SCHEDULE.

All those parts of the County of Kent lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding where any road, or track, is named as a boundary, such road or track:—

On the North, from Harty Ferry on the south side of the Swale eastwards along the coast to the North Foreland.

On the East, southwards along the coast to the South Foreland.

On the South, westwards along the coast to the county boundary about 5½ miles west of Dungeness.

On the West, from this point inland along the county boundary to the point where it crosses the Rye-Tenterden road about 1½ miles north of Iden; thence northwards along this road through Wittersham to Tenterden; thence along the Tenterden-Bethersden road through High Halden to Bethersden; thence along the road by Frid Farm through Pimphurst, Lambden and Pluckley to Charing; thence along the Charing-Faversham road through Broomfield, Leaveland and Sheldwich to its junction with Watling Street at Faversham; thence westwards along Watling Street for about 1½ miles to its junction with the road which runs north-north-east through Bysing Wood to Oare; thence along this road through Oare and across the light railway to Harty Ferry.

SCHEDULE.

All those parts of the Counties of Essex, Cambridge, Hertford and Suffolk lying within a line drawn as follows, excluding where any road, track, waterway or railway line is named as a boundary, such road, track, waterway or railway line:—

On the North, the London, Midland and Scottish Railway bridge about 1 mile east of Gamlingay Station, eastwards along the line to the point where it joins the London and North Eastern Railway line near Cambridge; thence north-eastwards along the London and North Eastern Railway line through Cambridge and Burwell to Mildenhall Station; thence eastwards along the road through Barton Mills to the road junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north of the River Lark.

On the East, from this point south-eastwards along the road through Icklingham and Fornham All Saints to the point where it passes under the London and North Eastern Railway line at Bury St. Edmunds; thence southwards along the railway line through Welnetham and Cockfield to the point where it crosses the river about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile north-east of Lavenham Station; thence eastwards down the river to Chelsworth; thence south-eastwards down the River Brett through Hadleigh and Shelley to its junction with the River Stour; thence about 2 miles down the River Stour to the point where the Colchester-Stowmarket road crosses it about 1 mile south of Stratford St. Mary; thence south-westwards along the road towards Colchester to the point where it crosses the London and North Eastern Railway line near Dilbridge Hall about 1 mile north-east of Colchester.

On the South, from this point south-westwards along the London and North Eastern Railway line through Marks Tey and Chippinghill to Chelmsford Station; thence north-westwards along the Chelmsford-Bishops Stortford road to Leaden Roding; thence westwards along the road through White Roding and Hatfield Heath to Sawbridgeworth Station; thence south-westwards along the London and North Eastern Railway line to the railway junction about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile south of Rye House Station; thence north-westwards along the railway line through Ware and Hertford to the junction of this line with the Enfield and Stevenage branch line of the London and North Eastern Railway; thence southward along this line to the point where it crosses the River Lea; thence westwards along

the River Lea to the point where the Hatfield-Welwyn road crosses it.

On the West, from this point northwards along the road through Welwyn and Codicote to Hitchin; through Hitchin to the Railway Station; thence along the London and North Eastern Railway branch line to Baldock Station; thence along the Baldock-Biggleswade road to the point where at approximately $\frac{1}{2}$ mile from the village of Astwick the county boundary diverges from it in a north-easterly direction; thence along the county boundary northwards to the point where on the northern edge of Cockayne Hatley Wood and 1 mile due west of Hatley St. George it cuts a track leading to the Hatley St. George-Gamlingay road; thence along this track and across this road to the London, Midland and Scottish Railway line.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS an agreement to facilitate the proof without legalisation of certain official documents, portions of which agreement are set out in the First Schedule to this Order, has been made at Paris on the third day of April, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Government of the French Republic:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied, upon consideration of a report from the Lord Chancellor and the Secretary of State, that, having regard to the law of France as to the recognition therein of public registers of the United Kingdom as authentic records and as to the proof of the contents of such registers and other matters by means of duly authenticated certificates issued by public officers in the United Kingdom, it is desirable in the interests of reciprocity to make, with respect to public registers of France and certificates issued by public officers in France, such provision as is hereinafter made:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the powers conferred upon Him by the Evidence (Foreign, Dominion and Colonial Documents) Act, 1933, and other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Public Registers.

