“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas the conditions of service of Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, are laid down by Orders in Council bearing dates the 9th day of March, 1921 and the 26th day of May, 1925:

“And whereas we consider it desirable that certain conditions of service of Schoolmasters, Royal Marines, should be amended:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the revised conditions of service set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

“Schedule.

“1. Schoolmasters (Warrant Officer), Royal Marines, to be promoted to Schoolmaster (Commissioned Officer from Warrant Rank), on attaining 12 years' seniority, provided they are deserving and their records are satisfactory.

“2. Pay as Schoolmaster (Commissioned Officer from Warrant Rank).

“3. Retired Pay, Widows' Pensions and Dependants' Allowances for Schoolmasters (Commissioned Officer from Warrant Rank), Royal Marines, to be on the scale for Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank.

“4. Promotion to Headmaster (Commissioned Officer from Warrant Rank), to be by selection from Schoolmasters (Warrant Officer and Commissioned Officer from Warrant Rank), Royal Marines.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the powers of The University of Durham Commissioners shall continue until the end of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven.

WHEREAS by subsection (2) of section eight of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920 (10 & 11 Geo. 5. c. 46), as amended by subsection (2) of section one of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1932 (22 Geo. 5. c. 15), power is conferred on His Majesty by Order in Council to declare that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall apply to any drug of whatever kind in the same manner as it applies to the drugs mentioned in subsection (1) of the said section eight if it appears to Him that the drug is or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, or is capable of being converted into a substance which is, or is likely to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

And whereas it appears to His Majesty that all preparations, admixtures or other substances (except *syrupus Codeinae Phosphatis B.P.C.* 1934) containing any proportion of methylmorphine (commonly known as codeine) or ethylmorphine (commonly known as dionin) associated with an inert substance whether solid or liquid and all preparations, admixtures or other substances containing more than 2.5 per cent. of methylmorphine or ethylmorphine (calculated as pure drug) associated with another medicinal substance are productive, if improperly used, or are capable of being converted into a substance which is, or is likely

to be productive, if improperly used, of ill effects substantially of the same character or nature as or analogous to those produced by morphine or cocaine:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by subsection (2) of section eight of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, as amended by subsection (2) of section one of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1932, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that Part III of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, shall after the first day of May, 1937, apply to any preparation, admixture or other substance (except *syrupus Codeinae Phosphatis B.P.C.* 1934) containing any proportion of methylmorphine (commonly known as codeine) or ethylmorphine (commonly known as dionin) associated with any inert substance whether solid or liquid, and to any preparation, admixture or other substance containing more than 2.5 per cent. of methylmorphine or ethylmorphine (calculated as pure drug) associated with any other medicinal substance in the same manner as the said Part III applies to the drugs mentioned in sub-section (1) of section eight of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920.

WHEREAS by section twelve of the Northern Ireland Land Purchase (Winding Up) Act, 1935 (in this Order referred to as "the Act") it is provided that His Majesty may by Orders in Council make such provision as seems necessary or proper for giving full effect to any provisions of the Act, and that in particular His Majesty may by any such Order in Council make such modifications and adaptations of the Acts relating to land purchase as may appear to Him necessary or proper in order to give effect to the provisions of the Act, or as may appear to Him necessary or proper as a consequence of any change effected by the provisions of the Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. Section fifty-six of the Land Law (Ireland) Act, 1881, shall have effect subject to the following modification, that is to say, for the words "The Land Commission shall from time to time prepare in such form and at such times as the Treasury may from time to time direct accounts of their receipts and expenditure, and within six months after the expiration of the year to which the accounts relate the Land Commission shall transmit the same to the Controller and Auditor General," there shall be substituted the words "The Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland shall from time to time cause to be prepared in such form and at such times as the Treasury may from time to time direct accounts of the receipts and expenditure of His Majesty's High Court of Justice in Northern Ireland in respect of the functions transferred to that Court by or under the Northern Ireland Land

Purchase (Winding Up) Act, 1935, and within six months after the expiration of the year to which the accounts relate the Lord Chief Justice of Northern Ireland shall cause the same to be transmitted to the Controller and Auditor General."

