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The following Statutes made on the 4th day of May, 1937, by (1) The University of Oxford; and (2) The University of Oxford with the approval of Queen's College, Oxford, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
TUESDAY, 4 MAY, 1937.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal *Statt. Tit. III. Sect. IV "Of St. Edmund Hall"* in accordance with agreements made between the University, the Queen's College, and the Principal of St. Edmund Hall respectively to which effect will be given by the following Statutes and by a Statute to be made and a Deed to be executed by the Queen's College: Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

St. Edmund Hall in the University of Oxford is an academical Hall and as such the only survivor of the earliest type of academical society for the residence of undergraduates. The designation of the Hall is believed to commemorate the residence of St. Edmund of

Abingdon, Archbishop of Canterbury, in a house on its site while he was teaching in the University. Owned subsequently by clerks of the family of Bermingham the original messuage passed into the possession of Thomas de Malmesbury, Vicar of Cowley, by whom it was granted about 1270 to the Abbot and Canons of Oseney. It was leased by Oseney Abbey to successive Principals as an academical hall. After the dissolution of the monasteries the site and buildings of the Hall were acquired in 1553 by William Denyssson, Provost of the Queen's College, and were conveyed by him in 1557 to the Queen's College. By a Composition made by a Congregation of the University on 1 March 1559, it was agreed between the University and the Queen's College that the said College should have the right of nominating the Principal provided that "henceforth for ever they will preserve the aforesaid Hall and will preserve it to literary uses". In 1882, by virtue of the powers conferred on them by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, the University of Oxford Commissioners made a Statute entitled "Statute for the partial union of the Queen's College and St. Edmund Hall" to which effect was never given: but on 18 June 1912 the University by virtue of the powers conferred on it by the aforesaid Act of 1877 made with the concurrence of the Governing Body of the Queen's College a Statute altering the provisions of the Statute of 1882 and providing for the continuance of the Hall as a place of education, religion, and learning separate from the Queen's College, while preserving the right of the College to appoint the Principal of the Hall. This Statute was approved by the King in Council on 11 February 1913. It was

revised and enlarged with the concurrence of the Queen's College by the University of Oxford Commissioners, acting in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and a new Statute was made by them on 14 July 1925, and approved by the King in Council on 25 February 1926. A body of six Trustees, representative of the Hall, the University, and the Queen's College, was constituted, in whom was vested all real and personal property belonging to the Hall or that should thereafter be given, devised, or bequeathed or otherwise acquired for the use and benefit of the Hall. The freehold, however, of the site and buildings of the Hall continued to be vested in the Queen's College. In the year 1934 the Governing Body of the Queen's College expressed its willingness to concur in a scheme for establishing the independence of the Hall upon certain terms which have been embodied in these Statutes, in a Statute made for the College and the Hall concurrently with these Statutes, and in a Deed scheduled to that Statute and intended to be executed after the first appointment of Trustees under these Statutes.

In 1763, George Holme, D.D., sometime Fellow of the Queen's College, and Rector of Hedleigh, Hampshire, bequeathed the sum of £1,000 to the University in trust to apply it with accumulated interest to the purchase of the advowson of a living to which the Principal should be presented. In 1821 the advowson of Gatcombe, Isle of Wight, was purchased. Under an Act of Parliament passed in 1913 and entitled: Oxford University (St. Edmund Hall and Gatcombe Rectory) Act, 1913, 3 & 4 George V, cap. lxxviii, this living was separated from the Principalship and the advowson vested in the Queen's College, while the emoluments of the living were charged with an annual payment of £150 towards the salary of the Principal if he is a clerk in Holy Orders, or if the Principal is not, towards the salary of an Officer of the Hall who is a clerk in Holy Orders.

PRELIMINARY.

These Statutes shall not come into operation until the Statute for the Queen's College and for the Hall made concurrently with these Statutes (which is hereinafter called the Joint Statute) has been approved by His Majesty the King in Council.

STATUTE I.

CONSTITUTION OF THE HALL.

1. The Hall is an academical Hall for the education and residence of members of the University *in statu pupillari* and, subject to the provisions of these Statutes and the Joint Statute and the Deed scheduled thereto, is an independent self-governing institution. The term *in statu pupillari* shall be understood for the purposes of these Statutes to mean not only the undergraduate members of the Hall but also any graduate members who are receiving instruction in the Hall. The Principal shall have charge of the Hall, subject to the superintendence of the Trustees and the collaboration of the Fellows hereinafter constituted.

2. A woman may not become a member of the Hall.

STATUTE II.

THE VISITOR.

1. The Chancellor of the University for the time being shall be the Visitor of the Hall.

2. It shall be lawful for the Visitor, if and whenever he shall deem it expedient for enforcing the due observance of the Statutes for the Hall in force for the time being, to visit the Hall and to exercise at any such visitation all powers lawfully belonging to his office, and it shall be lawful for the Visitor at any such visitation, or, if he shall think fit, at other times, to require an answer in writing from the Principal and the Fellows and the Trustees or any of them to any inquiries he may make for the purpose of satisfying himself that the Statutes for the Hall for the time being are duly observed.

3. As often as any question shall arise depending wholly or in part on the construction of any of the Statutes for the Hall on which the Principal and the Trustees shall be unable to agree between themselves or with the Hebdomadal Council of the University or on which the Principal and the Fellows shall be unable to agree between themselves, it shall be lawful for the Principal or for any three or more of the Trustees or for any three or more of the Fellows to submit the same, so far as the decision of the question at issue depends upon the construction of the Statutes for the Hall, to the Visitor; and the Visitor shall declare what is the true construction of such Statute or Statutes with reference to the case submitted to him.

4. The Principal, if he shall conceive himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Trustees, and any Fellow of the Hall, if he shall conceive himself aggrieved by any act or decision of the Principal or of the Principal and the Trustees, and any scholar or exhibitor of the Hall who may have been deprived of his scholarship or exhibition, may appeal against such act or decision or sentence of deprivation to the Visitor, provided such appeal be lodged within one month from the date of such act or decision or sentence of deprivation; and the Visitor shall adjudicate on such appeal, and it shall be lawful for him, as he may deem just, to confirm, annul, or vary the act or decision or sentence of deprivation.

5. It shall be lawful for the Visitor, either of his own motion or on the complaint of any three or more of the Trustees, to disallow or to annul any Ordinance of the Principal and Trustees or any Regulation of the Principal and Fellows which is, in his judgment, repugnant to any of the Statutes for the Hall in force for the time being.

6. Any decision given by the Visitor under these Statutes shall be binding on the Hall and upon the Principal and every Trustee and every Fellow of the Hall, and upon every other person affected by these Statutes.

STATUTE III.

THE PRINCIPAL.

1. The Trustees shall, as often as a vacancy shall occur, choose as Principal a person who being a Master of Arts or holder of a higher degree of the University of Oxford or of Cambridge shall be in their judgment most fit to preside over the Hall as a place of education, religion, and learning.

2. The election of the Principal shall, subject to the provision of clause 3 of this Statute, be conducted in the following manner:

(a) Immediately on the Principalship becoming vacant the Vice-Principal or, if he be absent from Oxford or incapacitated, the next senior Fellow of the Hall shall inform all the Fellows of the Hall and at the same time shall notify the senior Trustee, who shall forthwith summon a meeting of the Trustees to be held not less than seven nor more than fourteen days after such notification, and shall inform the Vice-Principal or the next senior Fellow of the Hall (as the case may be), of his having summoned such meeting. If the senior Trustee shall fail to summon such meeting, a meeting of the Trustees shall forthwith be summoned by the Vice-Principal or next senior Fellow of the Hall (as the case may require). At such meeting the Trustees shall appoint one of their number who shall preside over the election of a Principal and shall summon and preside over any necessary meetings of the Trustees or of any committees appointed by the Trustees, over which the Principal usually presides, until a Principal has been elected. At the aforesaid meeting, the Trustees shall appoint a day, hour, and place for the election of a Principal within a period of not less than one month or more than four months from the date of such meeting.

