SPEED LIMIT IN BUILT-UP AREAS.

LONDON TRAFFIC AREA.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Transport under and by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (b) of sub-section (4) of Section 1 of the Road Traffic Act, 1934, intends to make the London Traffic (Built-up Areas) (No.) Order, 1937, the effect of which will be that the speed limit under that Section will apply throughout every length of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE.

Bathurst Walk, Richings Park, Iver, Buckinghamshire, between Thorney Lane and Syke Cluan.

Long Lane (B.466), Hillingdon, Middlesex, between Tudor Way and Park Way.

Somerset Way, Richings Park, Iver, Buckinghamshire, between Wellesley Avenue and a point 230 yards south-eastward thereof.

Wellesley Avenue, Richings Park, Iver, Buckinghamshire, between Bathurst Walk and Somerset Way.

River Welland Catchment Area.

Witham and Steeping Rivers Catchment Area.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, making alterations in the River Welland Catchment Area and the Witham and Steeping Rivers Catchment Area by the removal from the River Welland Catchment Area and the inclusion in the Witham and Steeping Rivers Catchment Area of the area specified in the Order, and that the Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament, unless within thirty-one days from the date of

this Notice a Memorial that the Order shall not become law without confirmation by Parliament is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected by the Order, and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a Memorial.

River Trent Catchment Board.

West Butterwick Drainage Board.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming the Order made on the 8th April, 1937, in relation to the Scheme prepared by the River Trent Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (b) of the Act, making provision for the extension of the period of office of the members of the West Butterwick Drainage Board holding office on the 31st October, 1936, until the 1st day of November, 1937.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act, or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act, or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