2. This Order may be cited as the Northern Ireland Land Purchase Winding Up (Adaptation) Order, 1937.

WHEREAS by the Colonial Naval Defence Act, 1931 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), it is enacted that the legislature of any Colony may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, make provision for maintaining and using vessels of war; and that where the legislature of any Colony has made provision for raising a force for the naval defence of the Colony within its territorial waters, that legislature may, with the approval of His Majesty in Council, further make such provision regarding the discipline and service of officers and men of that force as is set out in the Act:

And whereas by the Act it is further provided that His Majesty in Council may, on such conditions as He thinks fit, authorise the Admiralty to accept any offer made by the Government of a Colony to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy, vessels of war maintained, or officers or men of such force as aforesaid raised by the Colony:

And whereas by the Naval Volunteer Force Ordinance, 1935, of the Legislature of the Colony of Sierra Leone (hereinafter referred to as "the Legislature") provision has been made for raising a force for the Naval Defence of Sierra Leone called the Sierra Leone Naval Volunteer Force (hereinafter referred to as "the Force"):

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Him by the above recited provisions, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Sierra Leone Naval Defence Order, 1937".

2. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the power contained in Section 1 of the Act, to make provision at the expense of the Colony for maintaining and using vessels of war.

3. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of Sierra Leone to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any vessel of war so maintained, provided that, as regards any such vessel maintained by the Colony of Sierra Leone in conjunction with any other Colony, a like offer is made by such last mentioned Colony.

4. Approval is hereby given to the exercise by the Legislature of the powers contained in Subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Act namely, to provide that officers and men of the Force—

(a) shall, whether serving ashore or afloat or within or without the limits of Sierra Leone, be subject to all the enactments and regulations for the time being in force for the enforcement of discipline in the Royal Navy, with such modifications and adaptations as may be made by the Legislature to adapt those enactments and regulations to the circumstances of Sierra Leone;

(b) shall be liable to service and training in any ship, establishment or other place without the limits of Sierra Leone, whether belonging to Sierra Leone or not;

(c) shall, in the case of officers or men entered on the express terms of accepting general service in the Royal Navy in emergency, form part of the Royal Naval Reserve or of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve, or that some shall form part of the Royal Naval Reserve and others of the Royal Naval Volunteer Reserve.

5. The Admiralty is hereby authorised to accept any offer made by the Government of Sierra Leone to place at His Majesty's disposal for general service in the Royal Navy any officers and men of the Force.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, of the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, and of the New Parish of Saint Alban, South Norwood, all in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas District Chapelries have been assigned to each of the Churches of Saint Mark, South Norwood, and Saint Alban, South Nor-

wood, and a separate District for spiritual purposes has been constituted by the name of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood,

by the Orders in Council the dates of which are stated in the Third Column of the following Table:—

" And whereas the District Chapelries and the District named in the foregoing Table have become New Parishes of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

" And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parishes should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Cosmo Gordon, Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, and of the said New Parish of Saint Alban, South Norwood, shall be altered so that (first) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, which is described in the First Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Alban, South Norwood; (secondly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, which is described in the Second Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured green shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood; and (thirdly) all that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, which is described in the Third Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the said Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured purple shall be dissevered from such New Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood.

" And we further represent recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall

prevent us from representing recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

" THE SCHEDULES to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

" The First Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Alban, South Norwood, in the said County and Diocese, being:—

" All part portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, which is bounded upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, in the said County and Diocese, upon the south-west and upon part of the west by the said New Parish of Saint Alban, South Norwood, upon the remaining part of the west by the New Parish of All Saints, Norwood, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, at the junction of Grange Road with Wharncliffe Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Wharncliffe Road for a distance of 20 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Ross Road and Canham Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Canham Road for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Whitehorse Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood.

" The Second Schedule.