(b) The presiding Trustee shall forthwith send notice of the day, hour, and place appointed for the meeting for the election to each of the Trustees and to each of the Fellows of the Hall.

(c) At any time after the occurrence of the vacancy and not later than two weeks before the day fixed for the election any two or more of the Trustees, or any two or more of the Fellows of the Hall, may send to the presiding Trustee a name or names for consideration by the Trustees. A notice containing the names of candidates to be proposed for the office of Principal together with the names of their proposers or (in the case of the names of any candidates proposed by two or more of the Fellows of the Hall) together with the names of such Fellows of the Hall shall be sent by the presiding Trustee to each of the Trustees not less than one week before the day of election. No name may be proposed at the meeting which has not been included in such notice, except by the vote of not less than two-thirds of the Trustees present.

(d) The person in whose favour a majority consisting of more than half of the Trustees present and voting shall have voted shall be declared elected. In case of an equality of votes the presiding Trustee shall be entitled to give a second or casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote.

(e) The meeting for the election may be adjourned from time to time. Whenever a Principal shall not have been elected within the period of four months from the date of the preliminary meeting the Visitor shall appoint a Principal.

(f) On an election being made by the Trustees the name of the person elected shall be certified under the signatures of the Trustees present at the time of voting and shall as soon as he has accepted election be communicated forthwith by the presiding Trustee to the Visitor and to the Vice-Chancellor of the University.

3. In the event of an election to the Principalship in accordance with Statute X, Clause 18, the presiding Trustee appointed as directed in Clause 2 (a) of this Statute shall summon and preside over any meetings of the Trustees or of any committees appointed by the Trustees which are concerned with business arising out of the change in the Principalship. No other business shall be transacted nor shall the Principal be present at any such meetings.

4. As soon as may be conveniently arranged after his election the Principal shall in accordance with ancient custom be instituted to his office by the Vice-Chancellor of the University, and shall make a declaration that he will faithfully perform the duties of his office and observe the Statutes for the Hall and the Ordinances of the Principal and Trustees in force for the time being.

5. The governance of the Hall in all its departments and the general superintendence of its property shall be vested in the Principal, subject to the Statutes for the Hall in force for the time being. He shall have pre-eminence and authority over all the other members of the Hall and over all persons thereunto belonging and shall cause all the other members of the Hall and persons thereunto belonging to perform the duties of their respective offices or positions within the Hall. All the other members of the Hall and persons thereunto belonging shall obey the orders of the Principal, being lawful and consistent with the Statutes for the Hall, with the Ordinances of the Principal and Trustees, and with the Regulations of the Principal and Fellows, in all matters relating to the administration of the Hall and the discipline and education of its members, and to the observance of the Statutes for the Hall, the Ordinances of the Principal and Trustees and the Regulations of the Principal and Fellows. The Principal may, in the exercise of his authority, inflict on members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* such reasonable penalties as he shall think fit, which penalties may, subject to the provisions of these Statutes, include the removal of names from the Hall Books. He shall take some part in the teaching of members of the Hall *in statu pupillari*. He may perform all or part of the duties of any office within the Hall, if the Trustees shall, with his consent, so determine.

6. There shall be attached to the Principalship out of the revenues of the Hall an annual stipend of such an amount not exceeding £1,200 as shall be prescribed by the Trustees at the time of the election of the Principal or as shall subsequently be agreed between the Trustees and the Principal, together with an allowance of £200 to meet the expenses of entertainment and any other charges incurred by the Principal by reason of his tenure of office. In addition to the above stipend he shall be entitled to the use of the Principal's lodgings, free of rent, rates, and taxes, all necessary repairs being defrayed from the revenues of the Hall.

If the Principal shall be in Priest's Orders of the Church of England, he shall receive as part of the stipend fixed by or pursuant to this clause the annual sum of £150, being the amount of the charge on the Rectory of Gatcombe created by the Oxford University (St. Edmund Hall and Gatcombe Rectory) Act 1913.

If the Principal shall not be and the Vice-Principal shall be in Priest's Orders of the Church of England, the annual sum of £150, being the amount of such charge, shall be paid to the Vice-Principal. If neither the Principal nor the Vice-Principal shall be in Priest's Orders of the Church of England, the annual sum of £150, being the amount of such charge, shall be paid to the Chaplain of the Hall.

7. The Principal shall reside in the Hall for not less than seven months in each academical year, of which not less than seven weeks shall fall within each Full Term; provided that in case of the sickness of the Principal or for any other reasonable cause, the Visitor may dispense with his obligation to reside for such period and on such conditions as he may judge to be required by the necessity of the case.

8. The Principalship may, subject to the provisions of any other Statutes of the University, be held with a Professorship or other office in the University, but in this case the stipend payable to the Principal out of the revenues of the Hall shall not exceed the sum which will make his emoluments including those of the Professorship or other office amount in all to £1,800 a year.

9. The Principal shall not hold any office outside the University to which an annual stipend or other emolument is attached, except with the consent of a majority of the Trustees.

10. The Principal shall, subject to the provisions of these Statutes, hold office from the day of his institution until the 31st day of July next following the 70th anniversary of his birth, or if such anniversary of his birth falls on the 31st day of July then until such anniversary.

11. The Principal shall be subject to and entitled to the benefits of the Superannuation Scheme of the Hall when and so soon as such Scheme shall be established in the Hall under the provisions of Statute VI of these Statutes, but as to the Principal holding office at the date of such establishment subject to the provisions of Statute VI, Clause 4.

12. If the Principal shall be granted by the Visitor a dispensation from residence for a period of one term or more, or if the Principal being resident shall be through sickness temporarily incapable of performing his duties, the Trustees may make such provision as may be necessary for the temporary discharge of the duties and exercise of the powers of the Principal as they may think fit. The Vice-Principal or such other deputy for the Principal as the Trustees may appoint shall, in respect of the time during which he shall perform the said duties and exercise the said powers, be entitled to receive such part not exceeding in amount one-half of the Principal's pecuniary emoluments as the Trustees shall determine, and the remaining part thereof shall be received by the Principal.

13. If at any time it shall appear that the Principal has become permanently incapable of discharging the duties of his office, the Visitor may, if he thinks fit, upon the petition of not less than two-thirds of the Trustees present at a meeting specially summoned, and after inquiry held by him, declare that the Principal has become permanently incapable of performing the duties of his office, and make an order directing that the Principalship shall be deemed to be vacant at the expiration of a time to be fixed by the order, and the Trustees

shall thereupon proceed to the election of a new Principal; pursuant to these Statutes.

14. If the Principal shall be declared by the votes of a majority of the Trustees present and voting at a meeting specially summoned under the provisions of Statute X, Clause 3, to be guilty of conduct which renders his deprivation necessary to the welfare of the Hall, it shall be lawful for the Visitor upon petition signed by not less than two-thirds of the Trustees and after due inquiry to deprive him of his office, and the decision of the Visitor upon such petition shall be final.

STATUTE IV.

THE TRUSTEES.

