TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 30th April, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £40,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd May, 1937, to Saturday, the 8th May, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

And whereas by Section 2 sub-section (1) of the Ministry of Transport Act 1919 and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order 1919 the powers of the Board of Trade in relation to canal undertakings were transferred to the Minister of Transport:

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament 9 Geo. III cap. 70 a company was incorporated by the name of "The Company of Proprietors of the Oxford Canal Navigation" and was empowered to make and maintain a navigable canal, from the Coventry Canal Navigation to the city of Oxford, and the provisions of the said Act and of succeeding Acts were extended by Acts 10 Geo. IV cap. 48 and 25 Geo. 5 ch. XV.

And whereas such canal was constructed accordingly and has become vested in the Oxford Canal Company.

And whereas on the 15th December 1936 the Oxford Canal Company made application to the Minister of Transport pursuant to the hereinbefore recited Section 45 sub-section (1) of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act 1888 for a Warrant authorising the abandonment of the undermentioned portion of the Oxford Canal on the ground that the same is unnecessary for the purposes of public navigation within the meaning of the said section, namely:—

That portion of the said Canal which lies between the north side of Hythe Bridge Street and the existing terminus of the said Canal within the City of Oxford, together with the wharves and landing places of and belonging thereto:

And whereas the Minister of Transport has satisfied himself on the matters referred to in the hereinbefore recited sub-section (2) of the said Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act 1888:

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act 1888 the Minister of Transport hereby authorises the abandonment by the Oxford Canal Company of the aforesaid portion of the said Oxford Canal.