" The territory to be dissevered from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, being:—

" All that portion of the said new Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, which is bounded upon the north-east and upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west and upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint

John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, at the junction of Woodvale Avenue with South Norwood Hill, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of South Norwood Hill for a distance of $16\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Southern Avenue, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Southern Avenue for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Lancaster Road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood.

"The Third Schedule.

"The territory to be dis severed from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, and to be annexed to the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, which is bounded upon the north-east by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Penge, in the County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, upon the south-east, upon the south, and upon part of the west by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the west and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, South Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, at the junction of Lancaster Road with the southern end of Warminster Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Warminster Road for a distance of $23\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the south-western end of the wall or fence forming the north-western boundary of the house and premises known as Number 21 Warminster Road, and extending thence north-eastward to and along the said wall or fence for a distance of $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its north-eastern end, and continuing thence in the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing the Norwood Junction and Crystal Palace Line of the Central Section of the Southern Railway) for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Upper Norwood, from the said New Parish of Saint Paul, Penge."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 18th day of March, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice of Flordon and the Benefice of Hapton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Norfolk and in the Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Flordon and Hapton duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Flordon and Hapton are now full being held together in plurality by the Reverend Basil Silver Aldwell under the authority of a Dispensation:

"And whereas the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hapton in view of the intended union of that Benefice with the said Benefice of Flordon as hereinafter recommended have undertaken to secure to the United Benefice the redemption stock issued to them under the provisions of the Tithe Act, 1936, in respect of the extinguishment by that Act of certain Tithe Rentcharges arising within the Parish of Hapton and also a certain house and premises together with certain glebe land belonging to the said Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and with the consent of the said Basil Silver Aldwell (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Flordon and the said Benefice of Hapton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of

' The United Benefice of Flordon with Hapton ' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the Rural Deanery of Humbleyard but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

" 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette, the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Basil Silver Aldwell if he is then the Incumbent of both of the said Benefices of Flordon and Hapton shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice and his admission thereto shall be without any form or fee of or for presentation or nomination and he shall not be required to pay any fees in respect of his collation, institution, licence, or induction to the United Benefice beyond such fees as he would have been liable to pay if his admission to the United Benefice had been an admission solely to that one of the said two Benefices for the holding of which in plurality with the other a Dispensation was heretofore granted to him, and for the purpose of the 5th Section of the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, and of Schedule A thereto, his tenure of the said Benefices of Flordon and Hapton shall be deemed to continue notwithstanding his admission to the United Benefice.

" 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Flordon shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

" 4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Hapton having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Flordon having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

" Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measure, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measure to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop

of Norwich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Michaelstow and the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Saint Teath, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Cornwall and in the Diocese of Truro:

" Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Michaelstow and Saint Teath duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Truro and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Truro signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

" And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

" And whereas the said Benefices of Saint Teath is now full the Reverend Norman Charles Hony being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Michaelstow is at present vacant:

" Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Joseph Wellington, Bishop of

Truro, and the said Norman Charles Hony (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Michaelstow and the said Benefice of Saint Teath shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘The United Benefice of Saint Teath with Michaelstow’ but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

“ 2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect and the said Norman Charles Hony if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Teath shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

“ 3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Saint Teath shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice and so soon as conveniently may be the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Michaelstow and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be held and invested by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for the benefit of the United Benefice.

“ 4. That upon the union taking effect a Curate shall be appointed at a stipend of not less than £250 per annum to assist the Incumbent in the performance of the duties of the United Benefice and such Curate shall reside at Delabole in the Parish of Saint Teath and shall be employed particularly to serve the Church of Saint John, at Delabole.

