The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 22nd day of April, 1937 (N. 3329/37), in the words following, viz:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we have had under consideration the conditions under which Officers and men are called upon to serve in Motor Torpedo Boats:

“And whereas we are of opinion that some pecuniary allowance should be made to them in consideration of the discomforts caused by such service:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, as from 1st January, 1937, the issue of extra pay continuously at one half of the rates laid down in the Regulations for the payment of extra pay for general work.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted inter alia that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Orders in Council dated the 14th May, 1912, the 16th November, 1917 and the 3rd March, 1936, provision is made for payment of an allowance of threepence a day

to the ratings employed on clerical duties with the Gunnery Officer, the Torpedo Officer or the Officer borne for anti-submarine duties:

“And whereas we consider that the rating employed on clerical work in the Commander's Office in ships allowed a Commander second in command should be paid a similar allowance:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to sanction by Your Order in Council the payment of an allowance of threepence a day accordingly.”

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 11th day of May, 1937 (P.M. 1066/37), in the words following, viz:—

“Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 11th day of October 1923 and the 25th day of June 1925 regulations were laid down for the grant of disability retired pay to officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces, and scales of pensions and allowances for their widows, children and other dependent relatives respectively:

“And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 13th day of December 1921, the 28th day of November 1923 and the 23rd day of July 1931 as amended by Orders in Council bearing date the 4th day of May 1935 provision was made for the grant of additional retired pay under certain conditions to officers of Your Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces in respect of service in certain appointments after retirement from the Active List:

“And whereas we consider it desirable to make other provisions for the grant of non-effective benefits in respect of service in the aforesaid appointments to those officers who have retired from the Active List with gratuities only:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the proposals contained in the annexed Schedule.
