The KING has been pleased to grant unto Charles Cornwallis Anderson-Pelham of Allington Hall in the County of Lincoln, Esquire, in the Commission of the Peace for the Parts of Lindsey in the said County, His Royal Licence and Authority that he may henceforth take and use the surname of Welby in addition to and after that of Anderson-Pelham, that he may take and bear the Arms of Welby quarterly with those of his own family, and that such surname and Arms may in like manner be borne and used by his issue the said Arms being first duly exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in His Majesty's College of Arms, otherwise the said Royal Licence and permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in the said College of Arms.

THE KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm bearing date the 27th day of May, 1937, to declare that the Duke of Windsor shall, notwithstanding his Instrument of Abdication executed on the 10th day of December, 1936, and His Majesty's Declaration of Abdication Act, 1936, whereby effect was given to the said Instrument, be entitled to hold and enjoy for himself only the title style or attribute of Royal Highness so however that his wife and descendants if any shall not hold the said title style or attribute.