“ 5. That with the consent of the said Joseph Wellington, Bishop of Truro, as Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Teath (which consent is testified as aforesaid), upon the union taking effect a part of the total endowments of the Benefices hereinbefore recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice, namely (a) an annual payment of £18 at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Saint Teath conditionally upon the performance of services to the satisfaction of the said Bishop of Truro in the said Church of Saint John, Delabole; (b) annual payments including a terminable grant of £90 per annum and amounting in all to £125 at present made by us to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Saint Teath for his own use; (c) a sum of £1,455 19s. 3d. Local Loans £3 per cent. per annum Stock at present held by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners in trust for the said Benefice of Saint Teath; and (d) a proportion that is to say three one-eighth parts of the sum of money appropriated or to be appropriated by Queen Anne’s Bounty to the said Benefice of Saint Teath pursuant to the provisions of Part II 2 of the Third Schedule to the Tithe Act, 1936, and 1 of the Eighth Schedule to the same Act shall be severed or diverted from the said

Benefice of Saint Teath and from the United Benefice and shall be appropriated by us and by Queen Anne’s Bounty respectively for and towards the endowment of a proposed new District to comprise wholly or partly the locality of Delabole in the Parish of Saint Teath Provided always that pending the constitution of such new District it shall be lawful for us and for Queen Anne’s Bounty respectively to pay the income arising from the endowments so severed or diverted to the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of the Curate referred to in Clause 4 of this Scheme and in the event of such Curate not being so employed as aforesaid the said income shall be accumulated for and towards the endowment of the proposed new District.

“ 6. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Saint Teath having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Michaelstow having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

“ Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from making any other recommendations and proposals relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament ”.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the same Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Truro has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be

effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Truro.

“ And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Borrowdale is now full the Reverend Frank Herbert Warner being the present Incumbent thereof and the said Benefice of Grange is at present vacant:

“ And whereas the said Benefice of Grange has no parochial Cure of Souls and the Chapel of Grange is situate within the limits of the Parish of the said Benefice of Borrowdale:

“ And whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Grange now belongs to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Borrowdale:

“ Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Henry Herbert, Bishop of Carlisle, and of the said Frank Herbert Warner (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do

humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

“ 1. That the said Benefice of Borrowdale and the said Benefice of Grange shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of ‘ The Benefice of Borrowdale ’ (hereinafter referred to as the United Benefice).

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the Parish of Stratford sub Castle and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Salisbury, both in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury:

" Whereas we are satisfied that the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle and the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Salisbury, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle and of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Salisbury, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purposes of Divine Worship:

" And whereas by Instruments published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of October, 1932, the 30th day of October, 1934, the 29th day of October, 1935, and the 30th day of

October, 1936, respectively, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, partly without consideration and partly in consideration of benefactions of capital sums of £1,000, £500, £576 and £700 did, in pursuance of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111, grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act to the Incumbent of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle yearly sums or stipends amounting to £161 3s. 4d. such yearly sums or stipends to be paid only upon the production of a certificate that an Assistant Curate had been employed to serve the Conventional District of Saint Francis, Salisbury, and to continue payable so long only as might appear to us to be expedient:

“ And whereas it has been made to appear to us to be expedient that such yearly sums or stipends amounting to £161 3s. 4d. payable by us as aforesaid should cease to be so payable and that in lieu thereof we should grant a yearly sum of £161 3s. 4d. to the Minister of the said proposed District when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District or New Parish:

“ And whereas the said benefactions of the said capital sums of £1,000, £500, £576 and £700 now held by us, are available for the further endowment of the said proposed separate District and we have agreed to pay to the Minister of the said proposed District, when duly licensed as hereinbefore mentioned, and to his successors Ministers or Incumbents of the said proposed District, a further yearly sum of £104 13s. 4d. by equal quarterly instalments on the 1st day of February, the 1st day of May, the 1st day of August and the 1st day of November in each and every year, so long as the said capital sums shall remain in our hands:

“ And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £161 3s. 4d. will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

“ And whereas there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting a permanent Church within and for the said proposed separate District:

“ And whereas the said capital sum of £2,000 has been contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

“ And whereas the contributors of the said capital sum of £2,000 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church have nominated to

us the Bishop of Salisbury for the time being as the person to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or new Parish should be assigned:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle and of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Salisbury, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions together with the boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme as aforesaid, become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named ‘The District of Saint Francis, Salisbury.’

