

and those to an exhibitor shall not exceed £60 a year. The Principal with the consent of the Trustees may, however, at any time direct that scholars and exhibitors shall be entitled to receive a sum not exceeding £30 a year without application or inquiry into means.

4. If the Principal shall be in doubt in regard to any matter affecting the assignment of emoluments to scholars and exhibitors he shall consult the Central Scholarship Committee appointed by the University.

5. The Principal shall review annually the financial position and needs of each scholar and exhibitor in receipt of emoluments and may, after each such review, either diminish or increase to any sum not exceeding the total value permitted under clause 3 of this Statute, the emoluments assigned to him as a scholar or exhibitor, provided that no reduction shall be made in consideration of any University Scholarship or Prize won by him or any other University emolument gained in open competition, except those specified in the Schedule attached to this Statute and any other scholarships added to this Schedule by Statute or Decree of the University.

6. Every scholar and exhibitor may, subject to the provisions of Statute II, Clause 4, be deprived by the Principal of, or suspended from, his scholarship or exhibition or any part of the emoluments thereof for neglect of his studies or other misconduct if the Principal after consultation with the Fellows shall so decide.

7. Every scholar or exhibitor who shall marry or be admitted to a Fellowship in the Hall or to a Fellowship or scholarship or exhibition in any College, or shall accept any office or appointment or undertake any duties which the Principal shall with the consent of the Fellows declare to be inconsistent with the tenure of a scholarship or exhibition, shall thereby vacate his scholarship or exhibition.

8. A scholar or exhibitor elected after an examination in a particular subject may pursue any other recognized subject of academic study, provided that he shall have satisfied the Principal that he is qualified to do so with profit.

9. Commoners shall be chosen and admitted by the Principal.

10. Members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* shall be subject to such regulations as to residence, instruction, discipline and attendance at Divine Worship (subject to the provisions of the Universities Tests Act, 1871) as the Principal with the consent of the Fellows shall from time to time make.

11. The Principal shall provide courses of instruction for members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* during at least twenty-four weeks in the academical year.

12. All regulations with regard to the expenditure within the Hall of members of the Hall *in statu pupillari* shall be made by the Principal and Fellows.

13. Any member of the Hall *in statu pupillari* may, subject as regards scholars and exhibitors to the provisions of Statute II, Clause 4, be removed from the Hall by the Principal for such causes as the Principal with the consent of the Fellows may judge to be deserving.

STATUTE VIII.

DIVINE SERVICE.

The Principal shall make regulations for the daily performance of Divine Service within the Hall according to the Liturgy of the Church of England or some abridgement thereof during Full Term, and at such other times as he shall think proper, and may vary such regulations from time to time.

STATUTE IX.

PROPERTY.

1. The site and buildings of the Hall shall, subject to the provisions of these Statutes and of the Joint Statute and of the Deed scheduled thereto, be occupied for the use and benefit of the Hall as a place of education, religion, and learning.

2. All other real and personal property held at the time of the passing of these Statutes by the existing Trustees of the Hall in trust for the Hall or for the members or any member of it as such or belonging to the members of the Hall in common, shall as soon as may be after the passing of these Statutes be transferred by the said Trustees to and be vested in the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University upon the same trusts as are applicable to such property at the time of the passing of these Statutes, and the same shall be held by the Chancellor, Masters, and Scholars of the University as custodian trustees according to the said trusts and the income thereof shall be paid to the Trustees of the Hall who shall be the managing trustees thereof. All real and personal property that shall hereafter be given, devised, or bequeathed or otherwise acquired for the use and benefit of the Hall or of the members or of any member of it as such, shall, save in any case where a donor or testator shall have otherwise directed, likewise be vested in the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University as custodian trustees and the management thereof shall be vested in the Trustees, according to the trusts affecting the same.

3. Subject to the provisions of these Statutes and of the Joint Statute and of the Deed scheduled thereto, the Principal and Trustees shall have the entire management, direction, superintendence, and control of and over the affairs, concerns, and property of the Hall as well as in receiving, issuing, investing, laying out, and disposing of all stock, effects, funds, moneys, and securities, as also in contracting for and purchasing messuages, lands, tenements and hereditaments, and goods and chattels for the use of the Hall and in selling, demising, aliening, mortgaging, exchanging, and otherwise disposing of or dealing with any property whatever real or personal belonging thereto, and of all gifts, bequests, scholarships, exhibitions, and endowments which they may deem desirable for the purposes of the said Hall and in all other matters relating to the said Hall.

No portion of the income and property of the Hall, whencesoever derived, shall be paid or transferred directly or indirectly by way of dividend, or bonus, or otherwise howsoever by
