"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Order in Council of 29th February, 1908, non-substantive pay of 7d. a day was granted to Chief Petty Officers and Petty Officers employed as Torpedo Coxswains:

"And whereas Torpedo Coxswains are now employed as Coxswains of Destroyers, the larger type of Submarines, Minesweepers, Patrol Vessels &c.:

"And whereas we are of the opinion that the non-substantive pay for this rating should be increased to 1s. a day:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction payment accordingly.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of May, 1937 (N. 3566/37), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted *inter alia* that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Orders in Council bearing dates the 11th day of October, 1921, and the 21st day of February, 1935, sanction was given

to the establishment of paid non-substantive Photographer ratings:

"And whereas we deem it expedient that for the more efficient performance of photographic duties in Your Majesty's Navy there should be instituted a branch of Photographer ratings on a substantive basis, together with one post of Warrant Photographer:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the following proposals:—

(1) The substantive ratings of Photographer (Able Seaman grade), Leading Photographer, Petty Officer Photographer and Chief Petty Officer Photographer to be established with pay at the rates set out in the accompanying Schedule I.

(2) Existing holders of Photographer non-substantive ratings to be assimilated to the new substantive grades as we may direct under the special conditions where applicable set out in Schedule II.

(3) The establishment of one post for the rank of Warrant Photographer, promoted by selection from Chief Petty Officer Photographers, with rates of pay and conditions of service as set forth in Schedule III.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

#### " SCHEDULE II.

"Special provisions for the assimilation in the new substantive Photographer branch of men at present holding Photographer non-substantive ratings:

(a) Ratings who are transferred to Leading Photographer, Petty Officer Photographer or Chief Petty Officer Photographer to be allowed to reckon former service in an equivalent rating in the Seaman branch towards progressive increase of pay in the Photographer branch.

(b) Men whose substantive pay on transfer to the new Photographer ratings would be less than the combined substantive and non-substantive pay of the ratings held by them immediately prior to transfer to retain their total rate of pay at the date of transfer until by increment or advancement in the new Photographer branch they become entitled to a higher rate.

#### " SCHEDULE III.

##### " WARRANT PHOTOGRAPHER—PAY AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE.

(a) To receive Full Pay at the rates laid down for Warrant Officers and Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank of the Non-Mechanical Classes, Royal Navy, and to be eligible for Half Pay and Retired Pay payable at the rates and under the conditions laid down for Warrant Officers and Commissioned Officers from Warrant Rank, Royal Navy, other than Schoolmasters.

(b) To be eligible for promotion to Commissioned Photographer under the regulations laid down from time to time for other Warrant Officers, Royal Navy.

(c) To be eligible for promotion to the rank of Photographer Lieutenant on retirement under the general conditions laid down for Warrant Officers and above, Royal Navy."

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Bill Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 25th June, 1937, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 28th June, 1937, to Saturday, the 3rd July, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

#### PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade Board (England and Wales) hereby give notice that they propose to vary minimum rates of wages for certain classes of male and female workers at present set out in the Schedule to their Notice H.M. #### COAL MINES ACT, 1930.

#### THE SHROPSHIRE DISTRICT (COAL MINES) SCHEME, 1930.

Whereas in pursuance of Clause 31 of the Shropshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, amendments of the said Scheme as set out in the Schedule hereto have been submitted to the Board of Trade by the Executive Board elected under the provisions of the said Scheme:

Now therefore the Board of Trade, under the provisions of the said Clause and of subsection (5) of Section I of the Coal Mines Act, 1930, hereby approve the said amendments and prescribe the 14th day of June, 1937, as the date from which the said amendments shall come into force.

#### SCHEDULE.

The Shropshire District (Coal Mines) Scheme, 1930, shall be amended in the following manner:—

1. Clause 51 shall have effect as if for sub-clauses (3) and (4) thereof there were substituted the following sub-clauses, that is to say:—

“(3) If the operation of the Act be extended beyond the 31st day of December, 1937, the Board shall before the 1st day of January, 1938, and before the 1st day of January, 1939, and subsequently before the 1st day of January in each second year make any revision of the annual supply basic tonnage of each coal mine required on the ground that—

(a) the Owner has persistently failed to supply such quantities of coal as the



Selling Committee direct, or has persistently requested the Selling Committee not to direct supply; or

(b) the demand for any class of coal has increased relatively to the demand for other classes; or

(c) the productive capacity of the coal mine is diminishing; or

(d) a scheme of development has been undertaken by the Owner by reason of which an additional tonnage of coal may be expected to be available for supply to the Board:

Provided that in making any revision under paragraph (b) of this sub-clause, the Board shall have regard to the extent to which the demand for the class of coal could have been met from the coal mines of other Owners, and in making any revision under paragraph (d) of this sub-clause the Board shall also have regard to the interests of the other Owners.

(4) The annual supply basic tonnages determined by the Board under the last preceding sub-clause or awarded upon arbitration as hereinafter provided shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1938, the 1st day of January, 1939, and subsequently on the 1st day of January in each second year and shall, subject to the provisions of the next following Clause, remain in force without revision until the next date prescribed in this sub-clause."

