Venice, Feb. 23. The Convey which filled heace on Saturday lant, has micherto had a profperous Wind, with them ale fene fome hundreds of flaves to be employed aboard our (ualies, and fome Companies of Foot for the xe-imforterfient of the Garrifon in Cendia; Segnior fuanme Morefini who commands them, is to enter upon the Charge of Proveditor to the Armats, in the room of Seggior Lotere Cornaro, who is recalled to a filit in the Courcilr

Ois Sunfay arrived here a Gally from Dalmatia, confroming to os the late deteat af a pary of soo turks; and farther tel ithy ffs, that the Enemy is makinj Ceveral Magazines; whreredf one at climo, in which they lay up large quantities of all fors of provitions capable to ferve a grear Ang, wh ch ibe Grond Seytior inten is to emplay in the le paits ; particularly defigning to lay frege to Catraro, which in now well forified and furnifhed with great Guns and all other Neceffa: res for its defence, and the peeple well provided "ith Arms as well as courage and refolution to oppole $t$ em to the urmoft. The poople hare every where withdrawn their Goods and Catle our of the Villages into the frong Towns: fo that the Jurks hive litele encouragement to make any incurfions, where they are not like toget any thing butblows. In the mean time the Morlacks in leveral parties have entred the Turkifh quarters, and frequenty retu $n$ with many heads of Catele and o-her boory.

Here is newly come in a thip in eight days from Smirna, the Mafter of her informing us, that ar his departure thance there arrived two of the Ottoman Gallies from canea with feveral wounded Turks, forme of them perfons of Quality, whazffi med thar the Venetians in Candia had by the ipriaging of their Mines, and a ftrong Sally killed between 4 and 500 , Turks, and mivht have done much more exectstion, had they nor been ordered to retreat by their Commanders, and that fome thoufands of the Janifaries lying ready to embark at Scioupon 6 men of war of Tripely and 16 Beiler Gallits which there attend $d$ hem ; upon the news of the fuccefs of this Sally made by the Venerians at ciandia fell into a mutiny, in which they killed their Commanders, and were piefligg the fhips to carry them back again so Conftantinople. He farcher tels us, that he met in the Archipelago with our Admiral Morofini, with a! quadron of 27 flups, and with him the Noble Nicolo Zine, who was feouring thofe feas aad attending the motion of fuch fuicors as were intended tobe fent from' Alexandria, Sorias and wher parts for the recuit of the Vifiers Army.

Notwithfanding the Euccefs of the late Sally, the Turks are faid to be again returned to their Pufts, and continus to prefs the Towñ as much as formierly.

On Saturday lat the Council ordered an Extrandinary Courrier to befent into France, to know His Moft Chrifrian Majefties fintl and full refo. ucion wher fuccors he will be pleafed to lind for cur affiftance, and to defire that all poflible diligence moy be ufed in haftning them to that worik, that they may arrive timely for the prefervation of the place.

Nancy, Fab. ì4. The French forces being now withdrawn from Ponr-a-Moutfon, and the Marethal de Crequy returned for Paris, all things are here in a quier and perceable pofure, and the Court incent upon whit Shall be agreed upon by the Deputies affembled at Weifombourg for the Enal determination of all di pares between the Duke of Lorrain and the Prince Elector Yalatine, who have freguent conferorices upon that fubject.

The Count Marcin perceiving that shere is not like to be mucha ation in the ${ }^{2}$ parts this Summer, all things being at prefene difpofed for peace, has by a late Courrier fent his Letters to Madrid, humbly defiring that fince his preience heremy wi:hout prejudice to thefe Countries be difpenced with, Her Majefty would te pleafed to give him leave to ferve the Republick of Venice in the defence of the Kingdom of Candia, with fuch of her forces as ars to be fent out of Spain and Italy for that Cervice.
A Coursier arriving yefterday from spain, informs us, that Doa Juan of Aujtria was arrived the 2oth palt at Gundalijaia about so leagues from Madrid, witha Train of his own iervanrs and followers of about 500 perfont, of which che Que n having notice, immediately lent the Ma\#ter of her Houthold to confer with him, who is not yes fully fatisfied of the intentions of the Court towards himg the Confeffor concinuing fill his Authority.
Paris, Marct 9. On Wednelday laft His Majelly ardered a Camp to be formed near St. Germains for lis forces, where chey are fur fome dayes to exercife.

Yefterday arived a Courrier from Spain, informing His Majefy that the King of spain was lately fallen into a feavourifh diftemper, for which he had been letblood in the foor, which had much moderated his feavour.

Yefterday were put in here by contrary winds two dhips from London bound for Cadis, and this day the Foln and srergaret of the fame plate, intended for the Eaf-Iadies, and one fhip of Briftol from Amfterdam bound for Rechelle.
