such Rector or Incumbent should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Portsmouth for the time being:

"And whereas the said Frank, now Bishop of Portsmouth, is willing to accept such transfer and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of Patronage which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Gosport:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Guy Landon, Rector or Incumbent of the Rectory of the said Parish of Alverstoke, acting as such Rector or Incumbent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the said alternate right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Matthew, Gosport, now vested in him, the said Guy Landon, as such Rector or Incumbent as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him, the said Guy Landon, and from his successors, Rectors or Incumbents of the Rectory of the said Parish of Alverstoke, to the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, and his successors in the same Bishopric, in such manner that the whole Advowson of the said Benefice of Saint Matthew, Gosport, shall hereafter belong to the said Frank, Bishop of Portsmouth, and to his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Portsmouth.
