The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School having, in virtue of the powers conferred upon them by the Public Schools Act, 1868, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, made a Scheme which was sealed on the 1st day of May, 1937, in the terms appended hereto for further amending and altering the original Scheme (approved by Order in Council of the 12th day of February, 1876), for the removal of the said School from its former site, the said Scheme is hereby published in the London Gazette in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Act.

And notice is hereby given, that any person, body of persons, or body corporate, authorised in that behalf by the said Act, may, within two months after the publication of this notification, petition His Majesty in Council to withhold His approval from the whole or any part of the said Scheme.

SCHEME FOR FURTHER AMENDING AND ALTERING THE SCHEME APPROVED BY ORDER IN COUNCIL OF THE 12TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1876, FOR THE REMOVAL OF SHREWSBURY SCHOOL FROM ITS ACTUAL SITE.

Whereas by the Public Schools Act, 1868, 31 and 32 Vict., Cap. 118, it is (among other things) enacted as follows:—

Section 25. Any Scheme authorised to be made under this Act may contain all powers and provisions that may be thought expedient for carrying into effect its objects; and where

any Scheme authorises the purchase or acquisition of any lands, there shall be deemed to be incorporated with such Scheme "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845" with the exception of the provisions relating to the purchase of lands otherwise than by agreement, and of the provisions relating to entry upon land, to intersected lands, and to the recovery of forfeitures, penalties, and costs, and of the provisions relating to access to the special Act.

By Section 26 it is provided (among other things) that the new Governing Body of Shrewsbury School may, if they deem it expedient, at any time after the passing of the Act lay a Scheme before Her Majesty in Council for the removal of the School from its actual site to some other place, and may provide in such Scheme for the sale or mortgage of any property belonging to or held in trust for such School, and for its appropriation to building or other purposes, and for the purchase of other property, and for the erection of new buildings on the property so purchased, and generally for all matters required to effect such removal in a convenient manner, to the same extent as if such Governing Body were the absolute owners of any property they might be dealing with under this section as purchasers, vendors, or otherwise.

And whereas divers other Acts of Parliament have since been passed continuing and enlarging the powers conferred by the above mentioned Act, and in particular it was by the 2nd Section of the Public Schools Act, 1869, enacted that "Any Governing Body established for any of the Schools to which the said Act (meaning the said Public Schools Act, 1868) applies shall, as in the case of Westminster

School, be a Body Corporate with perpetual succession and a Common Seal and with power to hold lands for the purposes of the School for which it is established without licence of mortmain";

And whereas in pursuance of a Scheme proposed by the Governing Body of Shrewsbury School (hereinafter called "the Governing Body") on the Twenty-first day of August One thousand eight hundred and seventy-five for the removal of Shrewsbury School (hereinafter called "the Original Scheme"), which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council on the Twelfth day of February One thousand eight hundred and seventy-six, the Governing Body acquired by purchase the messuages buildings and land situate at Kingsland near Shrewsbury delineated upon the plan annexed hereto and therein coloured pink for the purposes of Shrewsbury School aforesaid (hereinafter called the School), which was removed to the new site accordingly:

And whereas in the years 1890 and 1891 the Governing Body acquired by purchase divers others lands (which are adjacent to the said lands coloured pink on the said plan and are therein coloured pale green) for the purposes of the School, and such purchase and the purchase of other land subsequently acquired which is coloured pale blue on the said plan, were sanctioned by an Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the Twenty-fifth day of May One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria in Council dated the Twenty-eighth day of October One thousand eight hundred and ninety-two:

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and twelve the Governing Body acquired the freehold land delineated and coloured yellow on the said plan and the leasehold land delineated and coloured dark blue therein for the purposes of the School, and such purchases were sanctioned by another Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the Eighteenth day of January One thousand nine hundred and twelve, which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His late Majesty King George V in Council dated the Fourteenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and twelve:

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuage land and hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured orange for the purposes of the School, and in the year One thousand nine hundred and seventeen the Governing Body acquired the leasehold land delineated on the said plan and therein coloured brown for the purposes of the School, and the said purchases were sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the Twenty-first day of April One thousand nine hundred and twenty, which Amending Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His late Majesty King George V in Council dated the Twenty-second day of July One thousand nine hundred and twenty:

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one the Governing Body

acquired by purchase the freehold messuages land and hereditaments delineated and coloured mauve on the said plan for the purposes of the School in consideration of an annual rent-charge of Three hundred pounds for twenty years, and at or about the same time the Governing Body acquired the leasehold hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured magenta for the purposes of the School. And the said purchases were sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the Eighth day of August One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, which Amending Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His late Majesty King George V in Council dated the Thirty-first day of October One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one:

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuages lands and hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured dark green for the purposes of the School, and the said purchase was sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the Eleventh day of April One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four, which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His late Majesty King George V in Council dated the Twenty-fifth day of June One thousand nine hundred and twenty-four:

And whereas in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty the Governing Body acquired by purchase the freehold messuages lands and hereditaments delineated on the said plan and therein coloured Burnt Sienna for the purposes of the School and the said purchase was sanctioned by a further Amending Scheme proposed by the Governing Body on the Twenty-first day of December One thousand nine hundred and twenty-nine, which Scheme was duly approved and sanctioned by an Order of His late Majesty King George V in Council dated the Twenty-eighth day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty:

