LIVESTOCK INDUSTRY ACT, 1937.

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, the Secretary of State for Scotland and the Secretary of State for the Home Department, acting jointly in pursuance of powers conferred upon them by Part II of the Livestock Industry Act, 1937, have made the following Orders and Regulations, which have effect as from the 1st August, 1937:

Under Section 4 of the Act, after consulting the Livestock Commission and with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Cattle Subsidy (Payments) Order, 1937—S.R. & O. 1937 (No. 658);

Under Section 5 of the Act, the Cattle Subsidy Scheme (Approval) Order, 1937—S.R. & O. 1937 (No. 659);

Under Section 6 of the Act, after consulting the Livestock Commission, the Cattle Subsidy Regulations, 1937—S.R. & O. 1937 (No. 660);

Under Section 7 of the Act, the Cattle Subsidy (Marking of Imported Cattle) Order, 1937—S.R. & O. 1937 (No. 661).

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS 1882 TO 1936.

CHATHAM ROCHESTER AND DISTRICT ELECTRICITY (AMENDMENT) SPECIAL ORDER, 1937.

Notice is hereby given that the Electricity Commissioners have submitted to the Minister

of Transport for confirmation under the above-mentioned Acts a Special Order made by them on the application of the Kent Electric Power Company to suspend the powers of the Corporations of Chatham and Rochester under Section 2 of the Electric Lighting Act 1888 to purchase the undertaking of the Company authorised by the Chatham Rochester and District Electric Lighting Order 1890 as amended until the 14th August 1937 subject however to a special provision enabling the said Corporations to purchase the Undertaking upon the terms therein mentioned upon giving notice for that purpose within six months after the 14th August, 1937.

The Minister of Transport proposes to confirm the Order and gives notice that any person affected who may be desirous of objecting to the confirmation of the same must in accordance with the Electricity (Confirmation of Special Orders) Rules, 1931, do so by memorial addressed to the Minister of Transport written on one side only of foolscap paper and sent by registered post, addressed to the Secretary, Ministry of Transport, Metropole Buildings, Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C.2, and posted not later than the 28th August, 1937. A copy of any such memorial must also be sent in like manner to the Solicitor, Kent Electric Power Company, County House, 46-47, New Broad Street, London, E.C.2. Such memorial must be sealed or signed by the person objecting or by some responsible and duly authorised person on his behalf and must state the specific grounds of objection to the Order and the modifications desired.

A copy of the Order as submitted for confirmation has been deposited for public inspection at the office of (i) the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Kent at Maidstone (ii) the Town Clerk, Chatham Corporation at Chatham, and (iii) the Town Clerk, Rochester Corporation at Rochester.
