PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 5 of the Merchant Shipping (Mercantile Marine Fund) Act, 1898 (61 and 62 Vict. c. 44) (hereinafter referred to as "the said Section"), it is, amongst other things, enacted as follows:—

" 5.—(1) On and after the commencement of this Act, the general lighthouse authorities shall levy light dues with respect to the voyages made by ships or by way of periodical payment, and not with respect to the lights which a ship passes or from which it derives benefit, and the dues so levied shall take the place of the dues now levied by those authorities.

" (2) The scale and rules set out in the Second Schedule to this Act shall have effect for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of this Act, but Her Majesty may, by Order in Council, alter, either generally or with respect to particular classes of cases, the scale or rules and the exemptions therefrom."

And whereas from time to time divers Orders in Council have been made in pursuance of the said Section:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Scale and Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act should be further altered in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the said Section, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order; and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(a) This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Light Dues) Order, 1937, and shall have effect from the 1st day of April, 1937, or from the date of its publication in the London Gazette, whichever date shall be the later.

(b) The Interpretation Act, 1889 (52 and 53 Vict. c. 63), shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. Each of the dues authorised to be levied in accordance with the Scale set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall be subject to an increase of twenty-five per cent. for the purpose of the levying of light dues in pursuance of the said recited Act.

3. The payments referred to in the proviso to Rule (1) and in the proviso to Rule (7) of the Rules set out in the Second Schedule to the said recited Act shall also be subject to an increase of twenty-five per cent.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL IN ENGLAND.

(DATED 12TH APRIL, 1937.)

No. 8/1937.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of the County of Lancaster Registration Scheme, 1937, the registration district of Ashton was constituted of areas entirely situate in the Administrative County of Lancaster, and in consequence of the operation of the County of Chester Registration Scheme, 1937, the registration district of Stockport became entirely situate in the County Borough of Stockport;

And whereas the boundaries of the Administrative County of Lancaster and of the County Borough of Stockport were on the 1st day of April, 1937, by virtue of the provisions of the County of Lancaster and County Borough of Stockport (Alteration of Boundaries) Order, 1937, altered in such a way that the registration districts of Ashton and Stockport are not entirely situate in the Administrative County of Lancaster and the County Borough of Stockport respectively;

And whereas it is expedient that the aforesaid registration districts should be entirely situate in the Administrative County of Lancaster and the County Borough of Stockport respectively;

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sections 10 and 11 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1837, Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction

of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Lancashire and County Borough of Stockport Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1937, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1937.

(2) In this Order the term "district" means a Superintendent Registrar's district, and the terms "existing district" and "existing sub-district" mean respectively a district and a sub-district which existed immediately before the 1st day of May, 1937.

2.—(1) That portion of the existing Ashton district consisting of that part of the parish of Stockport which prior to the operation of the County of Lancaster and County Borough of Stockport (Alteration of Boundaries) Order, 1937, formed part of the parish of Denton shall become a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the existing Stockport district.

(2) That portion of the existing Stockport district consisting of that part of the parish of Denton which prior to the operation of the aforesaid Order formed part of the parish of Stockport shall become a separate district and shall thereupon be united with the existing Ashton district.

3.—(1) The area added to the Stockport district by Article 2 (1) of this Order shall cease to be included in the Audenshaw sub-district and shall be added to and form part of the Stockport Third sub-district.

(2) The area added to the Ashton district by Article 2 (2) of this Order shall cease to be included in the Stockport Third sub-district and shall be added to and form part of the Audenshaw sub-district.

4. The Superintendent Registrars of the existing Ashton and Stockport districts shall respectively be the Superintendent Registrars of those districts as altered by this Order.

5. The Registrars of Births and Deaths of the existing Audenshaw and Stockport Third sub-districts shall respectively be the Registrars of Births and Deaths of those sub-districts as altered by this Order.
