NEWPORT (MONMOUTHSHIRE) GAS.

(Application for Special Order under Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Newport (Monmouthshire) Gas Company (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is Mill Street, Newport, in the County of Monmouth, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934, for all or some of the following purposes (that is to say):—

1. To empower the Company to purchase and take by agreement from the Coke Ovens of the Ocean Coal Company Limited at Nine Mile Point in the urban district of Risca a supply of gas in bulk and for such purpose to lay mains and break up streets within and without the limits of supply.

2. To fix a basic price for the gas to be supplied by the Company and to make provision for the revision of such basic price.

3. To prescribe a basic rate of dividend on the consolidated ordinary stock of the Company, to empower the Company in certain circumstances to apply their profits in payment of dividends in excess of the basic rate or in appropriation to a reserve fund, and for the benefit of all or some of the employees of the Company, and to make provision for determining from time to time the amount (if any) of the profits to be applied as aforesaid.

4. To make provision in regard to the formation by the Company of a reserve fund, a special purposes fund and a renewal fund.

5. To make provision in regard to the reading of meter indices.

6. To make provision as to the limitation of dividend on preference capital of the Company, as to the payment of half-yearly dividends by the directors without the sanction or direction of a general meeting and as to the costs and expenses of the intended Order.

7. To confer upon the Company all or any powers commonly conferred on gas undertakers and not hereinbefore referred to, and to enact all such provisions as may be deemed expedient for effecting the purposes of the intended Order.

8. To repeal, alter or amend all or any of the provisions of the Newport (Monmouthshire) Gas Acts and Orders, 1855 to 1937, and in particular to repeal Section 36 of the Newport (Monmouthshire) Gas Act, 1855, which makes special provision as to the number of votes to which each holder of stock or shares in the Company is entitled, and to incorporate with the intended Order (with or without modifications) all or some of the provisions of the Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845, and the Gasworks Clauses Acts, 1847 and 1871.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the Draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 28th day of July, 1937.
