Whereas in pursuance of Clause 22 of the Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section I of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 13th day of May, 1937, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The Warwickshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended as follows:—

- I. For Clause 3 there shall be substituted the following Clause, that is to say:—
- "3.—(i) For the purpose of the Scheme there shall be constituted an Executive Board composed of representatives of all the owners nominated to the Board in manner hereinafter provided

(ii) Every coal mine having an annual output standard tonnage of 100,000 tons or over shall be a Class A coal mine and every other coal mine shall be a Class B coal mine.

(iii) Every owner of a Class A coal mine shall be entitled to nominate one representative and the owner, if only one, or all the owners acting together if more than one of the Class B coal mine or coal mines shall be entitled to nominate

one representative to the Board.

(iv) Every owner of a Class A coal mine may and the owner, if only one, or all the owners acting together, if more than one, of Class B coal mine or coal mines may nominate a deputy representative to attend in the unavoidable absence of his or their representative and may substitute from time to time a different representative or deputy representative for those originally nominated, but all such nominations

for the purpose of this Clause shall be notified in writing to the Secretary:

Provided that:

- (a) No Deputy Representative shall be entitled to be present or to vote at any meeting at which the same owners or group of owners' Representative is present, save that if a Deputy Representative has also been appointed Representative of another owner or group of owners he may be present and vote on behalf of the last mentioned owner or owners, and
- (b) Every appointment or withdrawal of a Representative and Deputy Representative shall in the case of owners of Class A coal mines or the owners of Class B coal mines, if only one, be by writing under the hands of a Director and the Secretary of the owner Company or if the owner is an individual under his hand and in the case of the owners of the Class B coal mines (if more than one) by a Resolution of such owners in General Meeting certified in writing by the Chairman of the Meeting at which the Resolution is passed.
- (v) The Representative and Deputy Representative of the owners of Class B coal mines if more than one shall retire from the Board at the date of the Annual General Meeting but shall be eligible for re-election.
- (vi) The Board shall have power subject to the provisions of the Scheme:—
 - (a) to make all such rules and regulations and to do all such things as may be necessary or expedient for effecting the object of the Scheme; and
 - (b) to appoint any person to be an Independent Chairman having such powers upon any question arising out of the working of the Scheme as are vested in the Chairman under the Scheme."
- 2. Clause 4A shall have effect as if for paragraphs (iii) and (iv) thereof there were substituted the following paragraphs, that is to say:—
- "(iii) The Sales Committee shall consist of the Controller and representatives of all the owners, one representative being nominated by each owner of a Class A coal mine and one representative being appointed by the owner of the Class B coal mine or all the owners of Class B coal mines acting together.
- (iv) Every owner of a Class A coal mine may and the owner of the Class B coal mine or all the owners of Class B coal mines acting together may nominate a deputy representative to attend in the unavoidable absence of his or their representative and may substitute from time to time a different representative or deputy representative for those originally nominated, but all such nominations for the purpose of this Clause shall be notified in writing to the Secretary and to the Controller:

Provided that:-

- (a) Every nomination to the Sales Committee shall be notified to the Secretary and to the Controller within three days after it has been made;
- (b) Both the Representative and Deputy Representative of an owner or group of owners shall be entitled to be present at every meeting of the Sales Committee and either of them but not both of them shall be entitled

to speak and to vote on behalf of the same owner or group of owners on any proposition or resolution before the meeting;

- (c) Any Representative or Deputy Representative who shall not be entitled to speak and vote as aforesaid on behalf of one owner or group of owners may nevertheless speak and vote on behalf of another owner or group of owners for whom he acts as Representative or Deputy Representative; and
- (d) The provisions of sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (iv) and paragraph (v) of Clause 3 of the Scheme shall apply to the Sales Committee in the same manner as they apply to the Board."
- 3. There shall be inserted after Clause 4A the following Clause, that is to say:—
- "4B.—(i) Meetings of the owners of Class B coal mines shall be held at such times and places as such owners shall think fit and shall be convened by the Secretary.
- (ii) A General Meeting of the owners of Class B coal mines shall be held before the 30th day of June, 1937, and subsequently in the month of January in every year. The business of such Annual General Meeting shall include the election of the Representative and Deputy Representative on the Board and on the Sales Committee for the twelve months following such retirement.
- (iii) The Secretary shall upon receipt of any requisition for a meeting of the owners of Class B coal mines signed by or on behalf of not less than two of such owners summon a meeting of such owners:

Provided that the purpose for which the meeting is required shall be specified in every such requisition and in the notice summoning the meeting. If the Secretary shall neglect to summon a meeting of the owners of Class B coal mines as aforesaid for seven days from the date of service of the requisition on him, the signatories of the requisition may themselves convene the meeting.

- (iv) The owners of Class B coal mines present at any such meeting may appoint a Chairman of the meeting who shall preside thereat but shall not have a second or casting vote.
- (v) Two owners of Class B coal mines shall form a quorum at any meetings of such owners. No business shall be transacted at any such meeting unless a quorum be present.
- (vi) Each owner of a Class B coal mine shall by notice in writing to the Secretary nominate a representative being an owner or where the owner is a Corporation, a Director, Secretary or other principal officer of such Corporation to attend general meetings of such owners and (if an individual) may nominate himself. Each owner may further in like manner nominate a substitute to attend any meeting when the first nominated representative is unable to attend general meetings of owners of Class B coal mines.
- (vii) The provisions of Clauses 5 to 11 inclusive of the Schedule to the Scheme shall apply mutatis mutandis to the meetings of the owners of class B coal mines in the same way as they are applicable to meetings of the Board."

- 4. Clause r6B shall have effect as if the following paragraph were added at the end thereof, that is to say:—
- "(v) The operation of this Clause shall be suspended during the period commencing on the 13th day of May 1937 and ending on the 30th day of September 1937."
