PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in pursuance of the powers conferred upon Him by the Air Navigation Act, 1920, His Majesty in Council was pleased to make the Air Navigation (Consolidation) Order, 1923 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"):

And whereas the Air Navigation Act, 1920, has been amended by the Air Navigation Act, 1936:

And whereas the principal Order has from time to time been amended by subsequent Orders:

And whereas it is expedient that the principal Order should be further amended in manner hereinafter appearing:

And whereas the provisions of the Rules Publication Act 1893 (56 & 57 Vict. c. 66), have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. In Article 3 of the principal Order the following proviso shall be substituted for proviso (c) at the end of paragraph (1):—

"(c) Condition (ii) shall, in the case of aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and flying within Great Britain and Northern Ireland, only apply to

public transport aircraft, which for the purpose of this proviso shall be deemed to include an aircraft belonging to an aeroplane club and carrying a member of the club, whether for the purpose of instruction or otherwise."

2. In Article 4 of the principal Order the following proviso shall be substituted for proviso (d) at the end of paragraph (1):—

"(d) Condition (v) shall, in the case of aircraft registered in Great Britain and Northern Ireland and flying within Great Britain and Northern Ireland, only apply to public transport aircraft, which for the purpose of this proviso shall be deemed to include an aircraft belonging to an aeroplane club and carrying a member of the club, whether for the purpose of instruction or otherwise."

3. In Article 4 of the principal Order the following paragraph shall be inserted after paragraph (2):—

"(3) An experimental aircraft shall not, except with the special permission in writing of the Secretary of State, and subject to any conditions that may be attached to such permission, fly over any populous area, over any concourse of people, or over any aerodrome where at the time conditions are such as to make the flying of such an aircraft dangerous.

For the purpose of this paragraph 'experimental aircraft' means any aircraft not conforming to a type for which a certifi-

cate of airworthiness has been issued under this Order, or conforming to such a type with modifications which affect the safety of the aircraft."

4.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Air Navigation (Amendment) (No. 4) Order, 1937.

(2) This Order shall come into operation upon the day appointed by the Secretary of State under section 22 of the Air Navigation Act, 1936, for the commencement of Part III of that Act.

EX-PARTE THE MASTER FELLOWS AND SCHOLARS OF PEMBROKE COLLEGE IN THE UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

A Statute made on the nineteenth day of July one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven to amend a Statute framed by the Commissioners appointed under The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923 (13 and 14 Geo. 5 ch. 33) in relation to Pembroke College in the University of Oxford duly passed at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose under Section 7 (2) of the said Act by the votes of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting and approved by Congregation of the University on the seventeenth day of July one thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven in accordance with Section 7 (2) of the said Act and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas Statute II of the Statutes of the said College consisting of twelve Clauses deals (inter alia) with the qualifications and stipend of the Master of the said College.

And whereas it appears to us The Master and Fellows of the said College that it is desirable that Statute II of the said Statutes shall be altered and amended in manner hereinafter appearing.

Now We The Master and Fellows of the said College in exercise of the powers vested in us under and by virtue of the Section 7 of the said Act do by this present instrument under the Seal of the said College alter and amend Clauses 2 and 8 of Statute II of the said Statutes as follows:—

By deleting from Clause 2 the words "and capable in law of holding the Canonry in the Cathedral Church of Gloucester annexed by Act of Parliament to the said Mastership."

By adding to Clause 8 as an additional paragraph the words "If and when the Canonry in the Cathedral Church of Gloucester is disannexed from the Mastership there shall in addition to the stipend payable to the Master by the College be a further annual payment of six hundred pounds to the Master paid from the trust fund created for this purpose, by way of compensation for the surrender of the revenues of the said Canonry hitherto received by the Master."

SAFEGUARDING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921.

AMENDMENT OF LISTS OF ARTICLES CHARGEABLE WITH DUTY UNDER PART I

AND

ADDITIONAL LIST OF ARTICLES CHARGEABLE WITH SUCH DUTY.

(Safeguarding of Key Industries.)

1. Section 1 (5) of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, provides that for the purpose of preventing disputes arising as to whether any goods are or are not chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act, the Board of Trade

may from time to time issue lists defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to the Act, and where any list is so issued defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under such general description, the said Schedule shall have effect as if the articles comprised in the list were therein substituted for that general description.