1. The registers kept in France, whether in the custody of *officiers de l'état civil* (registrars) or in the custody of *greffiers en chef* (clerks) of tribunals, and containing such *actes de l'état civil* (entries relating to civil status) as are specified in the first column of the Second Schedule to this Order, shall be deemed to be public registers kept under the authority of the

law of France and recognised by the courts of France as authentic records, and to be documents of such a public nature as to be admissible as evidence of the matters regularly recorded therein.

2. For the purpose of the preceding Article, the matters which are specified in the second column of the Second Schedule to this Order as regularly recorded as part of an entry of a particular description, shall, if they are recorded in such a register as aforesaid as part of an entry of that description, be deemed, until the contrary is proved, to be regularly recorded.

3. Subject to any requirements of rules of court, a document which purports to be issued in France as an official copy of an entry in any of the registers specified in Article 1 of this Order, and which—

(a) in the case of a register in the custody of an *officier de l'état civil*, purports to be signed, and certified as in conformity with the original, by that officer or his deputy, and to bear the seal or printed or stamped emblem of the *mairie* (mayoralty), or

(b) in the case of a register in the custody of the *greffier en chef* of a tribunal, purports to be signed, and certified as in conformity with the original, by that officer or his deputy, and to bear the seal or printed or stamped emblem of the *greffe* (record office) from which the document was issued,

shall, without evidence as to the custody of the register or of inability to produce it, and without any further or other proof, be received as evidence that the register contains such an entry, if the court is satisfied that the document was issued not more than twelve months before the date on which it is sought to be used as evidence, and was so issued in response to a specific request for a complete copy of the entry in question (including the marginal notes thereto, if any).

Official Certificates.

4. Without prejudice to the effect of section seven of the Evidence Act, 1851, and subject to any requirements of rules of court, a certificate purporting to be given in France as an official certificate of any such class as is specified in the first column of the Third Schedule to this Order, and purporting to be signed by the officer, and to be authenticated in the manner, specified in the second and third columns of that Schedule respectively as appropriate in the case of a certificate of that class, shall be received as evidence of the facts stated in the certificate, if the court is satisfied that it was issued not more than three years before the date on which it is sought to be used as evidence.

General.

5. It is hereby declared that a document issued in France by a public officer, as proof of any matter for the proof of which by a document under the signature of that officer and the appropriate seal or emblem provision is made by this Order, is not, if otherwise admissible in evidence, inadmissible for any purpose by reason only that it is not authenticated by the process known as legalisation.

6.—(1) In this Order the expression "France" includes Corsica and Algeria.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

7. Nothing in this Order shall be taken to prohibit or restrict the admission in evidence of any copy, extract, summary, certificate or other document whatsoever which, apart from the provisions of this Order, would be admissible as evidence of any particular matter, or to affect any power which, otherwise than by virtue of this Order, is exercisable by any court with respect to the admission of documents in evidence.

8.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Evidence (France) Order in Council, 1937.

(2) This Order extends to the whole of the United Kingdom, and shall come into operation on the third day of June, nineteen hundred and thirty-seven.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

PORTIONS OF AN AGREEMENT MADE AT PARIS ON THE THIRD DAY OF APRIL, NINETEEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-SEVEN BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE GOVERNMENT OF THE FRENCH REPUBLIC, TO FACILITATE THE PROOF WITHOUT LEGALISATION OF CERTAIN OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland (hereafter in this Agreement referred to as "the United Kingdom") and the Government of the French Republic, desiring to facilitate the proof without legalisation of certain official documents issued in the United Kingdom or in France and intended for use in France or in the United Kingdom respectively have agreed as follows:—

Article I.

