STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL WARES TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made by the Minister of Labour under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, and dated 21st April, 1927, the Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain) hereby give notice that they propose to vary the minimum rates of wages at present set out in their Notice Q (38) dated 21st January, 1932.

Particulars of the proposed variations may be obtained on application to the Secretary of the Trade Board at the address given below.

In accordance with Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board will consider any objections to the above-mentioned proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 16th July, 1937. Any such objection should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her address) and should be sent to the Secretary, Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares Trade Board (Great Britain), Metropole Buildings, Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C.2. It is desirable that objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.
