

Re HEYWOOD, NICHOLLS, WALFORD and CHILTON.

PURSUANT to an Order of the Chancery Division of the High Court of Justice dated 23rd March 1936 and made in an action in the Matter of the estate of Charlotte Alice Heywood deceased (late of 64 New Street Wellington in the county of Salop) Grainger v. Tomlinson (1936 H. 757) whereby the following inquiry was directed, viz.: An inquiry who upon the death of the said Charlotte Alice Heywood (who died intestate on the 26th July 1935) became beneficially entitled to her property and for what estates and interests and in what shares and proportions and whether any such persons are since dead and if they died entitled to any vested share or interest who are their personal representatives.