1. The Trustees shall be not more than ten in number, and they shall be of two classes, namely (1) representative Trustees and (2) elected Trustees.

2. The representative Trustees shall be four in number and of them:—

One shall be appointed by the Curators of the University Chest;

One shall be appointed by the Governing Body of the Queen's College;

One shall be appointed by the Fellows of the Hall; and

One shall be appointed by the Association of Senior Members of the Hall, entitled the Aularian Association, unless and until the University shall at the request of the Principal and Trustees otherwise determine.

The first appointment of representative Trustees by the Curators of the University Chest, the Governing Body of the Queen's College, the Fellows of the Hall, and the Aularian Association respectively shall be made within one month after the date on which His Majesty the King in Council has by Order approved this Statute or as soon as may be after that date. All appointments of representative Trustees shall forthwith be notified in writing to the Principal by the body or persons making the appointment.

3. The elected Trustees shall be elected by the Principal and Trustees. The first election of elected Trustees shall be made at a meeting of the Principal and the representative Trustees to be convened by the Principal as soon as conveniently may be after the appointment of the first representative Trustees. All subsequent elections to the office of elected Trustee except elections to fill casual vacancies shall take place at the Stated General Meeting of the Principal and Trustees held in November. No person other than a retiring elected Trustee shall be eligible for election to the office of elected Trustee, unless by notice in writing delivered to the Principal not less than twenty-one days before the date of the meeting at which the election is to be held he shall have been proposed by the Principal or one of the Trustees and seconded by the Principal or one of the Trustees, or it be resolved by the vote of not less than two-thirds of the Trustees present at the meeting that a person not so proposed and seconded be eligible.

The name of any person proposed for election to the office of elected Trustee together with the name of his proposer and seconder shall be circulated by the Principal to all the Trustees at least fourteen days before the date of the meeting at which the election is to be held.

4. A Trustee shall, subject to the provisions of this Statute, hold office for a period of ten years, and shall be re-eligible. An elected Trustee shall, subject as aforesaid, hold office throughout the Stated General Meeting held in November in the tenth year after his election.

5. The Principal and Trustees may re-elect an elected Trustee one year before the date on which his term of office expires. Such re-election shall take effect as from the date of the expiry of his term of office.

6. Any casual vacancy occurring in the office of elected Trustee may, subject to the provisions of clause 3 of this Statute, be filled at any meeting of the Principal and Trustees, but so that a person so elected shall hold office only until the close of the next Stated General Meeting held in November, but shall be eligible for re-election. The Trustees may continue to act notwithstanding any vacancy in their number.

7. A Trustee may at any time resign his office by notice in writing under his hand addressed to the Principal. Thereupon the Principal shall, if such Trustee were a representative Trustee, forthwith report such resignation to the body or persons by whom such Trustee was appointed.

8. A Fellow of the Hall who is appointed or elected a Trustee shall cease to be a Trustee on the vacation of his Fellowship, but shall be re-eligible.

9. If any Trustee shall during the period of two consecutive years attend no meeting of the Principal and Trustees and discharge none of the functions of a Trustee, he shall upon the expiration of such period cease to be a Trustee and the determination of his Trusteeship shall be forthwith communicated by the Principal to him and also, if he were a representative Trustee, to the body or persons by whom he was appointed, or, if he were an elected Trustee, to the other Trustees, but he shall be eligible for reappointment or re-election at once or upon the occurrence of any subsequent vacancy.

10. The Visitor, if requested in writing by the Principal and not less than two-thirds of the Trustees, shall have power, if he thinks fit and after due inquiry, by writing under his hand to remove any Trustee from office, and a vacancy caused by any such removal of a Trustee shall be supplied as if he had resigned at the date of such removal. Any Trustee removed under this provision shall not be eligible for reappointment or re-election, unless and until it shall be resolved by the Principal and not less than two-thirds of the Trustees that he shall be so eligible.

11. The Trustees shall rank in order of seniority amongst themselves according to the date of their first appointment or election, or in case of equality of seniority then according to age.

12. Until the first appointment and election of Trustees shall have been made, the existing Trustees shall continue to act and shall have all the powers of Trustees appointed or elected under this Statute.

STATUTE V.

FELLOWS AND OFFICERS OF THE HALL.

1. The Fellows of the Hall shall consist of the Vice-Principal, the Tutors, and such other officers as the Principal and Trustees shall

from time to time determine. The number of the Fellows shall be determined by the Principal and Trustees. The same person shall be eligible to hold more than one office at one and the same time.

2. The appointment or reappointment of all Fellows of the Hall shall, subject to the provisions of these Statutes, be made by the Principal and the Fellows of the Hall. The first appointment of Fellows shall be made by the Principal as soon as conveniently may be after the approval of these Statutes by His Majesty the King in Council.

3. Every Fellow of the Hall on his appointment shall make before the Principal a declaration that he will be true and faithful to the Hall, and will observe its Statutes, Ordinances, and Regulations and promote its interests and studies.

4. The Fellows of the Hall shall be appointed for such periods not exceeding seven years as the Principal and Fellows with the consent of the Trustees may from time to time determine, at the expiration of which they shall be re-eligible, but no Fellow may hold his Fellowship after the 31st day of July next following the 65th anniversary of his birth. Any Fellow of the Hall whom the Principal and the other Fellows shall decide to reappoint shall, in so far as may be practicable, be reappointed at least one year before the expiration of his Fellowship. Such reappointment shall take effect as from the date on which the term of his Fellowship expires.

5. The Fellows of the Hall shall reside within the University during Full Term, but the Principal may in case of sickness or for any other sufficient reason dispense with the residence of a Fellow of the Hall for such period not exceeding one term as he thinks proper, which dispensation may with the consent of the Trustees be extended. The number of Fellows who shall be required to reside within the Hall during Full Term shall be determined by the Principal with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall.

6. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes, the Principal and Trustees may from time to time determine the reasonable stipends and emoluments of the Fellows of the Hall: provided that it shall be lawful for the Visitor upon the petition of any Fellow of the Hall whose stipend or emolument may have been diminished in exercise of the foregoing power to disallow such diminution, if he shall think fit.

7. Every Fellow of the Hall not being married at the time of his appointment shall vacate his office if he marries within seven years from the day of his first appointment but shall be eligible for reappointment by the Principal and Fellows of the Hall.

8. Every Fellow or other Officer of the Hall shall be subject to and entitled to the benefits of the Superannuation Scheme of the Hall, when and so soon as such Scheme shall be established under the provisions of Statute VI, but, as to any Fellow or other Officer holding office at the date of such establishment, subject to the provisions of Statute VI, Clause 4.

9. The Vice-Principal shall take rank next in precedence to the Principal: other Fellows of the Hall shall take seniority according to the date of their appointment, provided that the Principal shall have power to grant to a Fellow

of the Hall upon his appointment or reappointment a definite number of years' seniority together with any financial advantage entailed, and provided that Fellows of the Hall reappointed under Clause 4 or Clause 7 of this Statute shall retain the seniority which they had previously attained.

10.—(1) A Fellow or other Officer of the Hall shall subject to the provisions of these Statutes vacate his Fellowship and office or offices in the Hall on any of the following occurrences, that is to say:

(a) On the acceptance of the Headship of the Hall or of any College, New Foundation, or Permanent Private Hall, or of a Fellowship in any College or New Foundation, or a Tutorship in a Permanent Private Hall within the University, whether stipendiary or non-stipendiary (other than an Honorary Fellowship).

