The following Addresses were presented to The KING on the occasion of the opening by His Majesty of the National Maritime Museum at Greenwich on the 27th April, 1937:—

H.M. FIRST COMMISSIONER OF WORKS.

May it please Your Majesty,

Great Britain, more than any other country, owes its greatness to the influence of Sea Power and of overseas trade. Ships have carried goods from this Island Kingdom across the Seven Seas, and the flag has followed trade, until the British Crown has become the symbol of unity to peoples scattered over the face of the earth. Strange is it, therefore, that until now there has been no national Museum in Great Britain to commemorate the deeds of those who have gone down to the sea in ships.

The National Maritime Museum which Your Majesty has been so gracious as to come here to open to the public is fortunate in the home which has been dedicated to it by Act of Parliament.

The Queen's House, built by Inigo Jones, to the order of King James I became the residence of Queen Henrietta Maria. For the past 130 years, however, it has provided a residence for the five senior officers of the Royal Hospital School, and during that period it underwent sad changes. It has now been restored to its former condition. It stands midway between, on the one hand, the river with its constant stream of shipping, and on the other the Royal Observatory of Greenwich which, thanks to the skill of British seamen and cartographers now marks the Prime Meridian of the world.

The thirty rooms of the Queen's House, however, are not adequate to house the collection, and additional galleries and a library have been formed out of the premises which used to provide the classrooms and dormitories of the Royal Hospital School, now established at Holbrook. The buildings have required considerable adaptation to make them suitable for a Museum and this, together with all the equipment of the museum, and the transformation of an asphalted sloping playground into the flat green sward and paths adjoining the Museum, has been achieved solely owing to the munificence of Sir James Caird.

The Museum is no less fortunate in its contents. There have been entrusted to it the fine collection of naval portraits, which used to hang in the Painted Hall of what is now the Royal Naval College, a collection which owes much to Your Majesty's predecessor, King William IV. A fine collection of ship models has also been entrusted to the Museum from the same source. To this nucleus have been added gifts from various donors, and in particular the unique collection which Sir James Caird has presented to the nation, a collection consisting of Portraits, Battle-pieces, engravings, drawings, ship models and navigational instruments.

Although many treasures have been dispersed to other countries owing to no Maritime Museum having been in existence, the exhibits now to be displayed to the public will be found to be not unworthy of the place which the Sea holds in our history, and it is hoped that many other benefactors from time to time, as the years pass, will present to this Museum such objects as shall worthily recall to memory the pages of the past.

The Badge of the Museum is the old badge of the Navy Office and consists of three anchors, representing not only the Royal Navy, but also the Merchant Navy and Fishing Fleets, and representatives of those Services, and from the Ports in Great Britain which serve them, are present here to-day. The visit of Your Majesty, the Head of those three Services, accompanied by Her Majesty the Queen, will make known to the public the existence of this Museum, and I now venture to ask Your Majesty graciously to be pleased to declare the Museum open.

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:

I thank you for your loyal and dutiful Address. It is a great pleasure to The Queen and myself to come here to-day to open the National Maritime Museum, and to see representatives of our Seaports and of the maritime interests of our country. My early life was spent in the Royal Navy and I am glad that

the opening of this Museum should be one of the first ceremonies of my Reign.

But for the enterprise, the courage and the character of our seamen, the British Commonwealth of Nations would never have come into existence. The qualities of Drake, Nelson and Franklin are as necessary to-day as ever in the past, and it is well that we should recall the exploits of men such as these, so that the part which our seamen have played in our history may never be forgotten.

The Museum has indeed a worthy home, built more than three hundred years ago; and I congratulate you and the Officers of your Department upon its restoration, and upon the conversion of the Royal Hospital premises into these fine galleries.

It is ten years since Sir James Caird bought the Macpherson Collection of Naval Prints, and from that date he has continued to purchase treasures for this Museum. We owe much to his generosity, and I do not doubt that others will be inspired to emulate his public spirit, and add still more to the interest and value of this, the youngest of our Museums.

In the belief that it will help to further the knowledge of our glorious maritime history, I have much pleasure in declaring open the National Maritime Museum.

METROPOLITAN BOROUGH OF GREENWICH.

To the King's Most Excellent Majesty.

May it please Your Majesty:—

We, The Mayor, Aldermen and Councillors of the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich, humbly beg to offer Your Majesty an expression of our devotion to Your Royal House and our whole-hearted and respectful welcome on the auspicious occasion of Your Majesty's presence here to-day with that of Your Royal Consort.

As loyal and devoted subjects, we are well aware of the deep interest Your Majesty displays in all matters appertaining to the Royal Navy and Maritime subjects, and we profoundly appreciate the favour which Your Majesty has shown to our Borough by Your visit to open the National Maritime Museum.

