Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section r of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendment and prescribe the 30th day of April, 1937, as the date from which the said amendment shall come into force.

There shall be inserted after Clause 76 the following Clause, that is to say:—

"76(A). The operation of Clauses 75 and 76 shall be suspended during the period commencing the 30th day of April, 1937, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1937."

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 32 of the Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade under the provisions of the said Clause and of sub-section (5) of Section I of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 30th day of April, 1937, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

- 1. Clause 64 shall be deleted.
- 2. Clause 65 shall be renumbered "64".
- 3. There shall be inserted immediately preceding Clause 66 the following Clause, that is to say:—
- "65. If the operation of the Act be extended beyond the 31st day of December 1937 the Board shall in the years 1938 and 1939 before the 1st day of April in each year redetermine the annual export basic tonnage and the annual inland basic tonnage of each coal mine. Such annual basic tonnages shall be the tonnages of coal supplied from that coal mine for export supply and inland supply respectively in the year (hereinafter called 'the basic year') ending on the 31st day of December then last past after adjustment in manner following, viz.:—
 - (i) by the addition of tonnage equal to the additional tonnage which, in the opinion of the Board, would have been supplied in the basic year from that coal mine for export supply or inland supply, as the case may be.

but for any strike or lock-out or accident which prevented or restricted the getting of coal from the coal mine for not less than six consecutive working days;

- ii) in the case of a coal mine whose output in the basic year fell below the output of such coal mine in any year from 1931 to 1936 inclusive by not less than 20 per cent. owing to exceptional mining difficulties by such addition (not exceeding the additional tonnage which, in the opinion of the Board, would have been supplied by such coal mine for export supply or inland supply if such difficulties had been overcome by the 1st day of January in the basic year to the extent that they had been overcome by the 31st December in the basic year) as shall be fair and equitable having regard to the interests of the other owners;
- (iii) in the case of a coal mine having Excluded Works Tonnage by the subtraction from the tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine for inland supply in the basic year of the tonnage of coal supplied from such coal mine to Excluded Works of the owner of such coal mine for consumption in such works; and
- (iv) in the case of a coal mine part of the coal from which was supplied for export supply or inland supply in the basic year in breach of any of the provisions of the Scheme, by the subtraction from the tonnage of coal supplied from the coal mine in the basic year for export supply or inland supply, as the case may be, of such a tonnage as having regard to the circumstances of the case the Board shall consider just."
- 4. Clause 66 shall have effect as if for the words beginning "If the operation of the Act" down to the words "in each second year" there were substituted the words "If the operation of the Act be extended beyond the 31st day of December 1940 the Board shall before the 1st day of April 1941 and subsequently before the 1st day of April in each second year.'
- 5. For Clause 67 there shall be substituted the following Clause, that is to say: -
- "67. The annual basic tonnages determined by the Board under Clause 65 shall come into operation on the 1st day of April 1938 and 1939 respectively. The annual basic tonnages coming into operation on the 1st day of April 1938 shall remain in force for 12 months. annual basic tonnages coming into operation on the 1st day of April 1939 shall remain in force for two years, and the annual basic tonnages determined under Clause 66 shall come into operation on the 1st day of April in the year 1941 and subsequently on the 1st day of April in each second year and shall remain in force for a period of two years."
- 6. Clause 68 shall have effect as if for the number '' 64'' number '' 65.'' there were substituted the
- Clause 69 shall have effect as if for paragraph (2) thereof there were substituted the following paragraph, that is to say:
- "(2) If at any time after the 1st day of January 1934 a closed or abandoned colliery has been reopened, the Board may from time to time during a period of three years from such reopening determine the annual basic

tonnages of the coal mine provided that this paragraph shall not apply to any such closed or abandoned colliery as follows, viz.:-

- (a) a colliery opened in the years 1936 or 1937 and forming part of an undertaking having an output in the year 1935;
- (b) a colliery reopened in the year 1938 and forming part of an undertaking having an output in 1937;
- (c) a colliery reopened after the 31st December 1938 and forming part of an undertaking having an output in 1938."
- 8. Clause or shall have effect as if the following proviso were added at the end thereof, that is to say:-
 - "Provided that if at any time the operation of Clauses 108 to 113 shall be suspended this Clause, whilst such suspension continues, shall have effect as if the words 'in accordance with the shares determined for such owners as hereinafter provided of the trade of the district for export supply and inland supply 'were omitted.''
- o. There shall be inserted after Clause 113 the following Clause, that is to say:
 - "113A. The operation of Clauses 108 to 113 shall be suspended during the period commencing the 30th day of April 1937 and ending on the 30th day of September 1937."

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT BY COM-PETITIVE SELECTION OF ASSISTANT CURATORS IN THE ROYAL BOTANIC GARDENS, KEW.

Appointments under these Regulations are open to candidates of either sex. The Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Application for appointment shall be made in the first instance to the Secretary, Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Ministry. When a vacancy occurs, the Ministry will cause notice to be given by an advertisement in the Press, which will include a statement of the last day fixed for the receipt of applications.

2. A candidate must have attained the age of 24 and must not have attained the age of 35 on the last day fixed for the receipt of appli-

cations.

3. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.

4. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to apply for

appointment.

6. The completed application forms will be scrutinised by the Ministry and selected candidates will be interviewed by a Board consisting of representatives of the Ministry and of the Civil Service Commissioners.