(b) On the acceptance of any office or engagement in any occupation which in the opinion of the Principal and the other Fellows of the Hall interferes with the discharge of his duties to the Hall.

(2) If a Fellow or other Officer of the Hall shall through sickness have been incapable of duly performing the duties of his office during three successive terms, he may, subject to the provisions of Statute II, Clause 4, be required by the Principal with the consent of the Trustees to vacate his office.

(3) If a Fellow or other Officer of the Hall is guilty of grave immorality or misconduct, or of neglect or inefficiency in the discharge of his duties, or of contumacious disobedience to any of the Statutes for the Hall or of the Ordinances of the Principal and Trustees or of the Regulations of the Principal and Fellows in force for the time being, he may, subject to the provisions of Statute II, Clause 4, be deprived of his office by the Principal and Trustees after due inquiry.

11. A Fellow or other Officer of the Hall who shall have the intention of accepting any salaried appointment or office not connected with the Hall shall give notice of his intention to the Principal by writing under his hand, and if the Principal and the other Fellows of the Hall shall be of the opinion that the duties of such appointment or office would be incompatible with the due performance of his duties as Fellow of the Hall, he shall be warned by the Principal that he will be required to relinquish his Fellowship and office or offices in the Hall, if he shall accept such appointment or office.

12. The Vice-Principal shall be appointed by the Principal with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall. He shall always be a Tutor of the Hall. He shall be constantly resident within the Hall during Full Term, except in the case of illness or other reasonable cause, when the Principal shall have power to grant him temporary dispensation from compliance with the requirements of this clause. He shall discharge such disciplinary and administrative duties and have such other powers as, subject to the provisions of these Statutes, the Principal shall from time to time determine. He, or in the event of his absence from Oxford or incapacity any Fellow of the Hall who may be authorized by the Principal to act in the place of the Vice-Principal, shall have power in the absence or

sickness of the Principal or during a vacancy in the Principalship to exercise such of the powers and discharge such of the duties of the Principal's office as the Trustees may from time to time determine.

13. If neither the Principal nor the Vice-Principal shall be in Priest's Orders of the Church of England, a Chaplain shall be appointed for the conduct of Divine Service in the Chapel of the Hall, and for the discharge of such teaching and other duties within the Hall as may be determined by the Principal. The Chaplain shall be appointed by the Principal with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall. He shall be in Priest's Orders of the Church of England, a graduate of a University in the British Isles, and a person well qualified to give religious instruction and counsel to members of the Hall. He shall constantly reside within the Hall during Full Term, except in the case of illness or other reasonable cause, when the Principal shall have power to grant him temporary dispensation from compliance with the requirements of this clause.

14. The Bursar shall be appointed by the Principal and Trustees for such period and at such salary, and on such terms, as they may think proper. It shall be the duty of the Bursar to assist in the care of the property and expenditure of the Hall. He shall be responsible for the annual accounts, the arrangements for their audit, and for the performance of such other duties as the Principal and Trustees may from time to time determine.

15. The Principal may appoint from among the Fellows a Senior Tutor who shall exercise such administrative duties as may be assigned to him by the Principal in regard to the courses of study of all members of the Hall *in statu pupillari*.

16. It shall be the duty of each Tutor to exercise direct supervision over the conduct and course of study and the general welfare of such members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* as the Principal may with the consent of the Fellows assign to him and to engage in the educational work of the Hall in such other ways as the Principal may with the consent of the Fellows require.

17. Lecturers not being Fellows of the Hall may be appointed to supervise the course of study of members of the Hall *in statu pupillari*. The appointment of a Lecturer shall be made by the Principal, with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall, on such terms as to duties and tenure as he may determine. A Lecturer shall hold office for such period and shall receive such remuneration as the Principal with the consent of the Trustees may determine.

18. Any person appointed to be a Tutor or Lecturer of the Hall shall have passed all examinations required for the degree of B.A., or shall in the judgment of the Principal hold an equivalent qualification. Every Tutor of the Hall shall take the degrees of B.A. and M.A., or if not qualified to take those degrees such other degrees in the University, if any, as he is qualified to take, as soon as the Statutes of the University permit, provided that the Principal may for reasonable cause allow a Tutor to postpone taking a degree for such period as he may think fit.

19. It shall be lawful for the Principal and Fellows of the Hall to elect distinguished

persons connected with the Hall or eminent benefactors thereof to Honorary Fellowships within the Hall. Persons so elected shall be termed Honorary Fellows and shall not be entitled to receive any pecuniary emolument, nor be required to perform any duties, but shall be entitled to enjoy such other privileges and advantages as the Principal with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall shall from time to time determine.

20. The Principal may with the consent of the Trustees set apart and allow out of the revenues of the Hall a moderate sum for the provision of a Common Dinner whether in the Dining Hall or in some public room in the Hall, of which the Principal and Fellows of the Hall shall be entitled to partake without charge. The same privilege may with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall be extended by the Principal to any Lecturer of the Hall not being a Fellow.

21. Unmarried Fellows of the Hall residing within the Hall shall be entitled to rooms in the Hall free of rent. No other Fellow of the Hall shall be entitled to rooms in the Hall, but a married Fellow of the Hall may have rooms assigned to him on such terms as the Principal may from time to time determine.

22. All payments made for tuition by members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* shall be set aside to form a Tuition Fund, and shall be applicable to the payment of persons giving tuition or instruction to members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* and to other expenses connected with the education of members of the Hall *in statu pupillari*. Superannuation contributions payable under Statute VI of these Statutes may be provided from the Tuition Fund.

STATUTE VI.

PENSIONS.

1.—(1) If and when in the opinion of the Principal and Trustees available funds permit, the Principal shall make an application to the Central Council administering and controlling the Federated Superannuation System for Universities for the admission of the Hall to membership of that system.

(2) The provisions hereinafter in this Statute contained shall come into force as from such date (in this Statute referred to as "the date of admission") as shall be agreed upon between the Principal and Trustees and the said Central Council.

2. The Principal and Trustees shall comply with the regulations of the said Central Council.

3. The Superannuation Scheme (in this Statute referred to as the "Scheme") of the Federated Superannuation System for Universities together with any amendments or modifications which may hereinafter be introduced into the Scheme by the said Central Council shall be in force in the Hall.

4. The Scheme shall be compulsory on the Principal and on every Fellow of the Hall appointed for the first time on and after the date of admission. The Principal or any Fellow of the Hall holding office at the date of Admission shall be allowed to place himself under the Scheme on such terms as may be agreed between the Trustees and the Principal or the Principal and Trustees and such Fellow.

5. All moneys payable by the Hall under the Scheme and under this Statute shall be provided for either out of the income of any Trust Funds lawfully applicable for such purposes or out of any moneys or revenues of the Hall.

6. For the purposes of the Scheme the stipends attached by these Statutes to the Principalship and to any other office in the Hall shall be calculated exclusively of the value of any prescribed allowances made under these Statutes or under other Statutes for the Hall.

7. Where any person comes under the Scheme both under or by virtue of this Statute and also under or by virtue of any Statute of any College or of any Statute or Decree of the University the Principal and Trustees shall so far as it is practicable enter into an arrangement with the Governing Body of such last-mentioned College or the Body or Authority designated by such Statute or Decree as the nature of the case may require, as regards the application of the Scheme to such person, and any such arrangements made may provide for the trusteeship arising under the Scheme being exercised exclusively either by the Principal and Trustees or by such Governing Body of a College, or such Body or Authority as aforesaid and otherwise as may be necessary or convenient for unifying the administration of the Scheme as regards such person, provided that no such arrangement shall reduce any deduction or contribution provided for by the Scheme as applied by this Statute.