(1) The following documents, that is to say—

(a) official copies of *actes de l'état civil* (as defined in Article II (1) of this Agreement) contained in registers kept in the United Kingdom by registrars-general or by local superintendent registrars and registrars of births and deaths, or of marriages;

(b) official certificates issued by the Patent Office in London verifying copies of British patents, designs and trade marks and of other public documents deposited in the Patent Office; and

(c) official copies of judgments, decrees, orders and other judicial proceedings of any court in the United Kingdom (including entries in the Books of Council and Session or in the books of any sheriff court in Scotland) and of affidavits, pleadings or other legal documents filed or deposited in any such court,

shall, without legalisation, be admissible as evidence in France in the circumstances and to the extent indicated in Article IV (1) and (3).

(2) The following documents, that is to say—

(a) official copies of *actes de l'état civil* (as defined in Article II (2) of this Agreement) drawn up in France;

(b) official certificates verifying copies of French patents, and assignments thereof, trade marks, designs and industrial models, and of other documents deposited in the National Office of Industrial Property (*Office National de la Propriété Industrielle*); and

(c) official copies of judgments, decrees, orders or other judicial proceedings of French tribunals and of affidavits, pleadings or other legal documents filed or deposited with any such tribunals.

shall, without legalisation, be admissible as evidence in the United Kingdom in the circumstances and to the extent indicated in Article IV (2) and (3).

(3) For the purposes of this Agreement, the word "France" includes Algeria and the words "the United Kingdom" do not include the Channel Islands or the Isle of Man.

Article II.

(1) The expression "*actes de l'état civil* contained in registers kept in the United Kingdom" shall be understood for the purposes of the present Agreement to include the following entries in the public registers—

- (a) entries of births;
- (b) entries of still births (England only);
- (c) entries of marriages;
- (d) entries of deaths;
- (e) entries in the Adopted Children Register.

(2) The expression "*actes de l'état civil* drawn up in France" shall be understood for the purposes of the present Agreement to include the following—

- (a) entries of births;
- (b) entries of a declaration of a lifeless child;
- (c) entries of notice of marriage;
- (d) certificates of notice of marriage and of no caveat being entered;
- (e) entries of marriages;
- (f) entries of deaths;
- (g) entries of recognition of illegitimate children;
- (h) registrations of judgments or decrees of divorce, or of any other judgments, decrees or orders in the matter of civil status (*état civil*).

(3) The lists of *actes de l'état civil* contained in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article may be at any time varied or extended by agreement of the Contracting Parties expressed in the form of an exchange of notes.

Article III.

(1) In the United Kingdom—

(a) copies of *actes de l'état civil* (as defined in Article II (1) of this Agreement) will be certified as in conformity with the original and bear the seal of the registrar-general of births, deaths and marriages in England, Scotland or Northern Ireland, or the signature of the local superintendent registrar or

registrar of births and deaths, or of marriages, as the case may be;

(b) certificates proceeding from the Patent Office in London will bear the seal of that Department;

(c) copies of judgments, decrees, orders or other judicial proceedings of a court in the United Kingdom or of affidavits, pleadings or other legal documents filed or deposited in any such court, will bear the seal of the court to which the original document belongs, and be certified as in conformity with the original by the clerk of that court or his deputy.

(2) In France—

(a) copies of *actes de l'état civil* drawn up in France will be certified as in conformity with the original and signed by the *officier de l'état civil* or by the *greffier en chef* of the tribunal in charge of the registers containing those *actes de l'état civil* or by his deputy, and furnished with the seal of the *mairie* or of the *greffe* delivering such copies;

(b) certificates issued by the National Office of Industrial Property (*Office National de la Propriété Industrielle*) will bear the seal of the *Office National de la Propriété Industrielle* (Ministry of Commerce and Industry), and the signature of an Officer of the Ministry of Commerce and Industry authorised to sign such certificates;

(c) copies of judgments, decrees, orders or other judicial proceedings of a French tribunal, or of affidavits, pleadings or other legal documents filed or deposited in any such tribunal, will bear the seal of the *greffe* of the tribunal responsible for the judicial proceedings in question or of the tribunal in which the documents have been filed or deposited, and will be certified as in conformity with the original by the *greffier* of the tribunal or by his deputy.