Greenwich contains a Royal Palace, the birthplace of Henry VIII, Queen Mary and Queen Elizabeth and now the Royal Naval College. Within our Borough also stands the Queen's House, built by Inigo Jones for Anne of Denmark, the Queen of James I, the favourite residence of Queen Henrietta Maria and now the National Maritime Museum.

After the Battle of La Hogue 1692, Queen Mary II conceived the idea of establishing a Royal Hospital as a refuge for aged and wounded seamen of the Royal Navy and their widows and children. The first seamen were admitted to the Hospital in 1705 and in the year 1814 there were as many as 2,710 in residence. Out-pensions, first given in 1865, proved popular, and in 1869, the residential Hospital was abolished. The Royal Naval College was established in the Hospital Buildings in 1873.

St. Nicholas, Deptford (which is included in the Borough of Greenwich) also has had a long and distinguished connection with the

Naval Service of the Country. In its Royal Dockyard (closed in 1869) have been built some of the most famous ships in the history of the Royal Navy particularly those associated with the victories of Sir Francis Drake and Lord Nelson. It was here that Queen Elizabeth conferred the honour of Knighthood upon Sir Francis Drake on his return from the circumnavigation of the world.

The Royal Observatory, built by Sir Christopher Wren on the site of Greenwich Castle in 1675 at the instance of Charles II for the assistance of navigation, and which now defines the meridian and thus governs the standard of time of Great Britain, and the meridian of longitude to be used throughout the world, is situate within Greenwich Park.

It is because of the associations of Greenwich with the Crown, the Royal Navy and the Maritime World, that the inhabitants of the Borough feel deeply honoured by Your Majesty's visit on such a propitious occasion as the opening of the National Maritime Museum which will house in the cradle of the Royal Navy such a magnificent collection of articles historically associated with the Royal Navy and the Mercantile Marine and will prove a further connecting link of Greenwich with its traditional maritime history.

We humbly pray that Your Majesty may long be spared to guide the destinies of this Great Empire in whose prosperity and happiness each of Your loyal subjects evinces such justifiable pride.

The Common Seal of the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Greenwich was hereunto affixed, in pursuance of a Resolution for the purpose duly passed at a Meeting of the Council of the said Borough, in the presence of

To which Address His Majesty was pleased to return the following Gracious Answer:

The Queen and I thank you heartily for your loyal Address and for the warmth of your welcome on our first visit to Greenwich since my Accession.

Rightly do you recall with pride your historical associations with the Royal House, the Royal Navy and the Maritime world.

In Greenwich was born King Henry VIII, the Founder of the Royal Navy. Thousands of aged and disabled seamen of the Royal Navy found refuge in the peace and calm of the Royal Hospital instituted by Queen Mary, to whose foresight we are indebted for the wonderful vista which stretches from the river to the hill on which stands the Royal Observatory established by King Charles II. The work carried on in the Royal Observatory led to the institution of the Nautical Almanac which has made the name of Greenwich known in the remotest parts of the world. I notice that your Coat of Arms is a perpetual reminder that Greenwich gives time to the world.

For more than sixty years the Royal Naval College has been the nursery of our Sea Services, and Greenwich is so closely linked with our maritime story that there is no place in this country in which the Museum could be more appropriately established.

I am happy to think that The Queen's House in which so many of my Ancestors have resided has now become accessible to the public, and I am sure that the people of Greenwich will not be slow to enjoy the wealth of treasures which it contains.

sioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF
ASSISTANT QUANTITY SURVEYORS IN H.M.
OFFICE OF WORKS.

N.B.—*Competitions under these regulations
are open both to men and women. Competi-
tions do not take place at fixed intervals, but
are held as occasion arises on the occurrence
of vacancies. The regulations are liable to
alteration from time to time.*

1. Candidates must have attained the age of
25 on a date to be fixed in respect of the com-
petition in which they are to take part, but
must not have attained 35 years of age on
that date.

Candidates who have served or are serving
in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct
from their actual age any time not exceeding
five years during which they have so served.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born
British subject, the child of a person who is
or was at the time of death a British subject;
provided that exception may be made:—

(a) In the case of candidates serving in a
civil situation to which they were admitted
with the certificate of the Civil Service Com-
missioners:

(b) In the case of natural-born British sub-
jects who served in His Majesty's Armed
Forces in the Great War between 4th August,
1914, and 11th November, 1918.

(c) In the case of natural-born British sub-
jects who have satisfactorily completed a
period of not less than five years' service on
full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Com-
missioners are satisfied in the case of any
candidate who is a British subject but does not
fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to
nationality and descent, that the candidate is
so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing
with His Majesty's dominions that an ex-
ception may properly be made to that rule, they
may accept such candidate as eligible provided
that this discretion shall not be exercisable
unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather
of the candidate was a natural-born British sub-
ject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal
grandfather had acquired any other nationality
by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and
formal act.

