

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND,

(Dated 14th May, 1937.)

No. 9/1937.

Whereas it is desirable that the Parish of Comberbach included in the Winsford sub-district of Northwich Registration District by the provisions of the County of Chester Registration Scheme, 1937, should be included in the Northwich sub-district of the same Registration District:

Now, therefore, the Registrar-General of Births, Deaths and Marriages in England, in the exercise of the powers conferred by Section 21 of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, and of all other powers in that behalf, with the approval and sanction of the Minister of Health, hereby orders as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Northwich Registration of Births, etc., Order, 1937, and shall come into operation on the first day of June, 1937.

(2) In this Order the term "existing sub-district" means a sub-district which existed immediately before the first day of June, 1937.

2. The Parish of Comberbach shall cease to be included in the Winsford sub-district of the Northwich Registration District and shall be added to and form part of the Northwich sub-district of the same Registration District.

3. The Registrars of Births and Deaths of the existing Winsford and Northwich sub-districts shall respectively be the Registrars of Births and Deaths of those sub-districts as altered by this Order.
