NATIONAL HEALTH INSURANCE ACT, 1936.

Commencing at the Chirnside-Foulden parish boundary on the Foulden-Chirnside road, thence following the road via Edington to the point where it meets the road from Sunwick to Easter Crowbutt, thence along that road to Easter Crowbutt, thence following the road via Harelaw and Auchencrow to the London and North Eastern Railway line near Houndwood House and thence in a north-westerly direction along the said railway to the Coldingham-Cockburnpath parish boundary.