“ And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and, when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid, then of such New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Ernest Neville, Bishop of Salisbury, and his successors for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

“ THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

“ The District of Saint Francis, Salisbury, comprising:—

“ All those contiguous portions of the Parish of Stratford sub Castle and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mark, Salisbury, both in the County of Wilts and in the Diocese of Salisbury, which, taken together, are bounded upon the south-west partly by the Parish of Fugglestone Saint Peter with Bemerton, and partly by the Parish of Saint Paul, Fisherton Anger, both in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-east, upon the north-east and upon the north-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Saint Paul, Fisherton Anger, from the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Salisbury, at the centre of the bridge which connects Ashley Road with Butts Road across the River Avon, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Butts Road for a distance of 9½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Castle Road, and extending thence northward along the middle of Castle Road for a distance of 4¼ chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the western end of the wall or fence forming

the southern boundary of the house and premises known as Number 63, Castle Road, and extending thence first eastward to and along the said wall or fence and then north-eastward along the wall or fence forming the eastern boundary of the same premises for a distance in all of 6 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the wall or fence forming the southern boundary of the Salisbury Bowling Green, and extending thence first eastward and then northward along the walls or fences forming the southern and eastern boundaries of the said Bowling Green for a distance of $2\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence reaches the western side of Devonshire Road, and extending thence northward along the western side of Devonshire Road, the western side of Cornwall Road and the wall or fence forming the western boundary of the house and premises known as 'St. Giles,' Cornwall Road, for a distance in all of $6\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned wall or fence meets the wall or fence forming the northern boundary of the houses and premises situate on the northern side of Cornwall Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned wall or fence for a distance of $12\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the north-western boundary of the close numbered 13 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of New Sarum, published in the year 1925 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence north-eastward along the last-mentioned fence and along the fence forming the north-western boundary of the close numbered 193 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Laverstock and Ford published in the year 1926 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the said map or plan annexed to this Scheme for a distance in all of 26 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned fence reaches the western side of the road called Bishopdown, and extending thence first eastward to and then first northward and then north-westward along the middle of Bishopdown for a distance of $41\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Salisbury, from the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle, and extending thence first north-eastward and then north-westward along such boundary for a distance of $11\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it diverges north-eastward from following the northern side of Bishopdown, and continuing thence north-westward along the northern side of Bishopdown for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Castle Road, and extending thence first westward to and then south-westward along the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle from the Extra Parochial Place called or known as Old Sarum, in the said County and Diocese (thereby following in part the middle of Castle Road) for a distance of $18\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the middle of the road called Portway, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Portway for a distance of 36 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the north-eastern end of the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the close numbered 172 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of

Stratford sub Castle published in the year 1926 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile, and also upon the said map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence first south-westward to and along such fence and then north-westward along the fence forming the south-western boundary of the same close for a distance in all of $10\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned fence reaches the eastern bank of the eastern branch of the River Avon, and extending thence first-westward to and then south-westward along such branch of the River Avon for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the main stream upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Stratford sub Castle from the said Parish of Fugglestone Saint Peter with Bemerton."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Parish of Stratford sub Castle and of the New Parish of Saint Mark, Salisbury, out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Salisbury.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 28th day of January, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Measures, 1923 to 1936, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Leeds, Christ Church, and the Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of York and in the Diocese of Ripon:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Geoffrey Charles Lester, Bishop of Ripon, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Leeds, Christ Church, and Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Ripon and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Ripon signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Ripon embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas it appears to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, that the total endowments of the Benefices hereinafter recommended and proposed to be constituted an United Benefice which would remain after making such provision as is hereinafter recommended and proposed for the payment of a Curate to assist the Incumbent of such United Benefice would be more than is required to form a competent provision for the United Benefice and that it is desirable that a part of such endowments should be applied as hereinafter recommended and proposed for the augmentation of a Benefice not having a competent provision that is to say the District proposed to be formed at Belle Isle, Leeds, in the said Diocese of Ripon:

