The KING has been pleased to issue a Warrant under His Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:—

**GEORGE, R.I.**

GEORGE THE SIXTH, by the Grace of God, of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting!

Whereas Our Royal Predecessor, King Edward the Seventh, did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 8th day of February, 1910, declare and ordain that an official Roll of Baronets should be prepared and kept in the Office of the Principal Secretary of State for the Home Department:

And whereas His late Majesty King George the Fifth did by the Fifth Clause of a Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual bearing date the 10th day of March, 1922, declare and ordain that every person thereafter created a Baronet should pay to Our said Secretary of State or to some person deputed by him a Fee of Fifteen Pounds; and that such Fee should be paid into Our Exchequer in manner to be directed by the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury:

Now know Ye that We do hereby direct and command that henceforward such Fee of Fifteen Pounds shall be no longer payable demanded or taken on the occasion of such creations.

Given at Our Court at St. James's the fifth day of June, 1937, in the First Year of Our Reign.

The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Engineer Captain Frederick Kelly, R.N. (retired), His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the White Cravate with Red and Blue Border of the Order of the Brilliant Jade, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by the President of the National Government of the Republic of China, in recognition of valuable services rendered by him as Instructor in Engineering at the Chinese College, Mamoi.

The KING has been pleased to give and grant unto Alfred Coaster, Esq., M.B.E., His Majesty's Royal licence and authority to wear the Insignia of the Third Class (Civil Division) of the Order of Al Rafidain, which Decoration has been conferred upon him by His Majesty the King of Iraq, in recognition of his services during the disturbances on the Middle Euphrates in 1935.
