to be such Vicar or Incumbent, all the fees or dues which may be received in respect of such publication, solemnization or performance at the said Church of Saint James, situate at Clifton as afcresaid, shall be paid over by the Minister thereof to the said Harold Dunbar Morgan.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint James, Clifton, being:—

"All that part of the Parish of Rotherham, in the County and York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which is bounded upon the southeast by the Parish of Whiston, upon the east by the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Dalton, upon the north-west by the New Parish of Saint Stephen, Eastwood, all in the said County and Diocese and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Stephen, Eastwood, from the said Parish of Rotherham, at the junction of Doncaster Road with Clifton Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Clifton Lane for a distance of 32 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Badsley Moor Lane, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Badsley Moor Lane for a distance of 5 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Broom Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Broom Road for a distance of 221 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said Parish of Rotherham from the said Parish of Whiston.'

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Sheffield.