Article IV.

(1) Any official copy or certificate, to which the foregoing provisions of this Agreement as to copies or certificates issued in the United Kingdom are applicable, shall, if it appears on the face of it to be genuine, and purports to be authenticated in accordance with Article III (1) of this Agreement, be admissible as evidence in France in the circumstances and to the extent hereinafter mentioned—

(a) a copy of an *acte de l'état civil* (including the marginal notes, if any) which has been issued within the preceding twelve months in response to a request for a complete copy, shall be admissible as evidence of any of the matters regularly recorded in the original entry in accordance with the law of that part of the United Kingdom in which the entry was made;

(b) a certificate verifying a copy of a patent, design or trade mark or other public document deposited in the Patent Office, issued within the preceding 3 years, shall be admissible as evidence of the deposit and custody of the original and of the correctness of the copy;

(c) a copy of a judgment, decree, order or other judicial proceeding, or of an affidavit, pleading or other legal document filed or deposited in a court, issued within the preceding 3 years, shall be admissible as evidence of any matter if the original document could be received as evidence of that matter.

(2) Any official copy or certificate to which the foregoing provisions of this Agreement as to copies of certificates issued in France are applicable shall, if it appears on the face of it to be genuine and purports to be authenticated in accordance with Article III (2), be admissible as evidence in the United Kingdom in the circumstances and to the extent hereinafter mentioned—

(a) a copy of an *acte de l'état civil* (including the marginal notes, if any) which has been issued within the preceding twelve months in response to a request for a complete copy, shall be admissible as evidence of any of the matters regularly recorded in the original entry in accordance with the law of France;

(b) a certificate verifying a copy of a patent or an assignment thereof, a trade mark, design or industrial model, issued within the preceding 3 years, shall be admissible as evidence of the deposit and custody of the original and of the correctness of the copy;

(c) a copy of a judgment, decree, order or other judicial proceeding, or of an affidavit, pleading or other legal document filed or deposited in a court, issued within the preceding 3 years, shall be admissible as evidence of any matter if the original document could be received as evidence of that matter.

(3)—

(a) In this Agreement the expression "admissible as evidence of any matter" means that the document in question shall be accepted as *prima facie* evidence of that matter;

(c) In Scotland, a copy of an *acte de l'état civil* is described as an "extract"; it is consequently understood that a Scottish document is not to be considered to be an incomplete copy because it is entitled "extract";

(d) In France, a copy of an *acte de l'état civil* is sometimes, called "*extrait*"; it is consequently understood that, subject to the under-mentioned exceptions, a French document is not to be considered to be an incomplete copy because it is entitled "*extrait*".

(i) It is provided by Article 2 of the French law of the 22nd July, 1922, that the words "of a mother unknown", "of a father unknown" and other similar statements must in no case be included in copies, even though issued as complete copies, of any *acte de l'état civil* of any kind whatsoever.

(ii) Further it is provided by Article 57 of the French Civil Code that "No person other than the *Procureur* of the Republic, the person whose birth is recorded in the entry, the direct ascendants or the spouse of that person or his guardian or legal representative, if he is a

minor or otherwise under legal disability, may obtain a certified copy of any entry of a birth other than his own, except in virtue of an authorisation given, without charge, by the *juge de paix* of the district where the entry has been made, or upon the request in writing of the person whose birth is in question. If the last-mentioned person is unable to sign his name, this inability must be attested by a *maire* or *commissaire de police*, who must, at the same time, certify that the request is made at the instance of that person. If the authorisation is refused, an application for a certified copy may be made to the President of the *tribunal civil re première instance*, who shall decide the matter *sur ordonnance de référé* (in chambers).

