

1108 upon the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Saint Cuthbert Without published in the year 1925 on the scale of 25 inches to one mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence southward to and along such fence for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets the fence forming the north-eastern boundary of Blackwell Common and extending thence first south-westward, then south-eastward and then again south-westward along the fences forming the eastern and south-eastern boundaries of Blackwell Common for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence reaches the eastern side of Durdar Road, and extending thence north-westward in a straight line (thereby crossing the Carlisle Race Course) for a distance of 37 chains or thereabouts to a mile post on the eastern side of the Maryport and Carlisle Branch Line of the London Midland and Scottish Railway near Blackwell Springs, and extending thence first westward to and then northward along the middle of the said line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Upperby, from the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Carlisle) for a distance of 1 mile and 4 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the middle of Adelphi Terrace, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the middle of Adelphi Terrace for a distance of 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Currock Road, and extending thence southward along the middle of Currock Road for a distance of 14½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Blackwell Road, at which point the said imaginary line commenced."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and

after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Carlisle.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme bearing date the 8th day of April, 1937, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for authorising the sale and disposal of certain property situate in the County of Devon now vested in us:

"Whereas the property particulars whereof are set forth in the Schedule hereunder written is now vested in us not subject to any outstanding beneficial lease or grant but in possession and we are desirous of selling the same or some portion thereof for the improvement of our Common Fund:

"Now, therefore, we humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty that we may be authorised and empowered to sell or dispose of and duly to transfer or convey from time to time all or part of the said property described in the said Schedule for such consideration as shall appear to us to be just and reasonable.
