

SECOND SCHEDULE.

PUBLIC REGISTERS.

Description of Entry.	Matters regularly recorded.
(a) Entry of a Birth (<i>acte de naissance</i>).	(1) The date, time and place of the birth, or, in the case of a foundling, the date, and place of the finding of the child and the apparent age of the child. (2) The name and sex, and in the case of a foundling the surname, of the child. (3) The name, surname, profession and domicile, and the date and place of birth or the age, of the father and of the mother, and, if it occurs, the acknowledgment of the child by the father or mother or both.* (4) The name, surname, profession, domicile and age of the person, or each of the persons, upon whose information the entry was drawn up. (5) The date on which, and the time at which, the entry was drawn up. (6) The name, surname and official description of the <i>officier de l'état civil</i> by whom the entry was signed. (7) The subsequent acknowledgment, legitimation, adoption or marriage of the person concerned, if it occurs.†
(b) Entry of the Declaration of a Lifeless Child (<i>acte de déclaration d'enfant sans vie</i>).	(1) The date, time and place of the delivery of the child. (2) The fact that, at the time when the entry was drawn up, the child was not alive. (3) The name, surname, profession and domicile, and the date and place of birth or the age, of the father and of the mother.*‡ (4) The name, surname, profession, domicile and age of the person, or each of the persons, upon whose information the entry was drawn up, and the degree of his relationship, if any, to the child. (5) The date on which, and the time at which, the entry was drawn up. (6) The name, surname and official description of the <i>officier de l'état civil</i> by whom the entry was signed.
(c) Entry of Notice of a Marriage (<i>acte de publication de mariage</i>).	(1) The name, surname, profession and domicile, and the residence (if any), of each of the future spouses, and the place where the marriage is to be celebrated. (2) The date on which, and the time at which, the entry was drawn up or the notice posted, and the name, surname and official description of the <i>officier de l'état civil</i> by whom the entry was signed.
(d) Entry of a Marriage (<i>acte de mariage</i>).	(1) The date on which, and the time and place at which, the marriage was celebrated. (2) The names, surnames, professions, ages, dates and places of birth and domiciles, and the residences (if any), of the spouses. (3) The names, surnames, professions and domiciles of the fathers and mothers (if known) of the spouses, and, in a case where either of the spouses is a minor, the consent of his or her parents, grandparents or family council (<i>conseil de famille</i>), as the case may be, to the marriage. (4) The name and surname of any previous husband or wife of either of the spouses. (5) The declaration of the parties to the marriage that they take one another for husband and wife. (6) The names, surnames, professions and domiciles of the witnesses, and the fact that they are of age respectively. (7) The declaration that there has been, or that there has not been, made a contract of marriage, and, as far as possible, the date of the contract, if there is one, and the name and place of residence of the notary who recorded it. (8) The name, surname and official description of the <i>officier de l'état civil</i> by whom the entry was signed.
(e) Entry of a Death (<i>acte de décès</i>).	(9) The subsequent divorce of the parties, if it occurs. (1) The day, hour and place of the death.‡ (2) The name and surname, the date and place of birth or the age, and the profession and domicile, of the deceased.‡ (3) The names, surnames, professions and domiciles of the father and mother of the deceased.‡ (4) The name and surname of the spouse or former spouse of the deceased, if the deceased was married, widowed or divorced.‡

* All or some of the matters mentioned in this paragraph may not be recorded in the entry.

† The acknowledgment may not be recorded in the entry.