"The custodians of registers shall deliver to any applicant extracts showing, without any other information, the year, day, hour and place of birth, the sex of the child, the name given to him, and the names and surnames and the occupation and domicile of the father and of the mother, as they appear in the entry of the birth or in the marginal notes thereon and reproducing any note entered in accordance with the last paragraph of Article 76 of the Civil Code". (This paragraph provides that a marginal note of their marriage shall be entered on the entries of birth of persons who are married.)

(iii) It is understood that it is left to the discretion of the courts of the United Kingdom to decide whether, and if so, in what circumstances, an *extrait abrégé* (abridged extract) of an entry of birth delivered in accordance with the provisions of the last paragraph of Article 57 of the French Civil Code can be accepted as evidence under the provisions of Article IV (2) (a) of this Agreement.

Article V.

This Agreement shall not be held in any way to derogate from the requirements of any extradition treaty in force relating to proof of documents submitted in connexion with extradition proceedings, nor of any other treaty containing provisions relating to the proof of any classes of documents.

Article VIII.

This Agreement, of which both the English and French texts are authoritative, shall enter into operation two months after the date of signature, and shall remain in force until terminated by a notice given six months in advance by either of the contracting Governments to the other.

In witness whereof the undersigned have signed the present Agreement in English and French texts, of which both are equally authentic, and have affixed thereto their seals.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 33 of the North Staffordshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section I. of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 31st day of May, 1937, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

SCHEDULE.

The North Staffordshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

1. Clause 13 shall have effect as if—

(a) in sub-clause (1) for the words "The first appointment" to the end of the sub-clause there were substituted the words "The Board may appoint for each member of the Sales Committee (except the Independent Chairman) a person to act in case of need as a substitute for such member, and in the event of any member of the Committee being unavoidably prevented from attending any meeting of the Committee his substitute so appointed may attend and take part in the meeting in place of such member"; and

(b) in sub-clause (2) after the word "members" where that word occurs for the second time there were inserted the words "and substitute members";

2. Clause 52 shall have effect as if in sub-clause (1) after the words "may issue" there were inserted the words "at the request of an owner or otherwise".

3. Sub-clause (3) of Clause 56 shall have effect as if—

(a) after the word "thereto" where that word appears for the second time there were inserted the words "and that sums actually received during that period in respect of the supply of coal conform with the prices recorded in the accounts in relation to that supply"; and

(b) for the word "one" there were substituted the words "a person who is not a member of the staff of the owner, and".

4. Clause 58 shall have effect as if—

(a) in sub-clause (5) thereof for the words "month" and "monthly" wherever those words occur there were substituted the words "quarter" and "quarterly" respectively; and

(b) in sub-clause (7) thereof for the word "monthly" there were substituted the word "quarterly".

5. Clause 60 shall have effect as if at the end of sub-clause (2) there were added the words "or that exceptional mining difficulties, which substantially reduced the output of the coal mine of the owner during the year 1935, have been overcome, or that exceptional development has been undertaken by the owner by virtue of which additional tonnage may be expected to be supplied from the coal mine."

6. Clause 63 shall have effect as if in sub-clause (1) thereof the number "61" were substituted for the number "59".

7. Clause 65 shall have effect as if—

(a) for paragraph (a) of sub-clause (3) there were substituted the following paragraph:—

"(a) If during any quarter an owner shall have so supplied a tonnage of coal, or of that class of coal in excess of his relevant trade share, the Board shall debit him with a contribution calculated as follows:—

On excess tonnage not exceeding 5 per cent. of the relevant Trade Share 3d. per ton.

On the next 5 per cent. 1s. per ton.

On the remainder of such excess 2s. per ton."

(b) for paragraph (b) of sub-clause (3) there were substituted the following paragraph:—

"(b) If during any quarter an owner shall have so supplied a tonnage of coal or of that class of coal which falls short of his relevant Trade Share, the Board shall credit him with compensation calculated as follows:—

On a deficiency not exceeding 5 per cent. of the relevant Trade Share 3d. per ton.

On the next 5 per cent. 1s. per ton.

On the remainder of such shortage 2s. per ton."