8. Every person coming or placing himself under the Scheme by virtue of the provisions of this Statute shall immediately upon his being required so to do by the Principal and Trustees sign an agreement in the form required by the Federated Superannuation System for Universities providing for his being bound by the Scheme.

STATUTE VII.

MEMBERS IN STATU PUPILLARI.

1. The Principal and Trustees shall have power to establish scholarships and exhibitions in the Hall and to determine the number of open entrance scholarships and exhibitions to be offered for competition in each academical year. The Principal with the consent of the Trustees shall determine what sum in addition to any sums provided by Trust Funds or other special endowments shall be set aside out of general revenues of the Hall in each academical year for the provision of scholarships and exhibitions.

2. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes, the Principal and Fellows of the Hall shall determine the subjects for which scholarships and exhibitions shall be awarded, the method of election and admission and the conditions of tenure; provided that no scholarship or exhibition shall be awarded before entry unless the attainments of the candidates shall have been tested by an open examination instituted for the purpose.

3. Emoluments shall be given only on application from the elected candidates and provided that the Principal is satisfied that they are in need of financial assistance, and that the total emoluments assigned out of the revenues of the Hall to a scholar shall not exceed £100

and those to an exhibitor shall not exceed £60 a year. The Principal with the consent of the Trustees may, however, at any time direct that scholars and exhibitors shall be entitled to receive a sum not exceeding £30 a year without application or inquiry into means.

4. If the Principal shall be in doubt in regard to any matter affecting the assignment of emoluments to scholars and exhibitors he shall consult the Central Scholarship Committee appointed by the University.

5. The Principal shall review annually the financial position and needs of each scholar and exhibitor in receipt of emoluments and may, after each such review, either diminish or increase to any sum not exceeding the total value permitted under clause 3 of this Statute, the emoluments assigned to him as a scholar or exhibitor, provided that no reduction shall be made in consideration of any University Scholarship or Prize won by him or any other University emolument gained in open competition, except those specified in the Schedule attached to this Statute and any other scholarships added to this Schedule by Statute or Decree of the University.

The Schedule

The Abbott Scholarship.

The Squire Scholarship in Theology.

The Edgell Sheppee Scholarship in Engineering Science.

The Winter Williams Scholarship.

The George Webb Medley Scholarship.

6. Every scholar and exhibitor may, subject to the provisions of Statute II, Clause 4, be deprived by the Principal of, or suspended from, his scholarship or exhibition or any part of the emoluments thereof for neglect of his studies or other misconduct if the Principal after consultation with the Fellows shall so decide.

7. Every scholar or exhibitor who shall marry or be admitted to a Fellowship in the Hall or to a Fellowship or scholarship or exhibition in any College, or shall accept any office or appointment or undertake any duties which the Principal shall with the consent of the Fellows declare to be inconsistent with the tenure of a scholarship or exhibition, shall thereby vacate his scholarship or exhibition.

8. A scholar or exhibitor elected after an examination in a particular subject may pursue any other recognized subject of academic study, provided that he shall have satisfied the Principal that he is qualified to do so with profit.

9. Commoners shall be chosen and admitted by the Principal.

10. Members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* shall be subject to such regulations as to residence, instruction, discipline and attendance at Divine Worship (subject to the provisions of the Universities Tests Act, 1871) as the Principal with the consent of the Fellows shall from time to time make.

11. The Principal shall provide courses of instruction for members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* during at least twenty-four weeks in the academical year.

12. All regulations with regard to the expenditure within the Hall of members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* shall be made by the Principal and Fellows.

13. Any member of the Hall *in statu pupillari* may, subject as regards scholars and exhibitors to the provisions of Statute II, Clause 4, be removed from the Hall by the Principal for such causes as the Principal with the consent of the Fellows may judge to be deserving.

STATUTE VIII.

DIVINE SERVICE.

The Principal shall make regulations for the daily performance of Divine Service within the Hall according to the Liturgy of the Church of England or some abridgement thereof during Full Term, and at such other times as he shall think proper, and may vary such regulations from time to time.

STATUTE IX.

PROPERTY.

1. The site and buildings of the Hall shall, subject to the provisions of these Statutes and of the Joint Statute and of the Deed scheduled thereto, be occupied for the use and benefit of the Hall as a place of education, religion, and learning.

2. All other real and personal property held at the time of the passing of these Statutes by the existing Trustees of the Hall in trust for the Hall or for the members or any member of it as such or belonging to the members of the Hall in common, shall as soon as may be after the passing of these Statutes be transferred by the said Trustees to and be vested in the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University upon the same trusts as are applicable to such property at the time of the passing of these Statutes, and the same shall be held by the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University as custodian trustees according to the said trusts and the income thereof shall be paid to the Trustees of the Hall who shall be the managing trustees thereof. All real and personal property that shall hereafter be given, devised, or bequeathed or otherwise acquired for the use and benefit of the Hall or of the members or of any member of it as such, shall, save in any case where a donor or testator shall have otherwise directed, likewise be vested in the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University as custodian trustees and the management thereof shall be vested in the Trustees, according to the trusts affecting the same.

3. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes and of the Joint Statute and of the Deed scheduled thereto, the Principal and Trustees shall have the entire management, direction, superintendence, and control of and over the affairs, concerns, and property of the Hall as well as in receiving, issuing, investing, laying out, and disposing of all stock, effects, funds, moneys, and securities, as also in contracting for and purchasing messuages, lands, tenements and hereditaments, and goods and chattels for the use of the Hall and in selling, demising, aliening, mortgaging, exchanging, and otherwise disposing of or dealing with any property whatever real or personal belonging thereto, and of all gifts, bequests, scholarships, exhibitions, and endowments which they may deem desirable for the purposes of the said Hall and in all other matters relating to the said Hall.

No portion of the income and property of the Hall, whencesoever derived, shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, or bonus, or otherwise howsoever by

way of profit to any person not being the Principal or a Fellow of the Hall who at any time is or has been a Trustee of the Hall.

4. In investing or reinvesting any moneys given, devised, bequeathed, or otherwise acquired for the use and benefit of the Hall or of the members or of any member of it as such the Principal and Trustees shall at their discretion, but subject and without prejudice to any direction or power contained in the instrument creating the trusts affecting such moneys, make such investment or reinvestment in any of the modes of investment which the Curators of the University Chest shall at that time be permitted by the Statutes of the University to make.

5. Any grants that the University shall make from time to time to the Hall, whether for the general purposes of the Hall or for particular uses in connexion therewith, shall, subject to the terms of the Decrees of Congregation authorizing such grants, be treated as revenue.

6. The Principal shall subject to the provisions of these Statutes be entitled to receive from the Trustees all sums due to the Hall from rents and profits of estates, from dividends and interest, from grants, gifts, benefactions, from room-rents, fees, dues, and other payments by members of the Hall, and shall apply such sums for the purposes of the Hall or the members or any member as such.

7. The Bursar shall prepare as early as possible in the Michaelmas Term a budget of the probable receipts and expenditure for the current financial year. A copy of the budget shall be sent to each of the Trustees and its consideration be placed on the agenda of the Stated General Meeting held in that term. Each of the Fellows shall also receive a copy of the budget.

8. The Principal shall not without the consent of the Trustees engage upon any structural alterations, additions, or extensions to the buildings of the Hall nor upon any repairs to the buildings of the Hall which shall cost in total expenditure a sum exceeding £300.

