LAND DRAINAGE ACT, 1930.

Cheshire Rivers Catchment Board.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made an Order under the Land Drainage Act, 1930, confirming a scheme submitted to him by the Cheshire Rivers Catchment Board, under Section 4 (1) (a) of the Act, for the transfer to the Catchment Board of all such rights, powers, duties, obligations and liabilities over or in connection with the main river, as were immediately before the commencement of the said Act vested in or to be discharged by any drainage

authority, and of any property held by the authority for the purpose of, or in connection with, any functions so transferred.

A copy of the Order may be seen at all reasonable hours at the office of the Clerk of the Catchment Board, St. John's House, Chester, and also at the Offices of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, 10, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.1.

By Part III of the Second Schedule to the said Act, it is provided that if any person aggrieved by an Order desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Act, or that any requirement of the Act has not been complied with, he may, within six weeks after the publication of this notice, make an application for the purpose to the High Court, and if any such application is duly made, the Court, if satisfied that the Order is not within the powers of the Act, or that the interests of the applicant have been substantially prejudiced by any requirements of the Act not having been complied with, may quash the Order either generally or in so far as it affects the applicant.