"And whereas under Section 21 of the Leeds Churches Act, 1901, a certain annual payment (amounting to £294 9s. 8d. per annum and hereinafter referred to as the Curacy Fund) is made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, for the payment of two assistant Curates:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices are now full the Reverend Cuthbert Cresswell Cooke being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leeds, Christ Church, and the Reverend Charles Jenkinson being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Leeds, St. John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Leeds, Christ Church, belongs to the Vicar of Leeds for the time being:

"And whereas the Patronage of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, belongs to the said Vicar of Leeds for the time being and to the Bishop of Ripon for the time being in alternate turns:

"And whereas there is a fund (hereinafter referred to as Saint John's Church Repair Fund) in the hands of the Ripon Diocesan Board of Finance which is applicable to the repair of the Church of Saint John, Leeds, and there is also a fund (hereinafter referred to as Saint Barnabas's Church Repair Fund) in the hands of certain trustees which is applicable to the repair of the Church of Saint Barnabas, Leeds:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Geoffrey Charles Lester, Bishop of

Ripon (testified by his signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Leeds, Christ Church, and the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Leeds, Christ Church, with Holbeck, Saint John and Saint Barnabas' and that the Parishes of the said Benefices shall also be united into one Parish for ecclesiastical purposes and for such other purposes as in the said Measures provided.

"2. That the Church of the Parish of Leeds, Christ Church, shall be the Parish Church of the United Parish and that the Table of Fees for the said Parish of Leeds, Christ Church, shall (until revised or altered by proper authority) be the Table of Fees for the United Parish.

"3. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant, the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if one only of the said two Benefices shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but, if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of either of the said two Benefices if the Incumbent at that time of the other of the said two Benefices shall with the approval of the Bishop consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent or if the Bishop shall not approve then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of his Benefice and the then Incumbent (if any) of the other of the said two Benefices shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That upon the union taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Churches of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas Leeds, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the United Benefice but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint John the Evangelist (if not then already officially closed) and the marriage registers in duplicate current at the said Church of Saint Barnabas shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the United Benefice to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

"5. That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Parsonage Houses at present belonging to the said Benefices of Leeds, Christ Church and Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, and the sites and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at

such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall be added to, and be applicable towards the same purposes as, the aggregate fund hereinafter mentioned.

" 6. That a Curate be appointed to assist the Incumbent in performing the duties of the United Benefice and that a sum of £122 5s. 6d. per annum, being part of the said Curacy Fund, shall be payable by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent for the time being of the United Benefice conditionally upon the employment of such Curate.

" 7.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the Church of Saint Barnabas shall be taken down and the Church of Saint John the Evangelist, if not then already demolished under the authority of a Faculty or otherwise, shall also be taken down, and the sites thereof and the materials of the Church of Saint Barnabas or of both Churches as the case may be together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Ripon under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Churches, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, together with the net proceeds of the sales of the Parsonage Houses of the said Benefices of Leeds, Christ Church, and Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, shall form one aggregate fund and such aggregate fund shall be applied by us the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners as follows, that is to say, (1) in payment of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or in repayment of any advance made for the purpose of such compensation or compensations, (2) in discharging the outstanding debt in respect of the mortgage to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty of the revenues of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, (3) for and towards the cost of the provision of a Parsonage House for the United Benefice and (4) the residue of such aggregate fund shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site or sites for and the erection of a new Church Parsonage House and Parish Hall for the said proposed District at Belle Isle, Leeds, and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site or sites for and the erection of such Church Parsonage House and Parish Hall shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Ripon.

" (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Churches of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to Christ Church, Leeds, being the Parish Church of the United Benefice or to some other Church or Churches within the said

Diocese of Ripon and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Churches of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas or such of them as the Bishop of Ripon shall select, shall be removed to the Parish Church of the United Benefice, and any such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Ripon for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Ripon which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the said aggregate fund.

