

4. A Trustee shall, subject to the provisions of this Statute, hold office for a period of ten years, and shall be re-eligible. An elected Trustee shall, subject as aforesaid, hold office throughout the Stated General Meeting held in November in the tenth year after his election.

5. The Principal and Trustees may re-elect an elected Trustee one year before the date on which his term of office expires. Such re-election shall take effect as from the date of the expiry of his term of office.

6. Any casual vacancy occurring in the office of elected Trustee may, subject to the provisions of clause 3 of this Statute, be filled at any meeting of the Principal and Trustees, but so that a person so elected shall hold office only until the close of the next Stated General Meeting held in November, but shall be eligible for re-election. The Trustees may continue to act notwithstanding any vacancy in their number.

7. A Trustee may at any time resign his office by notice in writing under his hand addressed to the Principal. Thereupon the Principal shall, if such Trustee were a representative Trustee, forthwith report such resignation to the body or persons by whom such Trustee was appointed.

8. A Fellow of the Hall who is appointed or elected a Trustee shall cease to be a Trustee on the vacation of his Fellowship, but shall be re-eligible.

9. If any Trustee shall during the period of two consecutive years attend no meeting of the Principal and Trustees and discharge none of the functions of a Trustee, he shall upon the expiration of such period cease to be a Trustee and the determination of his Trusteeship shall be forthwith communicated by the Principal to him and also, if he were a representative Trustee, to the body or persons by whom he was appointed, or, if he were an elected Trustee, to the other Trustees, but he shall be eligible for reappointment or re-election at once or upon the occurrence of any subsequent vacancy.

10. The Visitor, if requested in writing by the Principal and not less than two-thirds of the Trustees, shall have power, if he thinks fit and after due inquiry, by writing under his hand to remove any Trustee from office, and a vacancy caused by any such removal of a Trustee shall be supplied as if he had resigned at the date of such removal. Any Trustee removed under this provision shall not be eligible for reappointment or re-election, unless and until it shall be resolved by the Principal and not less than two-thirds of the Trustees that he shall be so eligible.

11. The Trustees shall rank in order of seniority amongst themselves according to the date of their first appointment or election, or in case of equality of seniority then according to age.

12. Until the first appointment and election of Trustees shall have been made, the existing Trustees shall continue to act and shall have all the powers of Trustees appointed or elected under this Statute.

STATUTE V.

FELLOWS AND OFFICERS OF THE HALL.

1. The Fellows of the Hall shall consist of the Vice-Principal, the Tutors, and such other officers as the Principal and Trustees shall

from time to time determine. The number of the Fellows shall be determined by the Principal and Trustees. The same person shall be eligible to hold more than one office at one and the same time.

2. The appointment or reappointment of all Fellows of the Hall shall, subject to the provisions of these Statutes, be made by the Principal and the Fellows of the Hall. The first appointment of Fellows shall be made by the Principal as soon as conveniently may be after the approval of these Statutes by His Majesty the King in Council.

3. Every Fellow of the Hall on his appointment shall make before the Principal a declaration that he will be true and faithful to the Hall, and will observe its Statutes, Ordinances, and Regulations and promote its interests and studies.

4. The Fellows of the Hall shall be appointed for such periods not exceeding seven years as the Principal and Fellows with the consent of the Trustees may from time to time determine, at the expiration of which they shall be re-eligible, but no Fellow may hold his Fellowship after the 31st day of July next following the 65th anniversary of his birth. Any Fellow of the Hall whom the Principal and the other Fellows shall decide to reappoint shall, in so far as may be practicable, be reappointed at least one year before the expiration of his Fellowship. Such reappointment shall take effect as from the date on which the term of his Fellowship expires.

5. The Fellows of the Hall shall reside within the University during Full Term, but the Principal may in case of sickness or for any other sufficient reason dispense with the residence of a Fellow of the Hall for such period not exceeding one term as he thinks proper, which dispensation may with the consent of the Trustees be extended. The number of Fellows who shall be required to reside within the Hall during Full Term shall be determined by the Principal with the consent of the Fellows of the Hall.

6. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes, the Principal and Trustees may from time to time determine the reasonable stipends and emoluments of the Fellows of the Hall: provided that it shall be lawful for the Visitor upon the petition of any Fellow of the Hall whose stipend or emolument may have been diminished in exercise of the foregoing power to disallow such diminution, if he shall think fit.

7. Every Fellow of the Hall not being married at the time of his appointment shall vacate his office if he marries within seven years from the day of his first appointment but shall be eligible for reappointment by the Principal and Fellows of the Hall.

8. Every Fellow or other Officer of the Hall shall be subject to and entitled to the benefits of the Superannuation Scheme of the Hall, when and so soon as such Scheme shall be established under the provisions of Statute VI, but, as to any Fellow or other Officer holding office at the date of such establishment, subject to the provisions of Statute VI, Clause 4.

9. The Vice-Principal shall take rank next in precedence to the Principal: other Fellows of the Hall shall take seniority according to the date of their appointment, provided that the Principal shall have power to grant to a Fellow