3. Persons holding situations in the Civil
Service must obtain the permission of the
authorities of their Department to apply for
appointment.

No person actually serving in the Army,
Navy or Air Force will be eligible for con-
sideration unless he produces, when called upon
to do so, the permission of his Commanding
Officer to apply for appointment, dated before
his appearance before the Selection Board, and
given in accordance with such orders as may
from time to time be issued.

Persons upon whose training for the occupa-
tion of teacher public money has been spent
cannot be appointed until the consent of the

appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. Candidates must show:—

(1) That they have served for at least five years in all in an Office under a Quantity Surveyor or under an Architect and Surveyor or under a Builder and Contractor.

(2) That the works upon which they were engaged during that period were such as to afford them the opportunity of gaining a satisfactory knowledge of their profession.

(3) That they have fully profited by their practical training and possess the necessary qualifications and experience.

5. H.M. Office of Works will take such steps as they think most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancies which they desire to fill, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

6. Applications shall be addressed in the first instance to the Secretary, H.M. Office of Works, and shall be made on a form to be obtained from the Establishment Officer of that Department, which must be stamped by the applicant with a "Civil Service" stamp or stamps of the value of five shillings; this fee is payable in respect of the application and will not be returned in any circumstances.

Applications will be scrutinised by the Office of Works in association with the Civil Service Commissioners and the candidates who appear to be best qualified under the regulations will be submitted to an examination in the following subjects and will be required to pay a fee of £3 before the examination, in addition to the fee of five shillings payable on application:—

(1) ENGLISH COMPOSITION.—Write a report on some subject connected with the Profession or the Building Industry.

(2) QUANTITIES.

(a) Taking out quantities from drawings, squaring dimensions, abstracting and billing.

(b) A practical test in the measurement of works executed and in reading and interpreting drawings.

(c) Preparation of variation accounts. Measuring and adjusting additions and omissions in connection with variations arising during the progress of works, pricing and agreeing final accounts with contractors.

(3) ESTIMATING.—Estimating and valuing, including pricing Bills of Quantities and analysis of prices.

(4) MATERIALS AND SPECIFICATIONS.—Use and properties of materials. Specifications for Building Works.

(5) DRAWING.—Details of construction (including the theory of construction) in Architectural Works.

The candidate will be required to qualify in each of the above subjects.

Candidates who are Professional Associates of the Chartered Surveyors' Institution, having qualified under Sub-Division III (Q. Quantities—Typical), or are Fellows of the Faculty of the Surveyors of Scotland, or who have passed the examinations prescribed for such qualification, will be exempted from the examination. A candidate so exempted will be required to pay a fee of £3 before admission to interview by the Selection Board.

7. Candidates who pass the examination or are exempted therefrom will be summoned to appear before a Selection Board, who will recommend for the vacancies existing those candidates who appear to them to possess the highest qualifications, provided they find them qualified. The Selection Board will be nominated by the Civil Service Commissioners in consultation with the Office of Works who will be represented thereon. The decision of the Selection Board will be final.

Until further notice special consideration will be given to candidates who served in His Majesty's Forces during the War between the 4th August, 1914, and the 11th November, 1918.

8. The appointment of selected candidates will be subject to their satisfying the Civil Service Commissioners of their eligibility in respect of age, nationality, health and character, and will not be confirmed unless and until they have passed the prescribed period of probation to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of H.M. Works.

MARCH GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade forthwith by the March Gas and Coke Company, Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is Market Place, March, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934 for all or some of the following (amongst other) purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company to supply gas within the following areas in the County of the Isle of Ely (in this Notice referred to as "the limits of supply") viz:—So much of the urban district of March and of the rural districts of North Witchford and Wisbech as lies within three miles from the point on March Bridge at which a line drawn down the centre of the road over that bridge would cross a line drawn down the centre of the Old River Nene.

2. To prescribe the date or dates upon which the several provisions of the intended Order shall come into operation.

3. To authorise the Company to continue maintain and use any existing gas mains pipes and works belonging to them within the limits of supply and to apply to such mains pipes and works the provisions of the intended Order and of the Acts incorporated therewith.

4. To define and limit the capital and borrowing powers of the Company for the purposes of the undertaking to be authorised by the intended Order, which undertaking is in this Notice referred to as "the undertaking."

5. To make provisions as to the sale by auction or tender of shares issued by the Company for the purposes of the undertaking.

6. To empower the directors of the Company to reserve a proportion of any future issue of

shares for the purposes of the undertaking for exclusive offer to employees of the Company and to consumers of gas supplied by the Company and to make provisions as to the terms and conditions of issue.

