The following Statute made by the University of Oxford on the 24th day of June, 1937, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923."

UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONGREGATION ON
THURSDAY, 24 JUNE, 1937.

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend the Statute concerning Elections to Professorships: Now the University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1923, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts, subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council, as follows:—

1. In Statt. Tit. IV. Sect. 1. § 2 (a) (Statuta, 1936, p. 49) delete clause 1 (II. 24-6) and substitute the following new clause:

"1. When a Professorship within the University becomes vacant or is about to become vacant the Registrar shall give notice to the Hebdomadal Council as soon as convenient provided that notification shall not be given later than the first meeting of Council after a vacancy has occurred."

"2. The Hebdomadal Council shall then resolve either that the necessary steps be taken for an election to the vacant office to be made or that they be suspended for a time to be fixed by the resolution; and this suspension may be renewed from time to time, provided always that the whole period of suspension shall not exceed one year from the date on which the vacancy occurred,

unless within that time a new Statute relating to the vacant office shall have been submitted to Congregation, in which case the suspension shall be continued until the proposed new Statute has either come into operation or been rejected by Congregation or disallowed by the King in Council."

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

THE LOYAL AND DUTIFUL ADDRESS OF THE
COUNCIL OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE COUNTY OF
LONDON.

May it please Your Majesty,

We, the Chairman, Aldermen and Councillors of the London County Council, representing the people of Your Majesty's Capital, desire to express most grateful appreciation of the honour conferred upon the Council and London by Your Majesty's presence to open these new Headquarters of the London Fire Brigade.

Since the formation over a century ago of London's first corporate fire brigade upon the initiative of the insurance companies, fire fighting in London has undergone constant development. New means have to be devised to meet the ever-growing demands and risks of changing conditions, and to-day the London Fire Brigade, with its splendid traditions of efficiency and devotion to duty, is a great protective organisation of which we are justly proud and which can fairly claim to rank amongst the best in the world.

The increasing activities of the Brigade and its necessary reorganisation rendered obsolete and inadequate the headquarters occupied for sixty years in Southwark Bridge Road; and the Council has, therefore, erected these new headquarters, which are fitted with the best equipment science can at present provide for the assistance of the Brigade in its beneficent work for London. The buildings were designed and planned by the Architect to the Council, Mr. E. P. Wheeler, F.R.I.B.A., assisted by Mr. G. Weald, F.R.I.B.A., upon a general scheme of requirements prepared by the Chief Officer of the Brigade, Major C. C. B. Morris, M.C., with the assistance of the Deputy Chief Officer, Commander A. N. G. Firebrace, R.N. (retired).

We beg to express to Your Majesty our deep gratification at Your active interest in the welfare of the Brigade and of the dependants of those who lay down their lives on duty.

We desire to tender to Her Majesty The Queen most sincere thanks for Her gracious presence at this important London ceremony.

We pray that Your Majesty may long be spared to reign, and that the blessing of good health may be enjoyed by Your Majesty, by Her Majesty The Queen and by all the members of the Royal family.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Tuesday, the 3rd August, 1937, to Saturday, the 7th August, 1937, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