2. Section 5 (3) of the Finance Act, 1936, provides amongst other things that the power of the Board of Trade under Sub-section 5 of Section 1 of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, to issue lists defining articles which are to be taken as falling under any of the general descriptions set out in the Schedule to that Act shall include power to amend any list so issued.

3. The Board of Trade hereby amend List H issued in 1921 and List H (ii) issued in 1926, by deleting certain trade names, by inserting certain chemical names to replace such deleted trade names as had no equivalent in these Lists, by deleting in List H certain chemical names, and the indication of the chemicals which fall within the scope of the Dyestuffs (Import Regulation) Act, 1920 and by subdividing certain of the general chemical headings in List H (ii). Such amendments are more particularly set forth in the First Schedule hereto and shall take effect from the 19th day of August, 1937.

4. The Board of Trade have prepared the additional List which is set forth in the Second Schedule hereto, and which is to be regarded as further defining the articles which are to be taken as falling under the following general description in the Schedule to the Act, viz.:—

Synthetic organic chemicals (other than synthetic organic dyestuffs, colours and colouring matters imported for use as such, and organic intermediate products imported for their manufacture) analytical reagents, all other fine chemicals (except sulphate of quinine of vegetable origin) and chemicals manufactured by fermentation processes.

5. Articles included in the said additional List will, subject to the provisions of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, be chargeable with duty under Part I of the Act as amended, on and after the 19th August, 1937.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF TECHNICAL CLERK IN HIS MAJESTY'S STATIONERY OFFICE.

Competitions under these regulations are open both to men and women. Competitions do not take place at fixed intervals, but are held only on the occurrence of vacancies. The regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.

1. Candidates must have attained the age of 21 and must not have attained the age of 30 on a date to be fixed in respect of the competition in which they are to take part.

In reckoning age for competition the following allowances will be made, viz.:—

(a) Candidates who have served or are serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force may deduct from their actual age any time during which they have so served.

(b) Candidates who have served in any established civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding two years which they may have spent in such service.

2. Every candidate must be a natural-born British subject, the child of a person who is or was at the time of death a British subject; provided that exception may be made in the case of natural-born British subjects who have satisfactorily completed a period of not less than five years' service on full pay in His Majesty's Regular Forces.

Provided also that if the Civil Service Commissioners are satisfied, in the case of any candidate who is a British subject but does not fulfil all the requirements of the rule as to nationality and descent, that the candidate is so closely connected by ancestry and upbringing with His Majesty's dominions that an exception may properly be made to that rule, they may accept such candidate as eligible provided that this discretion shall not be exercisable unless (a) the father or the paternal grandfather of the candidate was a natural-born British subject, and (b) neither the father nor the paternal grandfather had acquired any other nationality by naturalization or by any other voluntary and formal act.

3. No person actually serving in the Army, Navy or Air Force will be eligible for admission to the examination unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition, and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued.

Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons upon whose training for the occupation of teacher public money has been spent cannot be appointed until the consent of the appropriate education authority has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

4. There are three branches, Printing, Binding and Lithography. When a competition is announced, the Controller of His Majesty's Stationery Office will decide and announce what number of vacancies (if any) is to be filled in each branch.

The Controller will take such steps as he thinks most appropriate to make known the existence of any vacancy or vacancies which he desires to fill on any one occasion, and the Civil Service Commissioners will satisfy themselves that the steps taken have been such as to secure all desirable publicity.

5. Application shall be made on the appropriate form which may be obtained from the Controller of His Majesty's Stationery Office. Candidates will be required to show that they have served an apprenticeship of at least five years to the Letterpress, Lithography or Book-binding Trade by submission of indenture or of a certificate of service that for the same period they have had practical training in the production of Printing or Binding; and they must have been recently and for a sufficient time in actual

and continuous employment. A candidate's indenture or certificate of service must accord with the branch for which he (or she) is competing. Full time practical training up to a limit of two years in a recognised Technical School will be accepted as part of the qualifying period. The indenture or certificate of service together with any proof of technical training by way of diplomas or certificates from any recognised Technical School, or proof of tuition under a qualified instructor, must be sent in with the application form addressed to The Controller, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Princes Street, Westminster, London, S.W.1.

6. After the last day for application has been reached the Controller of His Majesty's Stationery Office will scrutinise all the applications received and recommend to the Commissioners such candidates as appear to him suitable for the duties of the posts in question.