STATUTE X.

GOVERNMENT OF THE HALL.

1. There shall be at least two Stated General Meetings of the Principal and Trustees in every year, of which one shall be held on St. Edmund's Day, that is, on 16 November, or as near to that date as may be practicable. At least two weeks' notice in writing stating the place, the day, the hour of meeting, and indicating the nature of the business to be transacted thereat, shall be given by the Principal by post, but the accidental omission to give such notice to or the non-receipt of such notice by any Trustee shall not invalidate the proceedings at any meeting of the Principal and Trustees.

2. The Principal may at any time convene a meeting of the Trustees. Reasonable notice in writing of the place, day, and hour of such meeting and of the nature of the business to be transacted thereat shall be sent by the Principal to all the Trustees. Business of which notice has not been given may be transacted at such meeting, if all the Trustees present are willing so to allow.

3. Upon the written request of three or more of the Trustees the Principal shall convene a meeting of the Trustees. Such request shall

specify the object of the desired meeting, and shall be delivered during the University Term to the Principal, who shall with due notice convene a special meeting of the Trustees to be held within twenty-one days of the receipt of the said request, for the purpose therein specified. If the Principal shall refuse or fail to convene such meeting within three weeks after such request, the requisitionists may summon it, giving notice of the business to be transacted thereat.

4. At the request of the Principal and Trustees any or all of the Fellows of the Hall may be invited to attend a meeting of the Principal and Trustees, but no Fellow of the Hall shall be entitled to vote at any such meeting unless he is also a Trustee.

5. No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Principal and Trustees unless at least three Trustees shall be present.

6. The Chairman may with the consent of the meeting adjourn any meeting of the Trustees, but no business shall be transacted at an adjourned meeting other than business left untransacted at the meeting from which the adjournment took place. Whenever a meeting is adjourned for twenty-four hours or more, notice of the adjourned meeting shall be sent to the Trustees not present at the time of the adjournment, but save as aforesaid the Trustees shall not be entitled to any notice of an adjourned meeting.

7. The Principal may submit questions orally or in writing to the Trustees for their decision: provided that no business is so transacted as is required by the Statutes for the Hall or the Ordinances of the Principal and Trustees in force for the time being to be transacted at a meeting of the Principal and Trustees. No action consequent upon a question submitted orally or in writing to the Trustees for their decision shall be taken, unless the consent thereto of a majority of two-thirds of the Trustees shall have been given. If the Principal shall submit any question orally or in writing to the Trustees for their decision, he shall communicate the decision at the next meeting of the Principal and Trustees.

8. Except as is otherwise provided in these Statutes, the Principal shall preside at all meetings of the Trustees, and shall have the right to preside at all meetings of all committees appointed by the Principal and Trustees. Whenever he presides over a meeting of the Trustees or over a committee appointed by the Principal and Trustees, he shall have, in case of there being an equality of votes, a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote. If the Principal shall be absent or shall not be willing to preside, the Chairman shall be such one of the Trustees present as a majority of such Trustees shall select, or in default of selection then the senior Trustee according to standing present and willing to preside shall be Chairman. And in case of equality of votes such Chairman shall have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote.

9. Except as otherwise provided by the Statutes for the Hall or the Ordinances of the Principal and Trustees, all decisions of the Principal and Trustees, or of any committee appointed by the Principal and Trustees, shall be determined in accordance with the votes of a majority of those present and voting. In any vote on the re-election or on the removal of a

Trustee such Trustee shall not vote and shall not be counted in reckoning any necessary majority.

10. The Principal and Trustees may at a Stated General Meeting make or vary such Ordinances as they may think fit on any matter relating either to the property or to the administration of the Hall: Provided that such Ordinances be in no respect inconsistent with the Statutes for the Hall in force for the time being, nor with the Statutes for the time being of the University, nor with any Act of Parliament.

11. All Ordinances made and varied in accordance with the provisions of this Statute shall be recorded in a book kept solely for that purpose.

12. The Principal shall summon at least one meeting of the Fellows of the Hall in every Term for the consideration of business respecting the internal administration and the educational policy of the Hall and the residence, instruction, and discipline of such of its members as are *in statu pupillari*. Such meeting shall be entitled a Hall Meeting. Reasonable notice in writing of the place, day, and hour of such meeting shall be given by the Principal to all the Fellows. Any matters required by these Statutes to be decided by the Principal with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall must be decided at such meetings. The Principal shall be bound, on a requisition in writing from any three Fellows of the Hall, to convene a Hall Meeting for the consideration of any question or questions specified in the requisition, and shall give all the Fellows of the Hall reasonable notice of such meeting and of the question or questions proposed to be discussed at it.

13. All decisions of the Principal and Fellows shall be determined in accordance with the votes of a majority of those present and voting. In case of there being an equality of votes, the Principal shall have a casting vote in addition to his ordinary vote.

14. No business shall be transacted at any Hall Meeting unless at least two Fellows shall be present.

15.—(a) The Principal and Fellows may at a Hall Meeting make or vary such regulations as they may think fit on any matter relating to the internal administration and the educational policy of the Hall and to the residence, instruction, and discipline of such of its members as are *in statu pupillari*: Provided that such regulations be in no respect inconsistent with the Statutes for the Hall and the Ordinances of the Principal and Trustees in force for the time being, nor with the Statutes for the time being of the University, nor with any Act of Parliament.

(b) The Regulations shall contain provisions for notifying the authorized charges for the normal objects of expenditure to the parents and guardians of undergraduate members of the Hall about to come into residence.

16. All Regulations made and varied in accordance with the provision of this Statute shall be recorded in a book kept solely for that purpose.

17. Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings at all meetings for which provision is made under this Statute, and the Minute Books shall be accessible to the Principal, the Trustees, and the Fellows at all reasonable times.

18. Subject to the provisions of Statute IV, Clause 5, and Statute V, Clause 4, when any position or office in the Hall is about to become vacant at a known date by resignation or superannuation an election or appointment may be made not more than six months before the date of the vacancy by the same procedure as if the position or office had already become vacant. Such election or appointment shall take effect from the date on which the position or office becomes vacant, provided that in the case of the office of Principal the Trustees shall have authorized such a course by a vote in which a majority of the Trustees present and voting concur.

STATUTE XI.

ACCOUNTS.

1. The Principal and Trustees shall cause the accounts of the Hall to be kept in proper books of Account in such a form as to enable them to be duly checked and balanced. Separate accounts shall be kept of all special Trust Funds held for the general benefit of the Hall or for particular purposes in connexion therewith.

2. The accounts of the Hall shall be audited annually by the University Auditors, and an annual abstract of the accounts of the Hall shall be published together with the accounts of the University and the Colleges.

3. Proper records shall be kept of all property held for the benefit of the Hall, or of the members or any member of it as such, including an inventory of all silver plate, pictures, printed books, manuscripts, and other articles of value and historic interest belonging to the Hall or to the members or any member of it as such.

STATUTE XII.

PROVISIONS RELATIVE TO THE UNIVERSITY.

1. If at any time it appears to the Hebdomadal Council of the University that any provision of these Statutes or of any other Statutes for the Hall in force for the time being, respecting the accounts of the Hall, or the audit or publication thereof, or the exercise of the borrowing powers of the Principal and Trustees, or any other provision of such Statutes by the non-observance of which any interest of the University is liable to be prejudicially affected, is not duly observed, the Hebdomadal Council may submit a representation to the Visitor; and the Visitor shall, upon receiving such representation, inquire into the matter, and after considering any representation made by the Principal and Trustees, make such order therein as he shall deem just for enforcing the due observance of the said Statutes in the matter to which the representation shall relate.