" (d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers or Servants of the said Churches of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas being dispensed with by reason of the union taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Ripon equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases, to advance the compensation money or any part of it out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 8. That with the consent of the Patrons of the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, namely the said Geoffrey Charles Lester, Bishop of Ripon (whose consent is testified as aforesaid), and the Reverend Canon William Thompson Elliott (whose consent is testified by his signing this Scheme) upon the union taking effect (a) all the endowments now belonging to the said Benefice of Leeds, Saint John the Evangelist with Saint Barnabas, shall be held and accumulated for and towards the endowment of the proposed new District at Belle Isle, Leeds, and (b) the remaining part, that is to say a sum of £172 4s. 2d. per annum, of the said Curacy Fund together with all accumulations of the whole of the said Curacy Fund which at the date of the union taking effect may have accrued shall be held and accumulated as a Fund for the payment of clerical or lay assistance to be employed within the said proposed new District.

" 9. That after the said union has taken effect the patronage of the United Benefice shall belong wholly to the Vicar of Leeds for the time being and the patronage of the proposed new District at Belle Isle, Leeds, shall belong wholly to the Bishop of Ripon for the time being.

" 10. That so soon as conveniently may be after the union has taken effect the said Saint John's Church Repair Fund and the said Saint Barnabas's Church Repair Fund shall be transferred to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and by us be appropriated to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Ripon to the intent that both the said Funds shall be transferred to the Ripon Diocesan Board of Finance as a Repair Fund for the said proposed new Church at Belle Isle, Leeds.

" Provided always that the provisions herein contained relating to the sale and disposal of the said Churches of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas shall not take effect until the consents and approval which by the said

Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, are made requisite to the sale under the powers conferred by that Measure of the site of any Church shall be obtained to the sale and disposal hereby proposed of the said Churches of Saint John the Evangelist and Saint Barnabas and of the sites thereof together with any ground annexed or belonging thereto.

"And provided further that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures, or of any other Measure of the National Assembly of the Church of England, or of any Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been duly published in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and Notices have been transmitted to the persons or bodies entitled under the said Measures to receive Notice requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules applicable to proceedings under the said Measures:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Ripon has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas the said Scheme has been laid before both Houses of Parliament for the space of two calendar months:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the date when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Measures.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Ripon.

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, pursuant to the provisions of the Union of Benefices Measure, 1923, to inquire into and report upon the unions (1) of the said Cathedral Benefice with a part of the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, and (2) of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, with the remaining part of the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Sheffield and therein recommended such unions and the terms for effecting the same, and the said Bishop of Sheffield signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the said unions which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas all of the said three Benefices are at present full the Very Reverend Alfred Charles Eustace Jarvis being the present Incumbent of the said Cathedral Benefice, the Reverend Ralph Holloway being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, and the Reverend Bertram Fountain Hinde being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consents of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, Alfred Charles Eustace Jarvis and Bertram Fountain Hinde (testified by their respectively signing this Scheme), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That a part of the said Benefice and Parish of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, being all that part which lies to the east of an imaginary line extending from the junction of Furnace Hill with Scotland Street to the junction of Bailey Street with Broad Lane, shall be permanently united for all ecclesiastical purposes with the said Cathedral Benefice and the Parish thereof or with any Benefice and Parish of which the said Cathedral Benefice and Parish shall form part at the date when the provisions of this Scheme shall take effect as hereinafter recommended and proposed.

"2. That the remaining part of the said Benefice and Parish of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, shall be permanently united for all ecclesiastical purposes with the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, and the Parish thereof or with

any Benefice and Parish of which the said Benefice and Parish of Sheffield, Saint George, shall form part at the date when the provisions of this Scheme shall take effect as hereinafter recommended and proposed.

That with the consents of the said Alfred Charles Eustace Jarvis and Bertram Fountain Hinde (testified as aforesaid) if upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council affirming this Scheme the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, shall be vacant then the said unions shall forthwith take effect but if upon that day the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, shall be full, then the said unions shall take effect immediately upon the first vacation thereafter of the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke.