7. To empower the Company with the consent of the Board of Trade to offer shares for subscription by employees of the Company and to consumers of gas supplied by the Company without first offering the same for sale by public auction or tender.

8. To empower the Company to maintain, erect, alter, improve and renew gasworks with all necessary machinery and apparatus and to make and store gas and to work up and convert residual products upon the land hereinafter described and to purchase and use material required to work up and convert residual products.

The said land is:—

A piece of land belonging or reputed to belong to the Company containing 1.895 acres or thereabouts situate in the urban district of March being the enclosure numbered 1635A in the parish of March on the 2500 Ordnance Map Cambridgeshire (Isle of Ely) Sheet XVI. 1 Edition of 1927 and Sheet XVI. 5 Edition of 1926.

9. To empower the Company to purchase lands by agreement and to hold the same and to sell or lease any lands vested in or acquired by them.

10. To authorise the Company to purchase or take on lease, houses for employees and offices, showrooms and buildings, to erect, maintain and let buildings, and to provide, maintain and equip recreation grounds for the use and benefit of their employees.

11. To make provision as to the declaration by the Company from time to time of the calorific value or values of the gas to be supplied by them and the alteration of such calorific value or values, and to make provision as to the pressure of the gas to be supplied by the Company.

12. To provide that the Company shall charge for gas supplied by them according to the number of heat units contained therein and to make provisions as to the method of ascertainment of the number of heat units supplied.

13. To provide that certain of the provisions of the intended Order shall have effect as if they were contained in an Order made under Section 1 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920.

14. To fix a basic price for the gas to be supplied by the Company within the limits of supply with liberty (if thought fit) to charge different prices in different parts of the said limits and to make provision as to the revision of such basic price.

15. To prescribe the maximum charges to be made by the Company for the hire of prepayment meters and fittings.

16. To prescribe a basic amount which may be divided among the shareholders of the Company out of the profits of the undertaking and to empower the Company in certain circumstances to apply the profits of the undertaking in the division among the shareholders of an amount in excess of the basic amount and in forming or increasing a reserve fund and for the benefit of all or some of the employees of the Company and to make provision for determining the amount of the said profits to be applied as aforesaid.

17. To empower the Company or the directors thereof to establish a Reserve Fund, a Special Purposes Fund and a Renewal Fund, to provide for the application of those funds respectively and to make provision with respect to the appropriation of the existing reserve fund and certain revenue balances of the Company.

18. To make provision as to the period in which gas supplied in the limits of supply shall be deemed to have been supplied by the Company in case meter indices are read before or after such date or dates as the intended Order may prescribe.

19. To make special provisions as to the supply of gas to premises abutting on streets forming the boundary of but outside the limits of supply and as to the breaking up of such streets for the purpose of affording such supply.

20. To make provisions with respect to:— the laying of pipes in private streets, the laying of pipes for ancillary purposes, the specification and regulation of the materials, size and position and the laying of pipes, fittings and appliances on the premises of consumers, the position of meters, the relief of the Company from obligation to supply gas in certain circumstances, the prevention of the improper use of gas, the supply of gas fittings &c. by the Company and the exemption thereof from distress &c., the notice to be given in respect of the discontinuance of a supply of gas, the inspection and testing of meters and the charges for special reading of meters.

21. To provide for the setting up of schemes for enabling employees of the Company to participate in the profits of the undertaking and to deposit savings and other money with the Company for the issue to the employees of shares of the Company and for the disposal of shares and deposits on the death of any employee.

22. To authorise the directors of the Company to grant superannuation and other allowances, gratuities and pensions and to make other payments to the employees of the Company and the widows, families and dependants of such persons, to enter into and carry into effect agreements with insurance companies and others for securing such allowances, gratuities, pensions and other payments and to apply the revenues of the undertaking for those purposes.

23. To empower the directors of the Company to subscribe to hospitals and other charitable objects and to the benevolent and sick funds of the employees of the Company and to apply the revenues of the undertaking for those purposes.

24. To authorise the Company to establish superannuation schemes, to make payments to any superannuation fund formed for the benefit of their employees and to apply the revenues of the undertaking for those purposes.

25. To make provisions as to the authentication and service of notices by the Company the recovery of sums due or payable to the Company in respect of the sale or hire of apparatus and fittings for or in connection with the consumption or use of gas or the provision of materials and work in connection therewith or the fixing, setting up, repairing, altering, maintaining or removal thereof, the recovery of demands and penalties and the inclusion of several sums in one summons.

26. To confer upon the Company all other powers commonly conferred upon gas undertakers.

27. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

28. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification or to render inapplicable to the Company all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts the Gasworks Clauses Act 1847 and the Gasworks Clauses Act 1871.