(c) for paragraph (c) of sub-clause (3) there were substituted the following paragraph:—

"(c) No compensation shall be payable in respect of a deficiency or part thereof due to a request to the Sales Committee by

the owner not to issue any Consent to him, or to the inability of the owner to produce or deliver the coal from his coal mine, or to the failure of the owner to supply the tonnage of coal for which any Consent relating to supply within that quarter has been issued to him, unless he shall satisfy the Board that having taken all reasonable steps so to supply he was unable to secure the contract for such supply:

Provided that any tonnage in respect of which no compensation is payable under the provisions of this paragraph shall be divided in the proportions of the Sales Percentages in respect of coal or that class of coal of the other owners and the tonnage thus determined for each owner shall be added to the Trade Share thereof calculated under sub-clause (2) of this Clause for that quarter:

Provided further that coal for supply to his excluded works shall not be taken into account in relation to the ability of an owner to produce or deliver coal."

(d) sub-clause (4) were deleted;

(e) for sub-clause (5) thereof there were substituted the following sub-clause:—

"(4) The Board shall after the end of every quarter, send an account to each owner showing the sums due to or from that owner under the provisions of this Clause. The balance of such amounts shall be paid by the Board or the owner, as the case may be, forthwith at the end of every fourth quarter."; and

(f) for sub-clause (6) thereof there were substituted the following sub-clause:—

"(5) The operation of this Clause shall be suspended during the period commencing on the 31st day of May, 1937, and ending on the 30th day of September, 1937."

8. Clause 96 shall have effect as if for the words after "sale of coal" there were substituted the words "and in any case a person shall not be eligible to act as arbitrator in any reference if within the three years immediately preceding such reference he was professionally employed by or on behalf of an owner who is a party to that reference."

9. Clause 98 shall have effect as if for the words after "sale of coal" there were substituted the words "and in any case a person shall not be eligible to act as arbitrator in any reference if within the three years immediately preceding such reference he was professionally employed by or on behalf of an owner who is a party to that reference."

APPOINTMENT OF ADJUDICATING OFFICERS.

Whereas it is expedient that the Council of the County Borough of Croydon (in this Order referred to as "the Council") should be empowered to appoint Officers to be termed Adjudicating Officers to perform duties under the Poor Law Acts, 1930 and 1934, relating to the grant of relief and the reimbursement of the Council of the amount of any relief expended on their behalf:

Now therefore the Minister of Health, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Poor Law Act, 1930, and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Order.

Citation, &c.

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Council of the County Borough of Croydon (Adjudicating Officers) Order, 1937, and, in its application to the County Borough of Croydon, shall be read as one with the Public Assistance Order, 1930, as modified by this Order:

Provided that in case of any inconsistency the provisions of this Order shall prevail.

(2) This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1937.

MODIFICATION OF ORDERS, &c., APPLICABLE TO THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF CROYDON.

2.—(1) Any orders, rules or regulations made by the Minister and in force in the County Borough of Croydon shall, in their application to that County Borough, have effect subject to such modifications as may be necessary to give full effect to the provisions of this Order.

(2) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Public Assistance Order 1930 in its application to the County Borough of Croydon shall be modified in manner following, namely:—

(a) in paragraph (1) (b) of Article 25, before the words "a Relieving Officer," there shall be inserted the words "an Adjudicating Officer or";

(b) in paragraph (5) of Article 166, after the words "the Council," wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or an Adjudicating Officer," and after the words "when required by them," there shall be inserted the words "or him";

(c) to paragraph (1) of Article 167, there shall be added the words "and shall also attend before any Adjudicating Officer when that Officer is considering applications for relief reported to him by the Relieving Officer";

(d) in paragraph (4) of Article 167, after the word "Committee," there shall be inserted the words "and each attendance before any Adjudicating Officer";

(e) in paragraph (5) of Article 167, for the words "report to the Committee at their next meeting every application for relief made to him since their previous meeting," there shall be substituted the words "report to the Adjudicating Officer acting for his district every application for relief made to him";

(f) in paragraph (12) of Article 167, for the words "until the next ordinary meeting of the Committee," there shall be substituted the words "until his next attendance before an Adjudicating Officer."

