PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 43 of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is enacted that His Majesty may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, prohibit the importation into the United Kingdom of arms, ammunition, gunpowder or any other goods:

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the importation of the articles hereinafter enumerated:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) As from the 1st July, 1937 the following goods shall be, and the same are hereby, prohibited to be imported into the United Kingdom:—

(i) Weapons of all descriptions designed or adapted for the discharge of any noxious liquid, gas or other thing, including component parts of any such weapon;

(ii) Ammunition containing or designed or adapted to contain any noxious liquid, gas or other thing, and component parts of any such ammunition;

(iii) Accessories to any lethal firearm or other weapon designed or adapted to diminish the noise or flash caused by firing the weapon.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods as are imported under a licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence.

(2) This Order may be cited as the Arms Import Prohibition Order, 1937.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," (42-3 V. c. 21) it is provided that the following goods may, by Proclamation or Order in Council, be prohibited either to be exported or carried coastwise:—Arms, ammunition and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles which His Majesty shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions, or any sort of victual which may be used as food for man:

And whereas by Section 17 of the Finance Act, 1921, (11-2 G. 5. c. 32) it is enacted that Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, shall extend to weapons and munitions of war of every description and firearms not being weapons of war, and ammunition for such firearms, as it applies to the goods therein mentioned, and that the said section, as so amended by this section, shall extend so as to give power to prohibit the shipment as ship's stores, whether on vessels proceeding to foreign ports or on coastwise voyages of any of the goods to which the said section applies:

And whereas it is expedient to prohibit the exportation or shipment as ship's stores on

vessels proceeding to foreign ports of the articles hereinafter enumerated:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. As from the 15th June, 1937, the following articles shall be, and the same are hereby prohibited to be exported from the United Kingdom, or to be shipped as ship's stores on vessels proceeding to foreign ports, that is to say:—

Mustard gas (dichlorethyl sulphide);  
 Lewisite (chlorvinylchlorarsine and dichlorodivinylchlorarsine);  
 Methylchlorarsine;  
 Diphenylchlorarsine;  
 Diphenylcyanarsine;  
 Diphenylaminechlorarsine;  
 Phenylchlorarsine;  
 Ethylchlorarsine;  
 Phenyltribromarsine;  
 Ethyltribromarsine;  
 Monochloromethylchlorformate;  
 Trichloromethylchlorformate (diphosgene);  
 Dichlorodimethyl ether;  
 Dibromodimethyl ether;  
 Cyanogen chloride;  
 Ethyl bromacetate;  
 Ethyl iodacetate;  
 Brombenzylcyanide;  
 Bromacetone;  
 Brom-methylethyl ketone;  
 Chlorpicrin.

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this Order shall not apply to any exportation or shipment as ship's stores which shall be expressly permitted by a licence given by the Board of Trade, and in accordance with the conditions (if any) of such licence.

2. The Merchant Shipping (Carriage of Munitions to Spain) Act, 1936, (1. Edw. 8. c. 1) shall apply to all articles enumerated in Article (1) of this Order.

3.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1937.

(2) This Order and the Arms Export Prohibition Order, 1931, shall be construed as one, and that Order and this Order may be cited together as the Arms Export Prohibition Orders, 1931-37.

#### UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON  
 TUESDAY, 25 MAY, 1937.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the provisions under which dispensations and leave of absence may be granted to Professors: Now the University of Oxford, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it,

enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In Statt. Tit IV. Sect. 1. § 3, General Regulations, clause 9 (*Statuta*, 1936, p. 55. l. 8), delete "shall" and substitute "may".

2. Ibid. (l. 13), delete "In every such case" to the end of the clause and substitute "The Vice-Chancellor shall give public notice of any appointment of a deputy".

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON  
 TUESDAY, 25 MAY, 1937.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the provisions of the Statute concerning College Contributions for University purposes (1) by altering the basis of contribution in respect of income derived from Trust Funds held for the benefit of a College whether vested in the College or otherwise; (2) by providing for a separate rate of contribution in respect of certain Trust Funds for a period of 20 years from the date of foundation; and (3) by removing obsolete provisions: Now the University of Oxford, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In Statt. Tit. XIX. § 18. cl. 2 (iii) (*Statuta*, 1936, p. 339, line 2), after "trust" insert "whether vested in the College or otherwise".

2. Ibid., in cl. 3 (p. 341, line 43) delete item (xiii) and substitute:

"(xiii) (a) The income of any trust, the instrument creating which came into operation subsequently to the passing of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, unless and until such trust shall have been in operation for a period of twenty years.

(b) A sum equal to three-fifths of the remaining income arising from trusts provided that the deduction under this head shall not exceed the sum of £4,800."

3. Ibid., cl. 5 (c) (p. 342, line 44), delete from "income accruing" to "this sub-section" (line 46) and substitute "sum deducted in computing net revenue under item (xiii) (b) of clause 3 of this sub-section".

"(d) In respect of the income deducted in computing net revenue under item (xiii) (a) of clause 3 of this sub-section a payment bearing the same proportion to the whole amount payable by the College under items (a) and (b) of this clause as the said income bears to the net revenue of the College or a percentage of £5 on every £100 of such income whichever is the less."

And whereas by Sub-section (2) of the said Section as amended by Section 5 and Part II of the Schedule of the Milk (Extension of Temporary Provisions) Act, 1936, the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, are required to certify as soon as may be after the beginning of September, 1934, and of each subsequent month falling before October, 1939, the cheese-milk price for that month:

Now therefore the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries and the Secretary of State for Scotland, acting in conjunction, hereby certify that the cheese-milk price for the month of June, 1937, is 6·26 pence per pound.

The method by which the cheese-milk price for the month as certified above has been computed is as follows:—

(i) The price quotations in respect of sales by wholesale of "New Zealand Finest White" cheese and of "Canadian Finest White" cheese published in the Official Market Report of the London Provision Exchange, Ltd., for each of the weekly periods ended at 11.30 a.m. on each of the Fridays in the preceding month have been examined.

(ii) For each of the said periods and for each description of "Canadian Finest White" cheese quoted in the Official Market Report a mean price has been calculated by taking the mean value of the highest and lowest prices quoted, quotations described in the Report as being exceptional being disregarded.

(iii) An average price for "Canadian Finest White" cheese for each of the said periods has been calculated by taking the average of the aforesaid mean prices.

(iv) An average price for "New Zealand Finest White" cheese for each of the said periods has been ascertained in a similar fashion.

(v) A mean of the average prices for "Canadian Finest White" cheese and "New Zealand Finest White" cheese so ascertained has been calculated for each of the said periods. The average of such mean prices so ascertained has then been expressed in pence per pound, calculated to two places of decimals.

(vi) From the figure thus obtained one penny three farthings has been subtracted and the balance gives the figure certified above.