2. Before any representation is made under the foregoing provision, the Vice-Chancellor shall communicate the matter of the proposed representation to the Principal for the information of the Trustees, and when a representation is made shall forthwith send him a copy of it.

3. The Principal and Trustees may from time to time request the Hebdomadal Council to propose to the University the alteration or amendment of these Statutes. Such a request must be approved by the votes of a majority of the Trustees present and voting at a Stated

General Meeting or at a meeting specially summoned under the provisions of Statute X, Clause 3, but shall not require the consent of the Principal, and, in the event of the Principal withholding his consent and being unwilling to forward such request, the same shall be forwarded to the Hebdomadal Council by such one of the Trustees as the Trustees shall appoint for the purpose. The Hebdomadal Council shall not propose to the University any alteration or amendment of these Statutes except with the consent of the Trustees.

4. If at any time the Statute concerning College contributions for University purposes made for the University under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, shall be amended or any other University Statute to the like effect shall be made so as to render the Hall liable to make contributions out of its revenue for University purposes, the application of the revenues of the Hall shall be subject to the payment of the charges imposed thereby.

5. For the purposes of the University the Hall shall not be deemed to be a Department nor the Trustees Delegates of the University.

STATUTE XIII.

REPEAL OR AMENDMENT OF STATUTES.

1. The Statute made for the Queen's College and for St. Edmund Hall in 1925 and approved by His Majesty the King in Council in 1926 is hereby repealed, without prejudice nevertheless to any right acquired, liability incurred, or act done thereunder, or any repeal affected thereby.

2. These Statutes shall be subject to alteration in the manner provided by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and by clause 3 of Statute XII, but no alteration which is inconsistent with the joint Statute or with the Deed scheduled thereto shall be made without the consent of the Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, 4 MAY 1937.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal Statt. Tit. III. Sect. IV "Of St. Edmund Hall" in accordance with agreements made between the University, the Queen's College, and the Principal of St. Edmund Hall respectively to which effect will be given by the Statute passed by Congregation on 4 May 1937 and by the following Statute to be made by the University: Now the said University, in the exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows.

1. The Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College and the present Trustees of St. Edmund Hall and the Trustees for the time being of St. Edmund Hall shall as soon as practicable after Trustees for the Hall shall have been duly appointed under the Statutes for the Hall made concurrently with this Statute enter into a Deed in the form set out in the Schedule hereto with such variations (if any) as may be required in consequence of the deaths of parties or other events.

2. The provisions of such Deed when executed shall bind the lands therein referred to and the Trustees for the time being of St. Edmund Hall.

3. The provisions of such Deed may from time to time be varied by a Deed executed by the Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College and by the Trustees for the time being of St. Edmund Hall provided that no such variation shall be inconsistent with this Statute or with the Statutes for the Hall for the time being in force.

4. The Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College shall out of the corporate revenue of that College pay to the Principal for the time being of St. Edmund Hall in the Michaelmas Term of every year for the period of fifteen years after the date on which His Majesty the King in Council has by Order approved this Statute the sum of £300 in continuance of their former grants and such sums shall be applied by the Principal in accordance with the provisions of the Statutes affecting St. Edmund Hall in providing Exhibitions tenable by members of the Hall who shall be deserving and in need of assistance to support them at the University.

5. This Statute shall not come into operation until the Statutes for St. Edmund Hall made concurrently with this Statute have been approved by His Majesty the King in Council.

THE SCHEDULE before referred to.

Honorary Fellow of All Souls College in the University of Oxford Herbert James Paton M.A. Professor of Logic in the University of Glasgow and John Walter Jones M.A. Fellow of the Queen's College in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called "the surviving Grantees") of the second part the said Alfred Brotherton Emden the said Henry Herbert Williams Lord Bishop of Carlisle the said Francis William Pember Charles Robert Mowbray Fraser Cruttwell M.A. Principal of Hertford College in the University of Oxford the said Herbert James Paton and the said John Walter Jones (hereinafter called "the old Trustees") being the Trustees appointed under the Statute made for the College and for St. Edmund Hall in the University of Oxford (hereinafter called "the Hall") which was approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the 25th day of February 1926 (hereinafter called "the old Statute") of the third part and

(hereinafter called "the Trustees") being the Trustees appointed under the Statutes made for the Hall which were approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the day of 1937 of the fourth part Whereas by Clause 16 of the old Statute it was provided that the site and buildings of the Hall should subject to the old Statute continue to be vested in the College in the same manner

and for the same purposes in and for which they were then vested in the College and whereas the property shown on the plan drawn hereon and thereon coloured pink comprises the site and buildings of the Hall referred to in the old Statute as aforesaid and whereas by a Conveyance dated the 2nd day of December 1925 and made between the President and Scholars of the College of Saint Mary Magdalen in the University of Oxford of the one part and the College of the other part the piece of land the approximate position of which is shown on the said plan drawn hereon and thereon coloured purple was conveyed unto and to the use of the College their successors and assigns upon the like trusts and to and for the like intents and purposes upon to and for which the College held the site and buildings of the Hall and whereas immediately before the execution of the Deed next hereinafter recited the property shown on the said plan drawn hereon and thereon coloured blue was vested in the College as part of the general corporate property of the College and whereas by a Deed dated the 1st day of August 1933 and made between the College of the one part and the surviving Grantees and Sir Walter Robert Buchanan-Riddell (since deceased) (who were then the Trustees appointed under the old Statute) of the other part it was agreed that as from the date for completion therein referred to the property described in the First Schedule thereto (being the said property coloured blue on the said plan drawn hereon) together with the buildings for the time being standing thereon should be deemed to form part of the site and buildings of the Hall referred to in Clause 16 of the old Statute and that there should be paid to the College out of the funds of the Hall the sum of £1375 as therein mentioned and Clause 5 of the Deed now in recital contained provisions relating to the acquisition of rights of light and to the height of buildings and otherwise in relation to the said property coloured blue on the said plan and whereas by a Deed dated the 8th day of November 1933 and made between the College of the one part and the surviving Grantees and the said Sir Walter Robert Buchanan-Riddell (deceased) of the other part it was witnessed that certain provisions should apply in respect of six windows intended to be left open in the erection of a building on part of the said property coloured blue on the said plan drawn hereon and that there should be paid to the College out of the funds of the Hall the yearly sum of 10s. in respect of each of such windows and whereas by a Deed under the seal of the College dated the 19th day of May 1934 and endorsed on the recited Deed of the 1st day of August 1933 after recitals whereby it appeared that the date for completion referred to in the last mentioned Deed was the 22nd day of April 1934 and that the sum of £1375 had been duly paid to the College the College released and discharged the Trustees for the time being of the Hall from the said sum of £1375 and all interest thereon and all claims and demands in respect thereof and whereas immediately before the death of the said Sir W. R. Buchanan-Riddell the property shown on the said plan drawn hereon and thereon coloured green was vested in the surviving Grantees and the said Sir W. R. Buchanan-Riddell for the benefit of the Hall and was used as part of the site and buildings of the Hall and whereas the said Sir

Walter Robert Buchanan-Riddell died on the 6th day of June 1934 and whereas the Statute made for the Hall (mentioned in the Statute made for the College and the Hall approved by His Majesty the King in Council on the day of 193) were approved by His Majesty in Council on the day of 193 and whereas the Trustees are the Trustees for the Hall appointed under the Statutes made for the Hall. Now this Deed witnesseth as follows:—

1. In pursuance of the said Statute made for the College and the Hall and in consideration of the premises the College as Trustee hereby conveys unto the Trustees all the property shown on the said plan drawn hereon and thereon coloured pink purple and blue to hold unto the Trustees in fee simple (subject as to such part thereof as is affected thereby to the covenants contained in a Conveyance dated the 16th day of October 1922 and made between the said President and Scholars of the College of St. Mary Magdalen in the University of Oxford (hereinafter referred to as "The President and Scholars") of the first part Archibald Graham of the second part and the College of the third part and subject as to such part thereof as is affected thereby to an Agreement relating to lights dated the 30th day of November 1926 and made between The President and Scholars of the one part and the College of the other part) upon the trusts and subject to the powers and provisions hereinafter declared and contained concerning the same.

