Benefice or for the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham as the case may be and any balance of such net proceeds shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923; (d) a Curate shall be employed to assist the Incumbent in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby and a part of the endowments and property of the United Benefice that is to say the share of the endowments and property now belonging to the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby which by Clause 5 of this Scheme is recommended and proposed to be ultimately annexed to the United Benefice of Filby with Thrigby shall be appropriated as a fund whereof the income shall be applicable for and towards the payment of the stipend of such Curate and the income of the said fund shall be held and administered by the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby but shall be applicable only to the purpose aforesaid; (e) in every series of three successive turns of presentation or nomination to be made to the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby, the Patron of the said Benefice of Mautby shall have the first and the second turns and the Bishop of Norwich for the time being shall have the third turn.

" 4. That upon the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect (a) the Parsonage House then belonging to the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby or to the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham and Thrigby (as the case may be) shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham, (b) the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Filby shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice of Filby with Thrigby and (c) so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Mautby (if not previously sold under the provisions of Clause 3 of this Scheme) and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net

proceeds of such sale shall be applied as contemplated by Clause 3 of this Scheme.

" 5. That upon the unions referred to in Clauses 1 and 2 of this Scheme taking effect all that part of the endowments and property now belonging to the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby which before the union as aforesaid of the said Benefices of Runham and Thrigby belonged to or represents the proceeds of the sale, redemption or other conversion of any endowment and property then belonging to the said Benefice of Runham shall subject as hereinafter mentioned be annexed to the United Benefice of Mautby with Runham, and all other the endowment and property now belonging to the said United Benefice of Runham with Thrigby (including the fund now held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners representing the net proceeds of the sale of the former Parsonage House at Thrigby) shall subject as hereinafter mentioned be annexed to the United Benefice of Filby with Thrigby.

" 6. "We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, Derby, situate in the New Parish (some-time District) of Saint Paul, Derby, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Derby:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Mark, Derby, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Alfred Edward John, Bishop of Derby (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Derby, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Mark, Derby, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Derby'.

"And with the like consent of the said Alfred Edward John, Bishop of Derby (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of Saint Mark, Derby, situate as aforesaid, and that the fees or dues to be received in respect of the publication of banns and of the solemnization or performance of marriages, churchings and burials should be paid and

belong to the Minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always that so long as the Reverend Edwin Arthur Paxton, the present Vicar or Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Derby, shall continue to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint Mark, Derby, situate as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Edwin Arthur Paxton.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The District Chapelry of Saint Mark, Derby, being:—

“ All that part of the New Parish (sometime District) of Saint Paul, Derby, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Derby, which is bounded upon part of the east by the Parish of Chaddesden, upon the remaining part of the east and upon the north by the Parish of Breadsall, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the west and upon the south by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Breadsall from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Derby, crosses the middle of Mansfield Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Mansfield Road for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Stores Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Stores Road for a distance of 52 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Nottingham Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Nottingham Road for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Derby, from the said Parish of Chaddesden.”

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation; and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Derby.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Magdalene College, Cambridge, on the 13th day of March, 1937, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of “ The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923.”

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes of the College of St. Mary Magdalene commonly called Magdalene College in the University of Cambridge, which amending Statute having been duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose and held on the 18th day of December 1936 (notice of the proposed amending Statute having been given to the said University) and passed at such Meeting by the votes of all persons present and voting, is now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master and Fellows of Magdalene College in the University of Cambridge, do hereby in pursuance of the power given to us by the 7th Section of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, alter and amend the Statutes made under that Act in relation to our said College in manner following, that is to say:—

By repealing Statute XXI intituled “ Honorary Fellows ” and substituting therefor the following to form an amended Statute XXI:—

“ STATUTE XXI.

“ HONORARY FELLOWS.

“ The Governing Body may, at a meeting held for that purpose, elect to an Honorary Fellowship any person who has rendered signal services to the College or to the University, or any member of the College who has rendered signal services to the State, or any person who has attained eminent distinction in learning, letters, or science. Such Honorary Fellow shall not for the purpose of these Statutes be deemed a Fellow, nor shall he possess any voice or authority in the College, nor be entitled to any dividend, but except as aforesaid, he shall enjoy such privileges and advantages as the Governing Body may from time to time determine.

“ The Governing Body may at any time terminate the tenure of an Honorary Fellowship.”
