## SCHEDULE.

The Durham District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

- 1. Clause 64 shall be deleted.
- 2. Clause 65 shall be renumbered "64".
- 3. There shall be inserted immediately preceding Clause 66 the following Clause, that is to say:—
- "65. If the operation of the Act be extended beyond the 31st day of December 1937 the Board shall in the years 1938 and 1939 before the 1st day of April in each year redetermine the annual export basic tonnage and the annual inland basic tonnage of each coal mine. Such annual basic tonnages shall be the tonnages of coal supplied from that coal mine for export supply and inland supply respectively in the year (hereinafter called 'the basic year') ending on the 31st day of December then last past after adjustment in manner following, viz.:—
  - (i) by the addition of tonnage equal to the additional tonnage which, in the opinion of the Board, would have been supplied in the basic year from that coal mine for export supply or inland supply, as the case may be.
