

General Meeting or at a meeting specially summoned under the provisions of Statute X, Clause 3, but shall not require the consent of the Principal, and, in the event of the Principal withholding his consent and being unwilling to forward such request, the same shall be forwarded to the Hebdomadal Council by such one of the Trustees as the Trustees shall appoint for the purpose. The Hebdomadal Council shall not propose to the University any alteration or amendment of these Statutes except with the consent of the Trustees.

4. If at any time the Statute concerning College contributions for University purposes made for the University under the powers of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, shall be amended or any other University Statute to the like effect shall be made so as to render the Hall liable to make contributions out of its revenue for University purposes, the application of the revenues of the Hall shall be subject to the payment of the charges imposed thereby.

5. For the purposes of the University the Hall shall not be deemed to be a Department nor the Trustees Delegates of the University.

STATUTE XIII.

REPEAL OR AMENDMENT OF STATUTES.

1. The Statute made for the Queen's College and for St. Edmund Hall in 1925 and approved by His Majesty the King in Council in 1926 is hereby repealed, without prejudice nevertheless to any right acquired, liability incurred, or act done thereunder, or any repeal affected thereby.

2. These Statutes shall be subject to alteration in the manner provided by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and by clause 3 of Statute XII, but no alteration which is inconsistent with the joint Statute or with the Deed scheduled thereto shall be made without the consent of the Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College.

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON TUESDAY, 4 MAY 1937.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal Statt. Tit. III. Sect. IV "Of St. Edmund Hall" in accordance with agreements made between the University, the Queen's College, and the Principal of St. Edmund Hall respectively to which effect will be given by the Statute passed by Congregation on 4 May 1937 and by the following Statute to be made by the University: Now the said University, in the exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows.

1. The Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College and the present Trustees of St. Edmund Hall and the Trustees for the time being of St. Edmund Hall shall as soon as practicable after Trustees for the Hall shall have been duly appointed under the Statutes for the Hall made concurrently with this Statute enter into a Deed in the form set out in the Schedule hereto with such variations (if any) as may be required in consequence of the deaths of parties or other events.

2. The provisions of such Deed when executed shall bind the lands therein referred to and the Trustees for the time being of St. Edmund Hall.

3. The provisions of such Deed may from time to time be varied by a Deed executed by the Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College and by the Trustees for the time being of St. Edmund Hall provided that no such variation shall be inconsistent with this Statute or with the Statutes for the Hall for the time being in force.

4. The Provost and Scholars of the Queen's College shall out of the corporate revenue of that College pay to the Principal for the time being of St. Edmund Hall in the Michaelmas Term of every year for the period of fifteen years after the date on which His Majesty the King in Council has by Order approved this Statute the sum of £300 in continuance of their former grants and such sums shall be applied by the Principal in accordance with the provisions of the Statutes affecting St. Edmund Hall in providing Exhibitions tenable by members of the Hall who shall be deserving and in need of assistance to support them at the University.

5. This Statute shall not come into operation until the Statutes for St. Edmund Hall made concurrently with this Statute have been approved by His Majesty the King in Council.

1937 of the fourth part Whereas by Clause 16 of the old Statute it was provided that the site and buildings of the Hall should subject to the old Statute continue to be vested in the College in the same manner