That upon the unions taking effect the register books of baptisms, marriages and burials and other the records and muniments deposited in the Church of Saint Luke, Holliscroft, shall be transferred to the Parish Church of the Parish of Sheffield, Saint George, or of any Parish of which the said Parish of Sheffield, Saint George, shall form part at the date when the provisions of this Scheme shall take effect as aforesaid but the marriage registers in duplicate current at the Church of Saint Luke, Holliscroft, shall first be sent by the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, or the Incumbent of any Benefice including the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, at the date when the provisions of this Scheme shall take effect, as aforesaid, to the Registrar General to be closed officially.

" 5. That so soon as conveniently may be after the said unions have taken effect, the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, and the site and appurtenances thereof and the grounds heretofore usually occupied and enjoyed therewith shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient and that the net proceeds of such sale shall constitute and form part of the Expenses Fund established pursuant to the 32nd Section of the said Union of Benefices Measure, 1923.

" 6.—(a) That so soon as conveniently may be after the unions have taken effect the Church of Saint Luke, Holliscroft, shall be taken down and the materials and site thereof, together with any ground annexed thereto and necessary for the use and enjoyment thereof shall be sold and disposed of by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, at such time or times and in such manner in all respects as to us shall seem expedient subject to the conditions and restrictions imposed by the said Measures.

" (b) That the net proceeds to arise from such sale or sales after the appropriation to the Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Sheffield under the said Measures of so much of such proceeds as may in our opinion be necessary to defray the expenses attendant upon the sale or sales, the taking down of the Church, the removal of monuments (if any) and all other expenses incidental to these matters, shall be applied by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as follows, that is to say, (1) a specific

sum equal in amount to one fifth of the said net proceeds shall be appropriated to the said Expenses Fund, (2) a sufficient sum shall be appropriated to meet the cost of the compensation or compensations hereinafter referred to or the repayment of any advance made by us for the purpose of such compensation or compensations, and (3) the residue of such net proceeds shall be held and accumulated by us as a fund for and towards the purchase of a suitable site for and the erection of a new Church for a District to be selected by the Bishop of Sheffield as the District for which such Church shall be built and to be in the patronage of the Patron of the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke; and any ultimate residue after the provision of a site for and the erection of such Church shall be added to the said Expenses Fund of the Diocese of Sheffield.

" (c) That the font, communion table, and plate used for the purpose of the Holy Communion in the said Church of Saint Luke, Holliscroft, shall in accordance with the provisions of the said Measures and as the Bishop of the Diocese may direct be transferred to the Church of Saint George, Sheffield, or to some other Church or Churches within the said Diocese of Sheffield, and the bells, organ and other furniture and fittings of the said Church of Saint Luke, Holliscroft, or such of them as the Bishop of Sheffield shall select, shall be removed to the said Church of Saint George, Sheffield, and any of such articles not so removed shall be appropriated by the Bishop of Sheffield for use in the proposed Church of the said District or be removed to any other Church or Chapel or Churches or Chapels within the Diocese of Sheffield which the Bishop may select or shall be sold and in such case the proceeds shall be added to the fund arising from the sale of the site and materials of the said Church of Saint Luke, Holliscroft, as aforesaid.

" (d) That in the event of the services of any Church Officers and Servants of the said Church of Saint Luke, Holliscroft, being dispensed with by reason of the unions taking effect such Church Officers and Servants shall out of any moneys to be received by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under the provisions of this Clause receive such reasonable compensation as having regard to age, length of service, and other circumstances of the case shall seem to us and to the Bishop of Sheffield equitable and proper. Provided always that it shall be lawful for us if we shall see fit so to do in all or any of these cases to advance the compensation money or any part of it out of the said Expenses Fund.

" 7. That with the consent of the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (testified as aforesaid), being the Patron of the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, upon the unions taking effect the endowment of the said Benefice of Holliscroft, Saint Luke, consisting wholly of an annual payment of £387 at present made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Incumbent of such Benefice shall be applied as follows, that is to say, a part namely £190 of such annual payment shall be appropriated and paid to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, or of any Benefice or United Benefice of which the said Benefice of Sheffield, Saint George, shall form part at the date when the provisions of this
