

the Company, for the issue to the trustees under any such scheme and the employees of shares of the Company and for the disposal of shares and deposits on the death of any employee.

22. To authorise the directors of the Company to grant superannuation and other allowances, gratuities and pensions and to make other payments to the employees of the Company and the widows, families and dependants of such persons, to enter into and carry into effect agreements with insurance companies and others for securing such allowances, gratuities, pensions and other payments and to apply the revenues of the undertaking for those purposes.

23. To empower the directors of the Company to subscribe to hospitals and other charitable objects and to the benevolent and sick funds of the employees of the Company and to apply the revenues of the undertaking for those purposes.

24. To authorise the Company to establish superannuation schemes, to make payments to any superannuation fund formed for the benefit of their employees and to apply the revenues of the undertaking for those purposes.

25. To make provisions as to the authentication and service of notices by the Company, the recovery of sums due or payable to the Company in respect of the sale or hire of apparatus and fittings for or in connection with the consumption or use of gas or the provision of materials and work in connection therewith or the fixing, setting up, repairing, altering, maintaining or removal thereof, the recovery of demands and penalties and the inclusion of several sums in one summons.

26. To confer upon the Company all other powers commonly conferred upon gas undertakers.

27. The Order will vary or extinguish all rights and privileges which would impede or interfere with its purposes and confer other rights and privileges.

28. To incorporate with the Order with or without modification or to render inapplicable to the Company all or some of the provisions of the Lands Clauses Acts, the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847, and the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871.

Any local or other public authority, company or person desiring to bring before the Board of Trade any objection to the draft Order may do so by registered letter addressed to the Director of Gas Administration, Board of Trade, Great George Street, London, S.W.1, and despatched on or before the 30th day of July, 1937.

Any such objection shall state:—

- (a) the specific grounds of objection; and
- (b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

A copy of the objection must at the same time be forwarded to the undermentioned Parliamentary Agents.

A copy of the draft Special Order and an Ordnance Map showing the proposed area of supply and the situation of the existing works and an Ordnance Map showing the lands referred to in paragraph 8 of this Notice have been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Somerset

at his Office at Taunton and at the offices of the Company at the Gas Works, Martock aforesaid.

WHITSTABLE GAS.

(Application for Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934.)

NOTICE is hereby given that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Whitstable Gas and Coke Company Limited (hereinafter called "the Company") whose address is 22, High Street, Whitstable, for a Special Order under the Gas Undertakings Acts, 1920 to 1934, for all or some of the following (amongst other) purposes (that is to say):—

To authorise the Company to supply gas within the following areas (hereinafter referred to as "the limits of supply") in the county of Kent (that is to say):—

So much of the urban district of Whitstable as is not comprised within the limits within which the East Kent Gas Company Limited are under or by virtue of the East Kent Gas Order, 1923, authorised to supply gas.

To define and limit the capital and borrowing powers of the Company for the purposes of the undertaking to be authorised by the intended Order (hereinafter referred to as "the gas undertaking").

To make provisions as to the sale of shares of the Company by auction or tender.

To empower the directors of the Company to reserve a proportion of any future issue of shares for exclusive offer to employees of the Company and to consumers of gas supplied by the Company and to make provisions as to the conditions of issue.

To empower the Company with the consent of the Board of Trade to offer shares for subscription by employees of the Company and to consumers of gas supplied by the Company without first offering the same for sale by public auction or tender.

To make provisions as to the profits of the Company in respect of the gas undertaking which may be divided among the shareholders of the Company and the rate of interest to be paid by the Company on moneys borrowed in respect of the gas undertaking.

To make provision as to the calorific value or values of the gas to be supplied by the Company and the alteration from time to time of such calorific value or values and to make provision as to the pressure of the gas to be supplied by the Company.