(3) Notwithstanding the generality of the provisions of paragraph (1) of this Article, the Relief Regulation Order, 1930 (as amended by the Relief Regulation Amendment Order, 1932) in its application to the County Borough of Croydon shall be modified in manner following, namely:—

(a) in the proviso to paragraph (2) (a) of Article 11, for the word "Committee" wherever that word occurs, there shall be substituted the words "Sub-Committee or Adjudicating Officer," and the word "their" in line 7 shall be omitted;

(b) in Article 10, the proviso to Article 12 and Article 16, after the words "Committee or Sub-Committee," wherever those words occur, there shall be inserted the words "or Adjudicating Officer."

Appointment of Officers.

3. The Council shall from time to time appoint such numbers of suitable persons as they may think necessary to hold the office of Adjudicating Officer and may so appoint such numbers of suitable persons to hold the office of Assistant Adjudicating Officer and any person so appointed to either of those offices shall perform such of the duties of that office (as prescribed by this Order) in such area or areas as the Council may from time to time require.

Conditions of Service, &c.

4. Every person appointed by the Council as an Adjudicating Officer shall be a Senior Poor Law Officer.

Duties of Adjudicating Officers.

5.—(1) The duties of Adjudicating Officer shall be the following, namely:—

(a) to consider all applications for relief reported to him by Relieving Officers and Relieving Officers' Reports thereon, and, when necessary, to interview applicants for relief;

(b) to determine, in accordance with the statutory provisions and any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with rules to be prescribed by the Council for the purpose, the nature and amount of relief (if any) to be given to applicants for relief;

(c) to make orders for the grant of relief accordingly;

(d) to reconsider periodically, in accordance with any rules, orders or regulations made by the Minister in that behalf, and, subject thereto, in accordance with any rules prescribed by the Council in that behalf, the cases of persons receiving relief, and to make any necessary orders with regard thereto;

(e) to report to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee all orders for relief made by him;

(f) to refer for consideration by the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee such applications for relief reported to him by Relieving Officers and such cases due for reconsideration by him as in his opinion should be dealt with by such Sub-Committee, and also any cases falling within such classes as the Council may from time to time direct;

(g) to refer to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee for review or consideration any case in which a recipient of relief or an applicant for relief asks for reconsideration of his determination or proposed determination of his case;

(h) to keep relief Order Books and to make entries therein in accordance with the provisions of Article 22 of the Public Assistance Order, 1930, whenever he considers applications for relief or reconsiders cases in which relief has been granted;

(i) to report to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee all cases in which an application for relief has been refused, or in which on reconsideration relief has been discontinued;

(j) to determine, in accordance with such rules as may be prescribed by the Council, the amounts (if any) to be paid by recipients of relief, or the persons liable for their maintenance, towards reimbursing the Council the amount expended by them on relief;

(k) to keep a record of all determinations under the last preceding sub-paragraph and to report the same to the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee;

(l) to refer for consideration by the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee such of the cases referred to in sub-paragraph (j) as in his opinion should be dealt with by the Sub-Committee, and also any cases falling within such classes as the Council may from time to time direct;

(m) to refer for review or consideration by the appropriate Sub-Committee of the Public Assistance Committee every case in which any person affected by a determination made or proposed to be made by him under sub-paragraph (j) asks that the matter should be reconsidered;

(n) to carry out such other duties relating to the grant of relief or the reimbursement of the Council of the amount of any relief expended on their behalf as may be assigned to him by the Public Assistance Committee.

Duties of Assistant Adjudicating Officers.

(2) Assistant Adjudicating Officers shall perform such of the duties of Adjudicating Officers as the Council may from time to time prescribe and, unless expressly authorised by the Council to act as temporary substitutes for Adjudicating Officers under Article 149 of the Public Assistance Order, 1930, they shall act immediately under the direction of Adjudicating Officers.

IN THE MATTER OF THE LONDON TRAFFIC ACT, 1924.