And whereas all the said purchases were greatly for the benefit of the School and were rendered necessary chiefly by the increase in the number of boys attending the School:

And whereas for some years past owing to the increasing number of Boarders attending the School it has been necessary for the Governing Body to license for the reception of Boarders what are called "Waiting Houses" that is houses occupied by Assistant Masters at the School who are authorised to take for a time Boarders for whom room cannot immediately be found in one of the ordinary Boarding Houses:

And whereas for the past three years a house and garden known as "Marycourt" held by the Governing Body under a Lease for a term of three years expiring on the Twenty-fifth day of March One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven has been so licensed by them as a "Waiting House":

And whereas the owner of the said house has refused to extend the said Lease and is desirous of selling the said house and garden:

And whereas it is essential that the said house should continue to be available as a "Waiting House":

And whereas under the circumstances aforesaid by an Agreement dated the Eighth day of

April One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven the Governing Body have agreed with Robert Geoffrey Cooper of Bellstone, Shrewsbury aforesaid, Auctioneer (conditionally on the sanction of His Majesty in Council being obtained to this Scheme) to purchase and the said Robert Geoffrey Cooper has agreed to sell the Marycourt property (being the property described in the Schedule hereto and delineated on the plan hereto annexed and coloured yellow hatched green) for the sum of one thousand six hundred and fifty pounds the said purchase to be completed on the Twenty-fourth day of June One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven:

And whereas the purchase of the Marycourt property from the said Robert Geoffrey Cooper is very desirable in the interests of the School for the reasons hereinbefore appearing:

And whereas it is apprehended that the Governing Body have not power under the Original Scheme or the said Amending Schemes to acquire the Marycourt property described in the Schedule hereto:

The Governing Body of Shrewsbury School do hereby propose by virtue of and in pursuance of the powers hereinbefore mentioned to alter the Original Scheme as follows (that is to say):—

That the Original Scheme shall throughout be read and construed as though the messuage land and hereditaments described in the said Schedule hereto and delineated on the plan hereto annexed and therein coloured yellow hatched green had been described in the Schedule to the Original Scheme and delineated on the Plan thereto annexed and therein coloured as last aforesaid, And that the said Agreement of the Eighth day of April One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven and the carrying into effect thereof may be deemed to have been authorised by the Original Scheme.

THE SCHEDULE hereinbefore referred to:

First All that piece or parcel of land situate at Kingsland in the Parish of Meole Brace in the Borough of Shrewsbury and lying to the North of the road constructed by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the said Borough and having a frontage to the said road of ninety-nine feet or thereabouts and containing by admeasurement one thousand six hundred and fifty-three and a half square yards or thereabouts and delineated on the Plan drawn on the back of an Indenture of Lease dated the First day of January One thousand eight hundred and eighty-four and made between the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the said Borough of Shrewsbury of the first part Charles Cecil Cotes and Robert William Duff of the second part and William Dickens Lewis of the third part and therein coloured Pink whereby the said piece or parcel of land was demised by the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses to the said William Dickens Lewis for the term of ninety-nine years from the Twenty-fifth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three at the yearly rent of six pounds and under and subject to the covenants on the part of the Lessee and conditions therein contained including a covenant that the Lessee would within three years after the execution of the said Lease erect and complete upon the said piece of land a messuage with suitable outbuildings and other conveniences of not less annual value than

sixty pounds at least exclusive of the ground rent thereby reserved.

And secondly All that piece or parcel of land situate at Kingsland aforesaid lying to the north of the said road being the westerly half of the plot coloured Pink and numbered 45 on the Plan drawn on the back of an Indenture of Lease dated the First day of July One thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine and made between the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the first part Sidney Herbert and Sir Herbert Eustace Maxwell Baronet of the second part and John Robinson of the third part whereby plots 45 and 46 containing in the whole two thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine square yards or thereabouts of the Kingsland Estate of the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses and having a frontage to the said road of one hundred and sixty-five feet or thereabouts were demised by the said Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses unto the Lessee for the term of ninety-nine years from the Twenty-fifth day of March One thousand eight hundred and eighty-three at the yearly rent of six pounds under and subject to the covenants on the part of the Lessee and conditions therein contained which said westerly half of the plot numbered 45 aforesaid was by virtue of divers mesne assignments and ultimately by an Indenture dated the Nineteenth day of September One thousand eight hundred and ninety-six and made between Henry Charles Clarke Town Clerk of the Borough of Shrewsbury aforesaid of the first part the Mayor Aldermen and Burgesses of the said Borough of the second part and Frederick Hezekiah Potts of the third part assigned and confirmed unto the said Frederick Hezekiah Potts for all the residue then unexpired of the said term of ninety-nine years granted by the said last-mentioned Lease except the last eleven years of the said term subject to an annual rent of two pounds five shillings, being a proportion of the said rent of six pounds reserved by the said Lease. All which said premises *first and secondly* hereinbefore described are delineated on the Plan hereto annexed and therein coloured yellow hatched green and were formerly known as "Burwardsley Down," but are now known as "Marycourt."

The Common Seal of the before-named Governing Body was hereunto affixed by their Order on the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven.
