DISEASES OF ANIMALS ACTS, 1894 TO 1935.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of Section 49 (3) of the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries has made the following Orders:—

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (INFECTED  
AREAS) ORDER OF 1937 (No. 13).

SUBJECT.

Releases the Surrey Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area from restrictions and revokes Orders Nos. 5492 and 5497, as from the 1st July, 1937.

*Order No. 5500.*

SUBJECT.

Applies Part III (*Double Dipping of Sheep in a Double Dipping Area*) of the Sheep Scab Order of 1928 to an area in North Cardiganshire, as described in the First Schedule, and prescribes the periods 15th July to 7th September and 1st October to 15th November, 1937, as the periods during each of which all sheep in the Double Dipping Area are to be double dipped.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

An Area comprising:—

So much of the county of Cardigan as lies within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at a point on the River Dovey near Dovey Junction Station where the Cardigan and Montgomery County boundaries meet, following the coast line in a south-westerly and southerly direction as far as the mouth of the River Rheidol; thence in an easterly direction along the River Rheidol to Devil's Bridge; thence in a southerly direction along the road from Devil's Bridge via Rhos Fawr to Pontrhydygroes; thence south and east along the western and southern boundaries of the parish of Ysppyty Ystwyth to the point where the parish boundary meets the Cardigan-Radnor county boundary; thence in a generally northerly direction along the Cardigan-Radnor and the Cardigan-Montgomery county boundaries to the point of commencement.

URBAN DISTRICT OF EAST BARNET.

UXBRIDGE MAIDENHEAD WYCOMBE  
AND DISTRICT GAS COMPANY.

Variation of Declared Calorific Value in Part  
of Limits of Supply.

NOTICE is hereby given pursuant to Section 9 of the Uxbridge, Wycombe and District Gas (Charges) Order, 1921, that as from the 30th September, 1937, the calorific value of the gas which the Uxbridge Maidenhead Wycombe and District Gas Company intend to supply within the Eton Area as defined in Section 4 of the Uxbridge Gas Act 1916 (except so much of the Parish of Dorney as prior to the coming into operation of the Bucks Review Order 1934 consisted of the Parish of Boveney) is 500 British Thermal Units gross per cubic foot in lieu of the calorific value of 470 British Thermal Units now supplied in the said Eton area.

MARTOCK AND DISTRICT GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade forthwith by the Martock and District Gas Consumers Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is the Gas Works, Martock, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts 1920 to 1934, for all or some of the following (amongst other) purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Company to supply gas within the following areas in the County of Somerset (in this Notice referred to as "the limits of supply") viz.:—

The parishes of Ash, Chilthorne Domer, Chiselborough, Ilchester, Long Load, Martock, Montacute, Norton sub Hamdon, Odcombe, Sock Dennis, South Petherton, Stoke sub Hamdon and Tintinhull in the rural district of Yeovil.

2. To prescribe the date or dates upon which the several provisions of the intended Order shall come into operation.

3. To authorise the Company to continue, maintain and use any existing gas mains, pipes and works belonging to them within the limits of supply and to apply to such mains, pipes and works the provisions of the intended Order and of the Acts incorporated therewith.