2. In further pursuance of the said Statute made for the College and the Hall and in consideration of the premises the surviving Grantees at the request of the old Trustees as Trustees hereby convey and the old Trustees as Trustees hereby convey and confirm unto the Trustees all the property shown on the said plan drawn hereon and thereon coloured green to hold unto the Trustees in fee simple (subject as to such part thereof as is affected thereby to the covenants contained in a Conveyance dated the 24th day of November 1931 and made between the Warden and Scholars of Saint Mary College of Winchester in Oxford commonly called New College in Oxford of the one part and the surviving Grantees and the said Sir W. R. Buchanan-Riddell (deceased) of the other part and subject as to such part thereof as is affected thereby to the covenants contained in a Conveyance dated the 23rd day of November 1933 and made between The President and Scholars of the one part and the surviving Grantees and the said Sir Walter Robert Buchanan-Riddell (deceased) of the other part) Upon the trusts and subject to the powers and provisions hereinafter declared and contained concerning the same.

3. It is hereby declared that the said property coloured pink purple blue and green on the said plan drawn hereon (all which property is hereinafter referred to as "the said lands") shall be used as a place of residence for the Principal Officers Members and Staff of the Hall which shall be an independent self-governing institution for the education of undergraduate members of the University of Oxford of the male sex and for other academic purposes in connection with the Hall and shall be subject to the covenants powers and provisions hereinafter contained concerning the same.

4.—(i) The Trustees hereby covenant with the College so as to bind the said lands in the

hands of themselves and their successors in title that except with the consent of the College:—

(a) No part of the said lands shall be used otherwise than for the purposes mentioned in Clause 3 hereof;

(b) No increase shall be made in the height of any building or in the height of the walls of any building erected on the said lands. And if any such building shall be demolished no building shall be erected on the site thereof of a greater height than the building so demolished or having walls higher than the walls thereof. And no buildings shall be erected on any part of the said lands not at present built on of a greater height than the highest building now erected on the said lands or having walls higher than the walls of such highest building;

(c) No part of the said lands shall be disposed of otherwise than to the College except as provided by Clause 5 hereof and except by way of mortgage or charge for securing principal sums not exceeding at any one time the sum of £15,000 or for securing interest at a rate not exceeding 6 per cent. per annum on principal sums not exceeding £15,000;

(d) Nothing shall be done upon the said lands which shall be inconsistent with the provisions contained in Clause 5 of the recited Deed of the 1st day of August 1933 or in the recited Deed of the 8th day of November 1933.

(ii) A Trustee shall not be personally liable for any breach of the foregoing covenants committed after he shall have ceased to be a Trustee.

(iii) The College shall forthwith register the covenants contained in this Clause as a Land Charge in pursuance of the Land Charges Act 1925.

5. The Trustees shall forthwith apply for and do their best to obtain an Order vesting the said lands in the Official Trustee of Charity Lands and the Trustees for the time being of the Hall shall be the Managing Trustees of the said lands and unless and until such Order shall be obtained the said lands shall upon any appointment of a new Trustee be transferred to the Trustees for the time being of the Hall.

6. It is hereby agreed and declared that if at any time (a) the said lands or any part thereof shall be used otherwise than as aforesaid or there shall be any other breach of any of the covenants contained in Clause 4 (i) hereof or (b) the Hall shall cease to be an independent self-governing institution for the education of undergraduate members of the University of Oxford whose members are all of the male sex or (c) the average number of undergraduate members of the Hall during a period of three years shall be reduced below twenty no year being reckoned as one of the three years if during that year or the preceding year Great Britain has been engaged in War or Civil Strife or serious Epidemic has occurred in Great Britain and such reduction shall have been caused by the War Civil Strife or Epidemic or (d) without the consent of the College the College shall cease to have the right to appoint a representative Trustee of the Hall or the number of Trustees of the Hall shall exceed ten or (e) the Trustees for the time being of the

Hall shall fail or neglect to keep any building standing upon the said lands insured against loss or damage by fire to the full value thereof in an Insurance Office approved by the College in the joint names of the Trustees for the time being of the Hall and the College or to produce the Policy for such insurance or the receipt for any premium payable thereunder for fourteen days after notice requiring such insurance to be effected or kept up or such Policy or receipt to be produced shall have been given by the College to the Principal for the time being of the Hall or (f) the Trustees for the time being of the Hall shall fail or neglect to commence such work as may be necessary in order to put or keep any building standing upon the said lands in proper repair for the purposes mentioned in Clause 3 hereof within fourteen days after notice requiring the same shall have been given by the College to the Principal for the time being of the Hall and to complete such work with all due expedition or (g) any payment of rent due under the recited Deed of the 8th day of November 1933 shall be in arrear for one month after the same shall have become due or (h) any amendment shall purport to be made in the Statutes for the Hall which is inconsistent with the said Statute made for the College and the Hall or with these presents then and in any such case the said lands shall upon notice given to the Trustees for the time being of the Hall by the College revert to and become the property of the College subject to any Mortgages or Charges permitted by these presents but free from all trusts and conditions applicable to the said lands under this or any other deed or composition or under any statute or joint statute of the University or of the College or of the Hall with full power in the College to apply or dispose of the said lands for any purposes for which the College may lawfully apply or dispose of the general corporate property of the College or any part thereof and thereupon all such assurances acts and things shall be done as are necessary to perfect the title of the College to the said lands.

7. If at any time any dispute shall arise between the College and the Trustees for the time being of the Hall whether an event has happened justifying the service of a notice for reverter under the provision in that behalf herein contained such dispute shall be referred to the arbitration of some person to be nominated by the Visitor of the College and the Visitor of the Hall or failing agreement between such Visitors by the High Steward for the time being of the University of Oxford.

REGULATIONS RESPECTING A SPECIAL COMPETITION FOR APPOINTMENT AS SECOND CLASS CLERK IN HIS MAJESTY'S GENERAL REGISTER HOUSE, EDINBURGH.

1. It is proposed to make at least one appointment—for duty in the Record Office—on the result of this competition, provided a candidate is recommended by the Selection Board as suitable for appointment.

The Keeper of the Registers and Records will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to announce the competition, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

2. Applications for appointment must be made to the Keeper of the Registers and Records on the prescribed form not later than the 29th July, 1937.

3. Candidates must have attained 21 years of age and must not have attained 30 years of age on the 29th July, 1937.

Women candidates must be unmarried or widows and will normally be required to resign their appointments on marriage; but exception to the rule requiring resignation on marriage may, in individual circumstances, be made where the employment of a married woman is considered advisable in the light of her special qualifications, or special experience in relation to the duties required of her, or of the special requirements of the Department.

4. 5. Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalisation or by any other voluntary and formal act.