2. Clause 52 shall have effect as if for sub-clause (6) thereof there was substituted the following sub-clause, that is to say:—

"(6) If at any time the consumption at any coal mine of electricity generated at any central electricity generating station has led to a reduction in the supply of coal from that coal mine for use in working the coal mine the Board shall adjust the annual supply basic tonnage of that coal mine in such manner as may be fair and equitable having regard to the additional tonnage of coal available for supply to the Board from that coal mine."

3. Clause 56 shall have effect as if—

(a) in sub-clause (3) thereof after the word "shall" where that word appears for the third time there were inserted the words "(subject to any addition made under the following provisions)"; and

(b) in sub-clause (5) thereof—

(i) in the proviso thereto after the word "coal" there were inserted the words "or to failure to supply coal" and for the words "where the Board" to the end of the proviso there were substituted the words "to a request by the Owner that the Board should not direct supply"; and

(ii) the following additional proviso were added at the end thereof—

"Provided further that any tonnage of any class of coal in respect of which no compensation is payable shall be divided in the proportions of the basic tonnages for that class of coal of the other coal mines for that quarter and the tonnage so determined for each such coal mine shall be added to the trade share thereof calculated under sub-clause (3) of this Clause for that quarter."

4. Clause 93 shall have effect as if the following sub-clause were added at the end thereof, that is to say:—

"(3) Any Owner who wilfully renders any statement, return, account or information which is false in any material particular shall pay to the Board on demand a penalty not exceeding the sum of £100."

## OXFORD CANAL COMPANY.

### ABANDONMENT OF PART OF THE OXFORD CANAL.

And whereas by subsection (1) of Section 2 of the Ministry of Transport Act, 1919, and the Ministry of Transport (Board of Trade Exception of Powers) Order, 1919, the powers of the Board of Trade in relation to canal undertakings were transferred to the Minister of Transport:

And whereas by a public Act of Parliament 9 Geo. III, cap. 70, a company was incorporated by the name of "The Company of Proprietors of the Oxford Canal Navigation" and was empowered to make and maintain a navigable canal from the Coventry Canal Navigation to the city of Oxford, and the provisions of the said Act and succeeding Acts were extended by Acts 10 Geo. IV, cap. 48, and 25 Geo. 5, ch. XV.

And whereas such canal was constructed accordingly and has become vested in the Oxford Canal Company.

And whereas by Warrant dated the 14th April, 1937 the Minister of Transport under the powers conferred on him by the said Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, authorised the abandonment of the aforesaid portion of the said Oxford Canal by the Oxford Canal Company.

And whereas notice of the granting of the said Warrant has been duly published as required by the Minister of Transport.

Now therefore in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by Section 45 of the Railway and Canal Traffic Act, 1888, the Minister of Transport does hereby order that the Oxford Canal Company, shall from the date hereof be released from all liability to maintain the afore-

said portion of the said canal and from all statutory and other obligations in respect thereof or of or consequent on the abandonment thereof.

## SHEEP SCAB MOVEMENT AND DOUBLE-DIPPING AREAS.

The following Areas are "Movement Areas" for the purposes of Part II of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928:—

*Inverness.*—An Area comprising:—

The Islands known as the Outer Hebrides (*except the Islands of St. Kilda, Dune, Soay and Boreray; and except the parish of North Uist and all the Islands therein, together with the island of Berneray in the parish of Harris and all the grazing islands attached thereto and the Island of Barra and the adjacent islets attached to the holdings of Barra*), in the County of Inverness.

*Ross and Cromarty.*—An Area comprising:—

The Island of Lewis, including the smaller islands adjacent thereto in the county of Ross and Cromarty.

*Cardiganshire.*—An Area comprising:—

So much of the county of Cardigan as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point on the River Dovey near Dovey Junction Station where the Cardigan and Montgomery County boundaries meet, following the coast line in a south-westerly and southerly direction as far as the mouth of the River Rheidol; thence in an easterly direction along the River Rheidol to Devil's Bridge; thence in a southerly direction along the road from Devil's Bridge via Rhos Fawr to Pontrhydygroes; thence south and east along the western and southern boundaries of the parish of Ysphyty Ystwyth to the point where the parish boundary meets the Cardigan-Radnor county boundary; thence in a generally northerly direction along the Cardigan-Radnor and the Cardigan-Montgomery County boundaries to the point of commencement.

*Montgomeryshire.*—An Area comprising:—

So much of the county of Montgomery as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point where the Llanfyllin-Llangadfan road via Pont Llogel meets the Llangadfan-Mallwyd road near Bron-Afon; thence in a westerly direction along the Llangadfan-Mallwyd road to the Merioneth-Montgomery county boundary near Nant-y-Dugod; thence in a generally northerly direction along the county boundary until it meets the road from Bwlch-y-Groes via Wauny Gadfa and Y Gadfa to Pont Eunant; thence in an easterly direction along that road to Pont Eunant; thence along the road bordering the southern bank of Lake Vyrnwy as far as the point where the River Vyrnwy leaves the lake; thence following the River Vyrnwy in a southerly direction to Pont Llogel; thence in a south-westerly direction along the road to Llangadfan via Hafod to the point of commencement.

The movement of sheep out of the following area is regulated by the North Uist (Movement of Sheep) Order of 1934.
